(If we don't pick up, please leave your name, date of birth and contact phone number and one of our staff will call you back)

Changes to Traffic Light System – summary:

At 11.59pm on Friday 25th March – scanning of QR codes no longer necessary.

At 11.59pm on Monday 4^{th} April – vaccine passes won't be required, however businesses will still be able to use the system if they would like to.

Changes to the Traffic Light System – details:

At Green, there will be no restrictions, but you're encouraged to look after each other by keeping up good health behaviours such as mask wearing on public transport and regular hand washing.

At Orange, masks will be required in all the indoor places they are now. There will be no capacity limits at gatherings.

At Red – in addition to masks, there will be an indoor limit of 200 people but no limits on outdoor gatherings or events.

These changes to **RED** will be in place from midnight Friday. From then, scanning of QR codes will no longer be necessary. From 11.59pm 4th April, Vaccine Passes won't be required. That's all there is to remember.

If you do test positive or someone in your household does, everyone must isolate for seven days. Find out more here: https://covid19.govt.nz/traffic-lights-changes

If you call our clinic phone out of hours, your call is always answered by a registered nurse who will assess your needs, offer advice or, if required arrange immediate assistance from our on-call clinician. It can take several minutes to answer the phone so please be patient and hold, and follow the voice prompts carefully

COVID IN THE COMMUNITY UPDATE

Hanmer Springs Health Centre, Sunday 27th March 6pm

The cases continue to rise in our community, with a similar number of cases to last week. We are also aware of other Hanmer Springs residents, who are not registered with us, but are self-isolating too.

Please don't hesitate to **call us on 03 315 7503**, whether you are registered with us or not, if you are **feeling unwell** and need to see us **for any reason**. We are here for all our community.

Reminder: If you are a household contact, living with a positive COVID-19 person, you should immediately self-isolate for seven days and not go to work. You should also test for COVID-19 on days 3 and 7 via a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT). We can do this at the Health Centre for you FREE of charge. On completion of 7 days isolation, with no positive RAT results or symptoms, you can return to work on day 8.

Vaccination Programme

Our Covid-19 vaccination programme continues, with regular adult and 5-11year clinics. Last week we had **30 of our 5-11years have their second vaccinations**. This is what one of the parents had to

say about why the chose for their two children, pictured opposite, to have the COVID-19 vaccination:

"We chose to vaccinate our children as it was the best way, we could see to protect them from Covid. They spend a large amount of their time in close contact with lots of other children and adults and getting them vaccination against Covid is their best chance at not contracting the virus or having milder side effects should they contract it"

We encourage you to consider having your 5–11-yearolds vaccinated to minimise the risk to them, their friends at school, you and your family and whanau.



To help keep yourself well and minimise the spread of COVID-19 we encourage you to:

- Stay home if you are unwell or have COVID-19 symptoms.
- Isolate if you are a household contact living with a positive COVID-19 case, to provide you, your family and whanau and the wider community.
- Book a FREE supervised Rapid Antigen Test and short consultation with us if you have symptoms. Simply call our reception team on 03 315 7503.
- Wear a surgical or N95 mask and show your vaccination pass when out and about.
- Keep up healthy habits such as washing hands regularly and physical distancing.

Coconut and passionfruit self-saucing pudding Ingredients

1 cup self-raising flour

1/2 cup caster sugar

1/2 cup desiccated coconut

2/3 cup light coconut milk

1 egg

80g butter, melted, cooled pure icing sugar, to serve

Sauce

1/2 cup caster sugar

3 tsp cornflour

1/2 cup milk

2 small lemons, juiced

3 passionfruit, halved

Method

Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease a 6-cup capacity, 5.5cm-deep, 19cm x 25cm (base) ovenproof dish and place on a baking tray lined with baking paper.

Sift flour into a bowl. Stir in sugar and coconut. Whisk coconut milk, egg and butter together in a jug. Pour into flour mixture. Gently stir until combined. Spoon into prepared dish. Smooth surface.

Make sauce: Combine sugar and cornflour in a bowl. Sprinkle over pudding. Combine milk and 1/3 cup lemon juice (don't worry if mixture curdles) in a small saucepan. Cook, stirring, over medium heat until mixture comes to the boil. Remove from heat and stir in passionfruit pulp. Pour hot lemon mixture over the back of a large metal spoon, over pudding. Bake for 50 to 55 minutes or until a skewer inserted halfway into pudding comes out clean. Dust with icing sugar and serve immediately.

(Instead of fresh passionfruit you can buy passionfruit pulp in jars in the supermarket but note that it is quite sweet so you should slightly reduce the amount of sugar you use.

Peach, apple and custard brown Betty

A Brown Betty is a traditional American dessert similar to a crumble but with crumbs on the base. Our version uses fruit bread, pie apple and canned sliced peaches, making it budget-friendly and everyday easy!

Ingredients

6 slices fruit bread, chopped

1/3 cup brown sugar

1/3 cup desiccated coconut

1/2 tsp mixed spice

400g can sliced pie apples

410g can sliced peaches, drained

1 cup thick vanilla custard

40g butter, finely chopped

Icing sugar mixture, for dusting

Honey, caramel and macadamia ice-cream, to serve

Method

Preheat oven to 200C/180C fan-forced. Grease a 2-litre (8-cup-capacity) rectangular roasting dish.

Process bread in a food processor until coarse breadcrumbs form. Add sugar, coconut and mixed spice. Process for 10 seconds or until combined.

Sprinkle 1/2 the breadcrumbs over base of prepared dish. Top with apples and peaches. Dollop spoonfuls of custard evenly over fruit. Sprinkle with remaining breadcrumbs. Scatter evenly with butter. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until breadcrumbs are crisp and golden. Dust with icing sugar. Serve with ice-cream.



Star, Issue 3956, 22 December 1880 **ACCLIMATISATION SOCIETY**

TROUT.

The following was laid upon the table: —

Stanley Vale, Nov. 20, 1880.


My Dear Sir,-

As I promised to write and tell you how I got on with the fish, I am glad to have the pleasure of saying that I arrived at Lake Guyon on Wednesday night at seven o'clock-130 miles. The whole of the fish were alive, with the exception of eleven, and they appeared as fresh and lively as when I took charge of them from the Curator. You see that they can be carried any distance if care is taken. I put a tablespoonful of oatmeal into the can twice on the road, and I think it improved them. I stayed up all night with them at the Ferry-that is the end of the coach. I then carried them 30 miles on horseback. I do not think that carrying Once in Tasmania, the trout eggs were taken to a hatchery them on horse shook them so much as coach.

Your Curator told me he would like some Paradise ducks. I will do my best to send some, as they are now hatching, and there seems to be plenty of them, and as soon as they are a bit strong I will send some to the coach and a telegram to you from the Hurunui. You will have to send the Curator to meet the evening train from Amberley to take charge of them at once, and get them on the ground.

150 years since brown trout were first introduced to high country

The highly-valued sports fish survived the long trip by sailing ship from Britain to become established as not only a culturally valuable species, but also the basis of a multi-million dollar tourism industry.

Brown trout are native to Europe and were first introduced into New Zealand in 1867 from British stock which had been established in Tasmania only three years earlier. The delicate cargo of trout and salmon eggs had been brought by ship from England in 1864, delicately packed in boxes with moss and ice as reliable shipboard refrigeration machines would not be developed until 1877. Only the trout eggs survived the perilous three-month journey to the other side of the world, with all the salmon eggs dying during the voyage.

north of Hobart where they hatched a few weeks after they arrived. The trout were then released into the nearby Plenty River, and Tasmania's highland lakes. With a finhold now established in the southern hemisphere, brown trout were bred and then sent to Victoria, New Zealand and South Africa, spawning a new pastime for thousands.

In New Zealand, the first live trout to hatch here was a brown in Christchurch on October 10, 1867. It was one of 1200 ova that the curator of the Canterbury Acclimatisation Society, Andrew Johnson, brought back from Tasmania. The fish was hatched in a small wooden box, at the Society's grounds in Hagley Park, Christchurch. The lone trout's hatch was followed a few days later by a further two.

A year later in August 1868, the Otago Acclimatisation Society, sent their curator to Hobart to procure a supply of trout ova.

Returning on the Free Trader, Charles Clifford brought with him 800 ova, of which 724 hatched.

In many ways it was this introduction that assured the presence of trout in New Zealand, as the Otago Acclimatisation Society now had a sufficient population from which to establish a breeding supply and remove the reliance on Tasmania.

The Nelson and Southland acclimatisation societies also secured trout ova that year. It is not known where the Nelson Acclimatisation Society sourced their trout but it is they who were responsible for stocking all the high country lakes and rivers around Hanmer Springs.

"There is no doubt that the South Island acclimatisation societies, and in particular Canterbury Nelson and Otago, were the driving force behind the introduction of trout to New Zealand."

In the years that followed the initial introductions, these societies grew their populations of trout, both through further importations from Tasmania and natural reproduction, and began to distribute the fish throughout their regions.

Brown trout are now esteemed by New Zealand anglers and the fishery here is rated as one of the best in the world, attracting high-spending international anglers here every year.


