watermelon, prosciutto and mint salad with pink peppercorn dressing

Make sure you don't crush the spices too much – part of the goodness of this summery salad is the crunch of pink peppercorns.

INGREDIENTS

- 4 cups chopped watermelon
- 1 x 200g punnet cherry tomatoes, halved (sweet solanto or medley for colour)
- 1 cup Persian-style feta, the creamier the better
- ½–¾ cup mint leaves
- 150g prosciutto, at room temperature
- ¾ cup toasted almonds, roughly chopped (I used smoked almonds)

Dressing

- 2 tsp cumin seeds
- 2 tsp coriander seeds
- ¼–½ cup fruity olive oil
- 1 tbsp pink peppercorns
- zest of 1 lemon

METHOD

- Arrange the watermelon and tomatoes on a large serving platter. Crumble over the feta and scatter with mint leaves. Season with salt. Coarsely tear the prosciutto and place the pieces over the watermelon.
- Dry fry the cumin and coriander seeds until fragrant. Crush to a coarse texture in a mortar and pestle and add to a small bowl with the olive oil.
- Lightly crush the pink peppercorns and add to the dressing. Finely grate over the lemon zest and mix together.

tomato spaghetti marinara

You need to try and get a good marinara mix for this recipe. Some of the pre-packaged supermarket mixes are not good enough.

Ingredients

- 500g dried spaghetti
- ½ cup olive oil
- ½ onion, finely diced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 cups mixed cherry tomatoes, halved
- ¼ cup white wine
- 500g good-quality marinara mix
- a dash of fish sauce (optional)
- ¼ cup finely shredded parsley

Method

1. Bring a large pot of salted water to the boil for the pasta.
2. Place a very large frypan over medium heat and add the oil and onion. Cook for about 5 minutes, then add the garlic and cook for a further 2 minutes. (At this point you can add the pasta to the water, as it will take about 10 minutes to cook.) Add the tomatoes and cook for about 5 minutes, then add the white wine, marinara mix, and fish sauce (if using). Bring to a simmer and simmer for about 5 minutes, until the seafood is nearly cooked through. Drain the pasta and transfer to the frying pan with a little of the pasta water. Toss to combine, then stir through the parsley and serve.

I sometimes use a couple of tablespoons of cream instead of the pasta water

Ross Malcom Brooke

1922 - 2022

Old timers in Hanmer will fondly remember Ross Brooke who was for several years the headmaster of Hanmer Springs School in the late fifties.

Hanmer was very lucky to get him as he had just been appointed to a senior education job when it was realised he had not had any necessary country service so he was appointed to the job in Hanmer, but he did stay much longer than the requisite two years. He was a breath of fresh air into the school and he devoted his time to improving the facilities, be they sporting or building the school library. He was a great lover of literature and poetry and he succeeded in instilling that in many of his pupils.

As an obituary, this is very light on details but very strong in memories of a great man who had a strong influence on so many of the kids he taught. He had a special talent for imparting not only knowledge but also enthusiasm. He took an interest in the lives and the progress of everyone he taught and was very active in the Hanmer Springs community.

I was lucky enough to see him when he visited Hanmer about six years ago and I was amazed when I fished out an old class photograph from almost sixty years before he was still able to name every pupil. Very recently he met Mark Minson and on hearing he was from Hanmer made enquiries about many of his former charges.

I know I speak for a lot of other former pupils in saying that he had a great talent for instilling a love of learning and a curiosity about all things.

During the war he had been a lieutenant in the navy involved in protecting convoys in the North Sea and told some wonderful tales of that life and its hardships. It was a joke, which he shared, that if the maths got boring, then Mr Brooke could always be diverted into tales of the North Sea.

He had been very much looking forward to his one hundredth birthday in a few weeks time, but sadly he fell just short of the celebration.

Those of us who remember him, remember him very fondly and he certainly left the Hanmer school a lot better for his having been here.

His wife Betty predeceased him by about six years. Or sympathies go to Richard, Sally and Penelope, his nine grandchildren, fourteen great grandchildren and one great great grandchild.

He lived a full life and made many valuable contributions.

Update from Chorus on copper and fibre

There's lots of talk about changes happening to the Chorus copper network but for now the Hurunui District remains unaffected.

Nathan Beaumont, Chorus' Head of Government, Stakeholder and External Relationships, says for now there are no plans to retire the copper lines in Hurunui.

"Our UFB build will come to an end this year and by December 87% of people throughout the country will be able to connect to fibre.

"While obviously we are keen to get everyone on to fibre so they can enjoy the many benefits of this fantastic network, we know that there has been concern for those on copper connections outside fibre areas," he said.

"People want to know what is happening with their copper lines and the short answer is that nothing is happening in the Hurunui District. We have no plans at present to retire any copper lines in Hurunui, even where we have fibre."

With the change to fibre Chorus has started retiring some copper cabinets where there are only very few people still connected. This is only in fibre areas where the majority have changed to the new network and will not be happening where there is no fibre or no other fixed line alternative.

The vast majority of retiring cabinets are in the Auckland area and Chorus has been or will be in contact with those affected directly. If people who live in a fibre area don't hear from Chorus, they can remain on their copper connections until they do.

"Areas outside the reach of fibre, such as many Hurunui areas, will stay on their copper lines," Mr Beaumont said.

"However we are aware that there is a lot of misinformation out there so we encourage people to ensure they are on the right connection and getting the best value for money by checking in with Broadband Compare.

"They are an independent organisation that can help reassure people that they can stay on copper or change to fibre if they want. They can also ensure that people are only paying for what they need."

Hanmer Motorfest Cancelled this Year But What's Going to Happen With it?

The annual Hanmer Springs Motorfest 2022 is not going ahead this year. It had been planned for James Beaven's paddock just down from the Animal Farm. Organisers have advised that the reason it is cancelled is Covid restrictions. Rumours on the Facebook misinformation mill have stated that the Council cancelled it, which is incorrect.

Nevertheless, the organisers have a dilemma on their hands because the property which was planned for this year will not be available next year due to its impending sale.

In a statement issued last week on behalf of the organisers, Bryan Berryman, who has been involved for the seven years the event has been coming to Hanmer told us, "After careful consideration and consultation with sponsors and interested parties the organising committee has decided to postpone this years event solely due to the uncertainty in relation to the Covid pandemic, this decision was not taken lightly and was made with deep regret.

"The Motorfest will be back next February bigger and better with the club committed to the event.

"Unfortunately there have been rumours circulating that the postponement of the event is due to the Hurunui council not wanting the car show in Hanmer Springs, this I think came about after the Hurunui council put the show at risk last year so I must reiterate the decision made to postpone the event has been made solely by the car club in the very best interests of everyone involved so even though there will be no show this year the show will be back in all its glory next February 2023. "However, herein lies a problem. Now that James Beaven has sold his farm we are going to have to find somewhere else to hold the show.

"We would like to try and get back to the domain but we can't be expected to reduce the size of the MotorFest keeping in mind it just keeps growing in size year after year. Apparently there is a small band of Rugby people unhappy with the Motorfest but after all it is a Domain for everyone to use. "I think this is one of the biggest if not the biggest event held in Hanmer and by far brings in the most dollars and every single accommodation provider, shop, restaurant and activities

supplier does extremely well. Even Waiiau, Rotherham and other areas of the Hurunui enjoy the increase in trade. Take into account, we have people and cars from every corner of New Zealand which can only be good for Hanmer and the Hurunui district as a whole.

"Last year we had cars arriving Wednesday prior to the meet and there were still cars here the following Tuesday and I know some of them were from North Island, it's hard to imagine why we want to chase this business away to Tekapo.

"The car club organisers are coming to Hanmer in a couple of weeks to try and figure out how we can move forward and get the council to get in behind us instead of sacrificing the MotorFest in favour of a much smaller 'hope to attract' event.

The Pinkie has been attempting to get to the real truth of what is happening with the event and why the Council are so reticent to allow it back into Hanmer.

After all, times are tough and we seem to be turning away an event that generates a huge hit of income into the town, something that is more than sorely needed.

Having seen the results of a survey conducted on the Half Marathon weekend by Graham Frith a few years ago, we have looked closely into figures for last year's Motorfest. Last year 823 cars were officially registered for the event and according to figures supplied by entrants there was an average of 3.1 people per car that came to Hanmer.

Add to this, and here we don't have any official figures, there were a minimum of one hundred additional cars that came to Hanmer that weekend who were not registered entrants, and add to this the people who were not involved but were car buffs who came to Hanmer for the weekend.

Over 4000 passed through the gates and into the Domain.

Using these figures we can safely project that a bare minimum of 3000 people needed accommodation, feeding and watering for at least two days, some for longer and simple mental arithmetic tells us this was a million dollar plus hit for the town's economy. Add to that, what other spending was pumped into the Hanmer trading figures over the participants' stay in Hanmer and we are looking at a very large sum of money, certainly one and half million bucks, which now seems at risk.

We too have heard the various stories circulating on the misinformation grapevine, the most prevalent being that the rugby club claim that they wish to realign the rugby fields and that they wish to attract more "big" games to Hanmer and that the Motorfest will interfere with this. The only 'big' rugby event in Hanmer this past year was a pre-season match between the Crusaders and the Makos at a cost of \$10,000 to get it here.

Another reason that we have been supplied, is that the Council have plans to realign the cricket pitch.

We are hardly talking Patumahoe drop-in pitches here, it is just concrete with matting. Add that to the fact that we have neither a cricket club nor a cricket team and the wicket only gets used once a year for the Annual Cops vs Pools match. For that matter we don't have a rugby team either. Hanmer has never been successful in maintaining a rugby team. When it has been able to raise a team it has always struggled for players as there has always been a transient population in the rugby playing age group.

Sure, we want to encourage our kids to play rugby but we have not seen much of that in recent years and even if we had the kids hardly need resized, realigned well-watered international standard rugby fields.

The Domain area was put aside in the 1860s as 'a shared public space open for and accessible to the public' and is today a Council reserve and not the exclusive right of any particular sporting club. 'Shared' being the operative word - why can it not be shared as intended.

Bearing all this in mind we have been to the Hurunui District Council and asked for their official position on the Motorfest's use of the Domain. Their first response was to request names and phone numbers of the organisers, which The Pinkie supplied. They then apparently contacted the organisers directly to discuss the future of the event with them before they responded. Here is their response to us..

"I'm unaware of the alternative site and its impending sale.

As with many different events district wide, Council, and in this instance, the Community Board and the Reserve Advisory Group support the event and would welcome it back in Hanmer Springs. I have made contact with the organiser and made this position clear.

There are certainly some constraints around allowing vehicles on a recreation reserve and we don't want to see newly developed sports fields damaged if it can be avoided. We've agreed that we will work together on their next application to ensure those constraints can be met but still meet the needs of the event.

Prior to this issue being raised, coincidentally the Community Board members had asked Officers to investigate alternative/additional parking to facilitate larger events at the domain. This is still being worked through."

At this stage all we can comment is that common sense seems to have prevailed. It appears that the Motorfest is safe along with all those dollars it brings. The only remaining question appears to be around the definition of "some constraints" and what they will involve.

We certainly hope that organisers will not have to stop cars who had registered coming onto the domain like they were forced to do at the last event. A lack of parking space owing to the restrictions placed on their use of the domain ground, caused ill feeling from the entrants who had registered and were unable to get into the domain, something which proved more than embarrassing for the organisers.

The Road to Hanmer

To the Editor.

1930

Dear Sir,—I would like to congratulate the correspondent of Thursday for pointing out the advantages of the Lewis Pass road passing through Hanmer Springs. There is another point for Hanmer and Christchurch people also, and that is if Hanmer comes on the main artery between Christchurch and Reefton the motor fares to Hanmer would automatically be reduced by half, for the argument at present advanced by the proprietors of the existing service is that Hanmer, being a "dead end," fares cannot possibly compare with the fares to Timaru and other places a corresponding distance from Christchurch or with fares in other parts of the Dominion. Also, presumably, there will be two motor services on the road, promoting competition, which is badly wanted; also increased facilities for travel between Hanmer and Christchurch.—I am, etc.,

SPECIALLY INTERESTED.

Sir,—For the last five years work has been in progress on the tar-sealing of the road from Culverden to Hanmer Springs. There are about 21 miles in all, and of this about 11 miles have been completed. It is probable that this work has been held up to allow for the bridges over water-courses to be repaired or altered. But surely five years is a long time for this job to be uncompleted, when it is considered that Hanmer Springs is recognised as one of Canterbury's tourist attractions. Could the highway authorities tell the travelling public first, when the road will be completed, and second, if it is intended to tar-seal right to the township of Hanmer. It will be appreciated that the early completion of this work is in the interests of Hanmer Springs, and in a wider sense, Canterbury.—Yours, etc.,

["The road from the 21 miles to the Hanmer Springs junction is under reconstruction and will be sealed as soon as possible," said Mr S. McGregor, Highways Engineer for the Ministry of Works, Christchurch, when this letter was referred to him. "The work has been going on for some time, and its progress is commensurate with the funds available. The road between Hanmer Springs Junction and Hanmer Springs is a matter for the Amuri County Council," he added.]







Kerbside refuse and recycling collection – Monday 8am

Only official refuse and recycling bags will be collected; these can be purchased from Hanmer Springs Service Station and the library and the Log Cabin & Super Liquor. Via the recycling bags clean paper, card, cans and plastics types 1, 2 & 5 only can be recycled.
