COVID in the Community Update

Hanmer Springs Health Centre, Sunday 3rd April 10am

We are pleased to report the number of **new positive** cases dropped by 33% last week in our community, compared to the previous two week.

Please don't hesitate to call us on 03 315 7503, whether you are registered with us or not, if you are feeling unwell or need to see us for any reason. We are here for all our community.

Reminder: If you are a household contact, living with a positive COVID-19 person, you should immediately self-isolate for seven days and not go to work. You should also test for COVID-19 on days 3 and 7 via a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT).

We can do this at the Health Centre for you FREE of charge. On completion of 7 days isolation, with no positive RAT results or symptoms, you can return to work on day 8.

To help keep yourself well and minimise the spread of COVID-19 we encourage you to:

- Stay home if you are unwell or have COVID-19 symptoms.
- Isolate if you are a household contact living with a positive COVID-19 case, to provide you, your family and whanau and the wider community.
- Book a FREE supervised Rapid Antigen Test and short consultation with us if you have symptoms.
 Simply call our reception team on 03 315 7503.
- Wear a surgical or N95 mask and show your vaccination pass when out and about.
- Keep up healthy habits such as washing hands regularly and physical distancing.

Waiting for 3 months after you test positive for COVID-19 can give you better protection and an increased immune response to the vaccine dose

If you call our clinic phone out of hours, your call is always answered by a registered nurse who will assess your needs, offer advice or, if required, arrange immediate assistance from our on-call clinician. Corde Ltd awarded Hurunui District Council Roading Contract

Corde Limited (formerly Sicon Ltd) has been awarded the road maintenance contract for Hurunui District Council, under the HDC 21/03: Road Maintenance and Renewals Contract 2021-2026.

A tender evaluation team undertook a comprehensive review of the Corde tender submission, and it was agreed that the submission met all the contract pre-conditions, and their attributes gave the team confidence that Corde had the appropriate resource levels, experience and management team to ensure the contract's levels of service can be met.

The contract term is to be five years with two additional two year extensions available if the performance criteria are met, as set out in the contract documents.

The current contract is due to expire June 30th 2022, which currently sits with Corde.

The contract was publicly advertised on October 14, 2021 to allow time for appropriate transition periods between contracts, with the Tender period closing on December 17, 2021. Only one submission was received.

The entire process was carried out under the scrutiny of a Probity Auditor.

"Council awarding the contract to Corde is good for the District. They will continue to work hard providing the District with a good level of service," said Hamish Dobbie, Hurunui District Council CEO.

"We had expected to see a marked difference in pricing for the new contract versus the old and this is understandable given the global issues and uncertainty everyone is aware of, coupled to inflation," he added.

"We look forward to continue our relationship with the Council and are excited to continue working in the District delivering their roading contract," said Corde Ltd CEO Dave Wilson.

The contract with Corde will begin on July 1st, 2022.

Why is the Flu Vaccination So Important This Year?

Immunisation is the best way to protect our community from infection and serious illness. With the borders closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Aotearoa New Zealand has had few to no influenza infections for the past two years. This reduction in infections is likely to have led to lower-thannormal immunity against the virus in the New Zealand population.

As COVID-19 restrictions ease and borders re-open, it can be expected that a resurgence of respiratory viruses will follow, and seasonal viruses may not follow typical seasonal patterns. The lack of seasonal infection in 2020 and 2021 will likely result in reduced residual immunity and contribute to a higher risk of serious disease. The Ministry of Health say we can expect to have influenza circulating in our community this winter, and we cannot predict what this influenza season may be like, therefore, preparation is of the utmost priority.

Eligibility for fully funded Flu vaccination

Funded influenza vaccinations are available for those who meet PHARMAC's eligibility criteria:

- pregnant people
- people aged 65 years and older
- Māori and Pacific peoples aged 55 to 64 years
- people aged 6 months to under 65 years with eligible conditions (please call for more details)
- tamariki aged 4 years or under who have been hospitalised for respiratory illness (including measles) or have a history of significant respiratory illness.

Don't hesitate to contact us if you are unsure if you are eligible.




















The Story Behind the Squirrels

How two squirrels came to be in the Hanmer Heritage Forest off Jollies Pass Road is now recorded in a new sign alongside them on the Forest Amble.

They're there in memory of Andy Clayton, a longstanding forest trust member and supporter who died in 2019.

Andy's trust roles ranged from fund-raiser to chairman over the years.

He was elected to the trust board in 2005, becoming chairman for a year in May 2008.

An active member, he worked hard on track improvements becoming even more active after the trust board's 2009 annual general meeting when he became the ex-officio ranger.

The position was non-stipendiary but had voting rights and he could not do this and be chairman. In 2010, his wife, Roz, became chairman for the next four years and they agreed he should not be a board member if Roz was chair.

His position then developed into the role of contractor for any work that needed doing, new track development, signage installation, weed control and much more until he died in 2019.

Red squirrels were special to Andy who hailed from the West Midlands in the United Kingdom. They were part of his childhood and trips to the UK usually led to searches to see the elusive creatures.

Roz remains the trust board's secretary.






