MESSAGE FROM NORTH CANTERBURY POLICE

Looking at the overall crime in the Waimakariri and Hurunui Districts, most events appear to be of an opportunist nature. A lot of the crimes being committed are where property has been left in plain sight, in vehicles, or houses being unlocked.

Many of the criminals that are in our area are very mobile and we have found that they can cover a lot of ground in a short amount of time.

The main things that are being targeted are tools from trades peoples vehicles, and the types of vehicle that are being stolen are the larger 4WDs namely Toyota Hilux and Surfs, Nissan Patrols, and the Mazda Bounty's. There also seems to be a black market for trailers, so any unsecured trailers are very vulnerable.

As far as any patterns go in respect of areas, there is nothing to indicate any particular area is being specifically targeted. As mentioned, it is very easy for an offender to cover a lot of ground in a vehicle.

There are some easy ways to target harden your vehicles and property, and these include locking your house when you are away, closing windows, closing the garage door even if you are home, consider alarms for your vehicles' canopy if you keep tools inside, and either GPS or steering wheel lock bars which are a great deterrent.

We also encourage you to call us on 111 if you see anything suspicious as we would much rather find out that it was innocent than to discover you had seen a burglar and Police missed the opportunity to catch them.

roast pork belly red curry

Add some heat to the dinner table with this aromatic explosion of Asian flavours. You'll need a roast pork belly for this recipe, or this curry is also great with roast chicken or duck. You can also use fresh meat such as chicken, duck or pork fillets.

Ingredients

250ml coconut cream
 3 tbsp vegetable oil
 200g red curry paste
 4 fresh kaffir lime leaves
 3 tbsp fish sauce
 2 tbsp grated palm sugar
 500ml coconut milk
 1 crisp roasted pork belly, cut into 3cm chunks
 3 long red chillies, halved lengthwise and deseeded
 10 cherry tomatoes, cut in half
 1 handful of sweet Thai basil leaves
 1 lime, to squeeze
 steamed jasmine rice, to serve

Method

Combine coconut cream and vegetable oil in a large saucepan over high heat. Bring to the boil, stirring continuously so it doesn't burn. When the coconut cream "splits" (separates into oil and solids), add the curry paste and stir continuously. Crush the lime leaves in your hand, add them to the pan and fry until the mixture is aromatic and sizzling fiercely. This will take about 10-15 minutes. Add the fish sauce and cook for 1 minute. Then add the palm sugar and coconut milk and bring to the boil. Add the pork, chillies and tomatoes, lower heat and simmer gently for about a minute until the pork is heated through. Stir in the basil with a little squeeze of fresh lime juice before serving with steamed jasmine rice.

Red Curry Specials

Thai-style fish cakes with cucumber relish

Ingredients

300g redfish or other cheap white-fleshed fish
 3 tbsp red curry paste
 1 egg
 1 tbsp fish sauce
 1 tsp castor sugar
 5 kaffir lime leaves, shredded finely
 2 snake beans, cut into fine rounds
 4 cups vegetable oil, for deep frying

METHOD

Place fish, curry paste, egg, fish sauce and castor sugar in a food processor and blend well. To give fish cakes their texture, scoop mix up and throw it back into bowl several times until sticky; this is an important part of process. Add lime leaves and beans.

Mould mixture into disks measuring 5cm by 1cm thick. In a wok, heat oil to medium heat and deep-fry cakes for about 4-5 minutes or until golden.

Serve fish cakes immediately with relish on side, garnished with extra coriander leaves.



Cucumber relish

Heat together in a small pan

3 tbsp coconut vinegar
 3 tbsp castor sugar
 4 tbsp water
 sea salt
 1 small cucumber, cut in half lengthways, then cut into ½cm half moons 3
 4 red shallots, each cut into 6 pieces
 1 cm piece ginger, julienned
 1 long fresh red chilli, split, seeds removed, julienned
 2 tbsp fresh coriander, leaves washed and dried, plus extra to garnish







tui

Tui, or koko (*Prothemadera novaeseelandiae*), were called parson birds by British settlers in New Zealand during the 19th century because the two white poi, or tufts of feathers at their throats, looked like the neck bands of a priest or minister.

They are versatile singers, combining beautifully musical notes with honks, wheezes, clicks and squawks. They can screech loudly and discordantly when alarmed. They also mimic other birds. Tui have a dual voice box, which helps them to produce so many varied sounds.

Tui were prized by Maori as fine food. They were also kept as pets and taught to talk. They were taught karakia (prayers) and whakatauki (proverbs), as well as mihi (greetings) to recite when visitors arrived. A skilful orator may be compared to a tui, using the expressions, "He koko tataki" (a witty speaker) or "Te korokoro tui" (a sweet singer or articulate speaker). Tui that could speak like this were called manu rangatira (chiefly birds).

As an endemic bird, tui are protected. The mainland species (of around here) is not endangered, but a subspecies, the Chatham Island tui (*Prothemadera novaeseelandiae chathamensis*) is classified as threatened and endangered.

Tui can be found in lowland native forests throughout New Zealand and on some offshore islands. They are also at home in towns and cities, attracted by flowering trees and shrubs on which they feed. Tui belong to the honeyeater family, feeding mainly on nectar from flowers of native plants such as kowhai, puriri, rewarewa,

kahikatea, pohutukawa, rata and harakeke (New Zealand flax). They also eat insects. They are very territorial, driving other birds away from fruiting and flowering trees so they can feed.

Tui feathers have an iridescent metallic purple, blue and green sheen on an underlying black colour. Along with the white throat feathers, these birds also sport lacey white markings around the neck, white patches on their wings and reddish-brown feathers on their backs. The beautiful plumage was used by Maori weavers to adorn kahu huruhuru (feather cloaks) and kete (baskets).

After European migration to New Zealand began, tui numbers dropped, largely because the clearance of bush and forest for pasture, crops and buildings contributed to destruction of bird habitat.

Tui were also favoured as taxidermy specimens in museums. Many were swapped, along with other birds such as huia, kakapo and kereru, for collections from around the globe.

They can be found in the collections of European and American museums to this day.

After that initial drop in population, tui adapted to the changed landscape and then thrived. These days, possums, feral cats, rats and stoats will gorge on tui eggs and young, and are the biggest danger to the species. In recent years effective predator control has led to an increase in the tui population and there are certainly a lot more of them around Hanmer in the past few years.

Update on Hanmer Springs Bowling Green Build

The project is getting closer to completion. This is very exciting for the club, however, we still have many additional costs to cover prior to opening the green, much work to be done and we need all the help we can get at this time.




Out of hours recycling for paper, card, cans, plastics types 1, 2 and 5 only and glass bottles are provided. Please ensure recycling is clean, loose articles are removed. Soft plastics (i.e. the type you can scrunch in your hand) are not recyclable and must be placed in the refuse.

Kerbside refuse and recycling collection – Monday 8am

Only official refuse and recycling bags will be collected; these can be purchased from Hanmer Springs Service Station and the library and the Log Cabin & Super Liquor. Via the recycling bags clean paper, card, cans and plastics types 1, 2 & 5 only can be recycled.

If in doubt – place it in the refuse to save contaminating recycling.

Non complying bags and recycling bags containing glass and soft plastics will not be collected.
