Golden Syrup Pudding

A self-saucing pudding made in the microwave that tastes just like golden syrup dumplings, but is a lot easier to make, even the kids cab make it.

Ingredients

- 60g butter
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 cup self-raising flour
- 1 1/2 cups boiling water
- 3 tbs golden syrup

Method

Mix together milk, sugar and flour in a microwave safe dish. Dissolve the golden syrup in the boiling water and pour over the top.

Microwave on high for eight minutes in a large bowl. Serve with lots of cream and/or ice cream

Lemon Delicious

Ingredients 50 grams butter, softened 1/2 cup caster sugar 2 large lemons, grated rind 2 eggs, separated 1/4 flour, sifted 1 cup milk 1/4 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice icing sugar to serve

Method

Beat the butter, sugar, lemon rind and egg yolks together until light and fluffy. Gently stir in the flour, milk and lemon juice.

Put the egg whites in a clean bowl and beat until they form stiff peaks but are not dry.

Fold the two mixtures together and pour into a well-greased 3-4 cup capacity ovenproof dish. Bake at 160°C for 30-35 minutes in a water-bath until the top is golden and firm to the touch. Serve dusted with icing sugar and accompanied with ice cream for a delicious dessert.





Self Saucing Chocolate Pudding

Delicious and indulgent. For chocolate lovers this will quickly become your favourite dessert recipe



INGREDIENTS

60g unsalted butter 1/2 cup (125ml) milk 1 tsp vanilla extract 3/4 cup (165g) caster sugar 1 cup (150g) self-raising flour, sifted 2 tbs cocoa, sifted, plus extra to dust 3/4 firmly packed cup (185g) brown sugar Thickened cream, to serve Method

Preheat the oven to 180°C. Grease a 1.5L (6-cup) capacity ovenproof baking dish.

Melt the butter with the milk in a small saucepan over low heat. Add the vanilla, caster sugar, flour and 1 tbs cocoa, stirring to combine. Spread mixture evenly into the prepared baking dish.

Combine the brown sugar and remaining 1 tbs cocoa in a bowl with 2 cups (500ml) boiling water. Stir until sugar has dissolved, then carefully pour over the pudding batter. Bake for 35-40 minutes until the top is firm.

Stand for 5 minutes to cool slightly. Dust the warm pudding with cocoa and serve immediately topped with cream.

Four Square Half Marathon, Bivouac Outdoor Mount Isobel Challenge and the 4&8 Hour MTB Race All Cancelled for This Year

Hanmer Events has advised us that following the announcement from the New Zealand Government that the whole of the country is now in the Red setting of the Covid-19 Protection Framework, it is with a heavy heart that they announce the cancellation of the Hanmer Springs Four Square Half Marathon and Bivouac Outdoor Mount Isobel Challenge for 2022.

In light of the recent spike in Covid-19 cases and the uncertainty regarding the Red setting timeframe, we have made the tough decision to cancel these races in addition to the Hanmer Springs 4&8 Hour MTB Race.

In a statement released last week they told us, "We are incredibly disappointed that another season of Hanmer Events has been affected by Covid-19 as we know that so many of you will have been looking forward to creating more memories on the trails.

"The team has been working hard to find a way to stage these races safely, however due to their nature, we have been unable to implement an achievable framework. Furthermore, Hanmer Events is owned by the Hanmer Springs Community Trust, a not-for-profit entity which services the local Hanmer Springs community. With the financial risk involved in staging these races during such times of uncertainty, we feel it would be irresponsible to jeopardise the funding of local community services which are integral to the residents of Hanmer Springs.

The dates for future events will be released in due course."



Woodbank Rogerson Bridge Work

Delayed

Scaffolding was scheduled to start last week but will be delayed at least 10 days due to COVID staff losses, according to a statement on the Council's website. This will have a flow-on effect for the planned railing replacements. We will provide another update by Friday 18 March.

Repairs to the Woodbank Bridge railings in Hanmer Springs, will start soon with scaffold being attached to the sides of the bridge. The scaffold area is a working platform with overlapping timber planks. It is NOT a safe place to explore or use for a walkway.

Replacement of the bridge railings and kerb will start soon after the scaffold assembly. This work will take approximately two weeks. Hardwood timber, recycled from the Lyttelton Wharf, is being used for the replacement kerb blocks. These will be more durable than the previous timbers.

The closing times of the bridge will be widely publicised once work dates are confirmed.

Emergency Service vehicles will be able to cross the bridge if needed.

The Fowlers of Stanleyvale

second in a series of articles about the Fowler family and their tenure at Stanleyvale

A year later William Fowler was back in court, this time in a case which the media of the day described by saying the "pleadings were intricate and the transactions between the parties were very complicated. Again the dispute was over sheep and Mr Fowler was the plaintiff and Nathaniel Fowler and Joseph Young the defendants. It was largely to do with an 1868 partnership agreement between William and Nathaniel in which their partnership was to be dissolved. A considerable number of witnesses were called and the trial lasted three days. The twenty-three point verdict delivered by the jury had much to do with the ownership of a mob of 450 sheep. The jury verdict seemed no less complicated than the proceedings.

At this time sheep scab had become epidemic in New Zealand's flocks and a report in the Marlborough Express dated 1873 had what it titled the "the Nelson Scab report" in which it stated that Messrs J. G. Anstey, Parnassus, 30,000; Caverhill, Highfield, 27,000; A. Rutherford, Mendip Hills, 8,000; J. Tinline, Lyndon, 25,000; G. Rutherford, Leslie Hills, 20,000; W. Rutherford, Sherwood, 1,200; E. Jones, Waiau, 2,000; D'Lapasture, Glen Wye, 15,000; Jones & Kent, Hopefield, 5,500; W. Atkinson, Hanmer Plains, 7,000; D'Lamaine, 9,000; M'Arthur, St. James, 10,000; and W. L. Fowler, Stanley Vale, 16,000—all these runs have had certificates granted, but all are liable to re-infection by stray sheep from infected districts. The total number of clean sheep is set down at 431,383, and the districts extend from the Hurunui to the Clarence.

In 1875 Mr Fowler was back in court again, this time being fined \pounds 2 under the Scab Act 'for having failed to furnish to the chief inspector of sheep a return of the number of sheep in his possession'.

Three months later Fowler was back in the courts, this time suing John and Duncan McArthur, the owners of two or three runs, all of which, in some degree, adjoined the Stanley Vale run. The action was brought by Fowler wishing to recover £5000, and £1000 special damages, for malicious prosecution. This was to do with Mr Fowler having been charged with having 'feloniously stolen certain sheep, the property of the defendants. As a result Mr Fowler had been arrested and remanded in prison until trial at the Supreme Court in Christchurch. At this trial Fowler was acquitted by the jury.

Mr Fowler claimed that this action had harmed his person and his reputation and that he was entitled to compensation. During this trial (at Waiau) a large number of witnesses were called and much of the evidence of Mr Fowler's original trial was read.

In a statement to the court William Fowler said

"I am a runholder in the Amuri, Province of Nelson. I was tried before the Supreme Court on April 6 last, on a charge of stealing sheep; the property of M^cArthur, Bros. I was arrested at my station, fifty miles from the Waiau. John Corbett arrested me, and took me to St James' station the next morning. He said he arrested me in the Queen's name, and then left me in my own house, he going to his wharé.

On the morning we went to St James' station, Corbett came to tell me I must go with him. On the day previous he told me he was a detective, and would take me in charge. He charged me with stealing a sheep, the property of the defendants, McArthur brothers. When we got to St James' I saw John McArthur. He came over to the wool-shed, and said he was very sorry; he had nothing to do with it. This was after he and Corbett went away together. While we were at the dip, Corbett saw a sheep lying there, which we were going to kill. Corbett claimed it as McArthur's, but I saw my ear mark on it, and told him it was mine. He called on Robinson, my shepherd, to assist him in the Queen's name to prevent me from killing the sheep. I cut the head off, washed it, salted it, and sewed it up in a cloth. Corbett was with me the whole time, and while in the house getting something to drink,

Corbett snatched the sheep's head out of my hands and went away. I was taken by Corbett to the Waiau and brought before the magistrates. Prior to arresting me, Corbett and myself were on very intimate terms. He used to come down and borrow hooks and other things from me. He used to come for milk every morning, and for butter when we churned, and several times he stopped at my house for one or two hours of an evening. I did not know that he was a detective or a police officer. "

[The witness went on to state the amount of expense he had been put to, in consequence of the prosecution which had been instituted against him. The expenses he had incurred amounted to $\pounds186$.]

Mr Fowler's son, Stanley also gave evidence and stated that the dispute was over one sheep. Edward Kent, a sheep farmer in the district, gave evidence as to the defendant having said the plaintiff was a nuisance, and he would have him out of the country in two years.

John Scott Caverhill was called, but did not appear.

The case continued into a third day.

The following was a Press report datelined 'Supreme Court' 18 October 1885'

"The case of Fowler vs McArthur, in which the plaintiff claimed £6000 damages for malicious prosecution was concluded late on Saturday evening. The counsel on both sides having addressed the jury at some length, his Honour summed up the case, exhaustively commenting on the evidence given. The jury retired to consider their verdict shortly after 3 pm, and 5 pm the jury returned into court, when the foreman (Mr J Tosswill) informed his Honour that there was no possibility of the jury agreeing, two-thirds being for a verdict one way, and one third in another. His Honour informed the foreman that he could not, under the Act, discharge the jury until they had been six hours in deliberation. The jury again retired and shortly before 7 pm returned into court with a verdict for the plaintiff with damages of one farthing."





- set up a My Health Account if you don't already have one and you're over 12 - you will need your own email address and a valid form of ID
 if you already have a My Health Account, log in
- scroll to "Self-report a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) result," click "Report test result" and follow the instructions

You can do it over the phone by calling 0800 222 478 - select option 3

- call any time between 8am and 8pm, 7 days a week - use this to report RAT results for those under 12
