ORANGE & WHISKY UPSIDE DOWN CAKE

Flavoured with orange, marmalade and a good slug of whisky, this warm cake makes a wonderful dessert. Choose a large firm new-season eating orange, not a soft juicing orange, for the topping.

Ingredients

For the topping

1 orange

1 tbsp melted butter to grease the tin

3 tbsp soft brown sugar

3 tbsp whisky

3 tbsp marmalade

For the cake

120g butter 220g caster sugar 2 eggs, separated 1 tsp vanilla 100ml yoghurt

200g flour

2 tsp baking powder

pinch salt

200ml milk

pouring cream or cold custard, to serve

Method

To make the topping, place the whole orange in a saucepan of cold water over medium heat and bring to the boil. Reduce the heat to a simmer, place a lid on the saucepan and cook for an hour. Check the water level occasionally so the saucepan doesn't run dry. When soft, transfer the orange to a bowl of iced water to cool it quickly. When cool, slice the orange in half and then across into 5mm slices, discarding any seeds as you go. You will need 12 slices.

Preheat the oven to 150C fan-forced (170C conventional). Grease a 23cm springform cake tin with 1 tablespoon of melted butter and line the base with greaseproof paper.

Place the orange slices in a nice pattern in the base of the tin. Sprinkle the orange slices with the brown sugar. Combine the whisky and marmalade in a small bowl and spoon over and between the orange slices.

To make the cake, cream the butter and sugar together in a standing mixer using the whisk attachment until the sugar has dissolved. Add the egg yolks one at a time and gently mix. Add the vanilla and yoghurt, followed by half of the flour, baking powder and salt. Add the milk and the remaining flour, mixing until smooth. In a separate bowl, whisk the egg whites until they develop stiff peaks, then guickly fold into the batter. Spoon the batter over the oranges and marmalade, place in the oven and bake for 40 minutes, or until a small sharp knife inserted into the cake comes out clean. Remove the cake from the oven and leave to rest for 5 minutes. Turn the cake out onto a large serving plate and remove the tin and greaseproof paper. Serve warm with pouring cream or cold custard.

MINI POTATOES DAUPHINOISE

INGREDIENTS

1.25kg large, potatoes (suitable shape to cut into "tubes" to fill muffin holes) 50g unsalted butter 2 garlic cloves, finely minced $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt 1/4 tsp finely ground black pepper 160ml cream 1 tsp fresh thyme leaves 75g gruyere, sliced into 12 squares (to fit into muffin holes) 75g gruyere, grated **METHOD** Preheat oven to 180C fan-forced (200C conventional).

Peel the potatoes. Stand them upright and trim the sides into a cylinder shape that will fit in a standardsized muffin tin. No need to be meticulous, just as long as the potato slices can squeeze into the holes.

Slice the potato cylinders into 2mm rounds using a mandolin or your excellent knife skills.

Melt butter in a small saucepan over medium heat. Add garlic and saute until lightly golden.

Remove from the heat and brush the muffin tin holes with the garlic butter.

Add cream, salt and pepper to the remaining butter. Return the pan to medium heat, just to warm it up (don't bring to the boil). Set aside.

Stack half the potato slices into the muffin tin holes. Spoon over half the garlic cream mixture. Top each stack with one cheese slice, then pile on the remaining potato slices. Spoon over the remaining garlic cream mixture and sprinkle with most of the thyme leaves.

Cover the muffin tin loosely with foil then bake for 40 minutes or until the potato is just cooked - use a small sharp knife to check.

Remove from oven. Discard the foil, and sprinkle the potato stacks with grated cheese. Return to oven for 10 minutes until the cheese is melted, bubbly and golden. Sprinkle with remaining thyme and serve immediately.

Needless Vandalism in Clarence Valley

It is disheartening that road and information signs were extensively damaged during the holiday period.

A number of Hurunui District Council (HDC) road signs and Department of Conservation (DOC) information signs were damaged on Clarence Valley Road, Tophouse Road and Molesworth Road up to Acheron Accommodation House.

The situation was worsened by the fact that two of the damaged signs provide an early alert to road users that there is no access from the northern end of the Acheron Road in Molesworth Station out to Blenheim via Awatere Valley Rd, due to storm damage last July.

HDC's Team Leader for Roading, Kait Murray, said those who inflict this damage to the signs are also inflicting damage on the pockets of Hurunui's ratepayers.

"These Council-owned signs are not replaced or fixed for free. The funds come straight from our ratepayers," she said, adding that some signs were defaced and some were knocked over with what appears to have been a vehicle.

"We have a list of projects in the work programme we would really like to spend the money on, and it's a big shame it has to be wasted on mopping up the mess of thoughtless acts like this," said Murray, adding that HDC is working with the police to identify the culprits.

DOC Senior Heritage and Visitors Ranger James Gilmour said the DOC signs provide valuable information for visitors to Molesworth.

"It's frustrating that someone has deliberately damaged signs that are helpful to people when making a holiday trip into Molesworth."

Some signs can be re-erected, but some signs will need to be replaced.
