Hurunui District Council moves to require My Vaccine Pass

You will now need to be vaccinated to access many of Hurunui District Council's facilities, following Sunday's announcement that community transmission of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 is occurring in multiple areas in New Zealand.

A My Vaccine Pass will be a requirement of all members of the public and staff to enter all Council service centres and libraries, including the main Council building on Carters Rd in Amberley.

Council's Chief Executive Officer Hamish Dobbie said this is to ensure the health and safety of staff, and slow the transmission of the Omicron variant of COVID-19. "It's about everyone's protection, we need to keep our staff healthy so they can help keep the community healthy." To keep within the government's guidelines of Red setting, Council's essential workforce will be splitting into self-contained teams, whereby there will be no cross over use of vehicles, papers or tools, and no physical interaction.

"Our teams will see changes within their own operations, but as far as the people of Hurunui are concerned, things will carry on as normal."

Dobbie acknowledged that the traffic light system is somewhat a moving beast, and Council is doing its upmost to continue a quality delivery of services, while keeping everyone's safety at the forefront.

CHOCOLATE CHERRY MOUSSE

This is a not-very-sweet, very grown up chocolate mousse, and it is quite easy to make.

INGREDIENTS

- 120 grams bittersweet chocolate, chopped into small pieces
- 2 tablespoons cherry brandy or kirsch
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 tablespoon light corn syrup (use honey as a substitute)
- 2 or 3 tablespoons sugar, as needed
- 2 large eggs

PREPARATION

In a heavy-based saucepan, combine chocolate, cherry brandy or kirsch, butter and corn syrup. Add 2 tablespoons sugar if using cherry brandy, 3 tablespoons sugar if using kirsch. Melt over very low heat, then scrape into a bowl and allow to cool a little.

Separate eggs, and whisk whites until soft peaks form. Beat yolks into cooled chocolate mixture, then gently mix in a dollop of egg whites to lighten mixture. Carefully fold remaining whites into chocolate mixture, taking care to keep mousse airy.

Spoon mousse into two wine glasses. Cover with plastic wrap, and refrigerate for at least 2 hours and up to 6 hours before serving. Use heaps of fresh cherries as Garnish

Chocolate and Cherries

CHOCOLATE SILK PIE

INGREDIENTS

FOR THE CRUST

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups ground chocolate wafers (from about 30 cookies)

⅓ cup sugar

7 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted FOR THE FILLING

3/4 cup unsalted butter, at room temperature

1 1/4 cups sugar

1/4 teaspoon sea salt

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 teaspoon brandy (optional)

4 ounces unsweetened chocolate, melted

3 eggs

PREPARATION

Make the crust: Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

Combine the chocolate crumbs and sugar in a bowl. Add the butter and stir until well mixed. Reserve 1/2 cup of the mixture, then press the rest into a 9-inch pie plate, pressing it evenly over the bottom and up the sides of the plate. Bake for 8 minutes. Set aside to cool.

Make the filling: Using an electric mixer, cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Mix in the salt, vanilla and brandy, if using. Add the chocolate and mix well. Add the eggs, 1 at a time, mixing well after each addition.

Scrape the filling into the pie shell and sprinkle the reserved crumb mixture over the top. Refrigerate for 2 hours to set. Cut into wedges and serve.


Garnish with fresh cherries

HANMER SPRINGS COMMUNITY BOARD UPDATE

The Community Board seeks to wisely steer policies and actions in our village, reflecting the voices of our community as best we can.

The Board works to a 10 year (Long Term Plan- currently 2021-2031) which is updated every year with the annual plan. Last year was Year 1 of the current LTP, which runs from July to June each year. Projects are financed from various funds. Pressing or larger projects are often debt- funded. Projects are chosen either following a request from our community or as part of an earlier decided-upon development plan. All projects are prioritized according to importance and available budget- the wheels of bureaucracy can turn slowly, but be assured that the Board endeavours to address all reasonable requests.

If you wish to more directly influence what happens and when, consider putting your name forward for election in October!

Year 1 projects:

- Trail signage hub on Village Green- awaiting final quotes.
- Conical Hill walk entranceway upgrade and new toilet- done
- Conical Hill lookout and access upgrade- under way.
- Hanmer Springs (highway intersection) signage and presentation upgrade- under way
- Street lighting Amuri Avenue west and Rippingale Road- underway
- New Footpath and water infrastructure SH7A Woodbank corner to Ensors drive- underway
- Completion of footpaths on Rippingale road- nearly completed.
- Overall traffic and parking plan for the villageunderway.
- 'You are here' boards for Conical Hill and combined Dog stream reserves
- Natural materials sensory playground for Brooke Dawson Reserve- in planning stage.

Year 2 projects:

- Sports Ground upgrade
- Pavillion upgrade (separate to earthquake strengthening)
- Major storm water upgrade corner of Jacks Pass and Argelins' road.
- Footpath from SH7a intersection to Woodbank bridge.

As well as these projects, the Board works on a lot of other 'nuts & bolts' issues within the village, usually via a current 'Action Sheet'.

Refuse bags must not exceed 15kg in weight. Bags split prior to the crew's arrival and non-official bags will not be collected. Bundles of cardboard will not be collected but can be recycled via any transfer station.





Or Not

To say these are uncertain times is something of an understatement, but with Covid Omicron having arrived in Christchurch and Nelson, it seems a more than somewhat safe bet that it will be no time at all before somebody brings it to Hanmer for the weekend and leaves it behind for all of us to share.

The big question is what it will bring along with it and how extensively it will spread. And spread it will, when we have still got these rabid non-vaxxers who seem to think they know something to which the rest of us are not party.

As recently as a couple of days ago I personally witnessed adherents to this philosophy strutting their stuff in the supermarket without masks on and even trying to push their way into cafes attempting to bluff young staff with their questionable 'exemption' passes, when the signs clearly say (and the law firmly states) that people have to show their valid vaccine passes.

Are they not aware that overseas experience and statistics show clearly that they will be the first people to contract the disease and that their behaviour will do nothing but facilitate spreading it to the rest of us, not to mention occupying the time of medical staff and all the beds in hospitals. The will be the first to cry when they get sick.

I spoke to an old friend in England on Friday morning and she was in the process of recovering from Covid which she had contracted from a non-vaccinated flatmate despite the fact she herself had had two doses of vaccine and a booster. As far as I can ascertain she had been given the mRNA Pfizer Vaccine, the same as we have been inoculated with in New Zealand but she still had a rough time of the infection and was still having breathing difficulties.

So what do we do, but sit on our hands and wait for it. The Pools have taken some action but that is likely to change at the drop of a hat


They intend to "keep the pools open at the red light setting as long we are able to, and as long as staying open does not create further risk for the NZ health system. By this we mean that if there are hospitalisations in Christchurch or Canterbury, we may close."

We circulated operators of events scheduled for the next few months in Hanmer and found a lot of them have still not firmly decided whether or not they will cancel. The Amuri A & P show have already made the decision to cancel as they felt there was no way they could proceed under the Red light system. A couple of other event organisers have said they are making a decision this week, but I am prepared to bet on cancellations.

Our medical centre has worked very hard on making sure that everyone who wants vaccination and boosters is getting it, so let's hope their work is not undone by somebody who considers their direct line to God gives them a form of immunity. They should not be living under such illusions - every one of us would like to wave goodbye to all the precautions and mask wearing and checking in and checking out but we know that doing so would be a serious risk to our fellow citizens.

When Covid does hit our town it will hopefully deal a blow to the complacency that seems to exist even among many of the vaccinated. I sat outside a local business which requires checking in with the app and noted that about a third of the people who entered did not bother, rather just put a mask on and walked in.

There are going to be some lessons learned, but sadly it will almost certainly be the wrong people who pay the price.




