If you perform your own Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) for COVID-19, you should record your results, whether positive or negative, by:

2. Calling 0800 222 478 and choose option 3

If you are living with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 you also need to isolate and have a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) for COVID-19 on days 3 and 7 of your isolation.

FOOD, ENERGY, INFLATION, CLIMATE CONTROL, POLLUTION, WARS, WATER, CORRUPTION, FINANCE, IMMIGRATION, POLITICIANS AND A FEW OTHER PROBLEMS AROUND OUR WONDERFUL WORLD Pita Alexander

- 1. Many developed countries currently have a "cost of living" problem, far less developed countries the issue is more of a "cost of dying" issue.
- 2. The United Nations Secretary, Antonio Guterres, has suggested that tens of millions of people will be tipped into food insecurity the way things are going and, perhaps, push the world into a global recession.
- 3. New Zealand is certainly tightening up. COVID is being added to or replaced by inflation, a drop in household confidence, increase in interest rates, increase in building costs and significant inflationary cost increases across the board. The New Zealand Treasury is referring to 6.7-6.9% inflation at the present time.
- 4. New Zealand and Australia could probably produce enough food for maybe seven-eight times their populations but food is not the whole story, New Zealand and Australia are just part of a very big worldwide jigsaw puzzle.
- 5. Ukraine and Russia normally produce around 30% of the world's wheat exports, plus substantial amounts of barley, maize and sunflower oil. Presently much, if not all, of this cannot be exported due to Russia's Black Sea blockade.
- 6. Some countries, like Egypt (population 104 million) and Brazil (population 213 million) are both very vulnerable to food insecurity. Egypt is very reliant on Russian and Ukraine wheat bread is about 30% of their diet. Egypt is the biggest world wheat importer with 80% coming from Russia and Ukraine.
- 7. Many undeveloped countries have used up their financial reserves in dealing with COVID, such that coping with food insecurity is out of their reach. Climate control measures are even further down the track. Many of these undeveloped countries now have large offshore debts.
- 8. Some countries are very dependent upon food (also energy) imports, such as Argentina, Tunisia, Pakistan and the Philippines these four countries total 393 million people.
- 9. Some counties (23 in total to date) who normally export food now have export bans on food, such as India with wheat, China is buying up wheat due to a poor harvest at home. The price of wheat has increased 59% since the start of the

- year, but the cost to grow wheat re seed, fertiliser and chemicals has also risen sharply.
- 10. Sri Lanka (population 22 million) is in a serious position on almost all fronts and will default on its foreign debt for the first time ever.
- 12. Where is the serious food insecurity problem right now Ethiopia (population 118 million), South Sudan (population 11 million), Southern Madagascar (population 28 million), and Yemen (population 31 million). A combined total of 188 million people.
- 13. The production of food is one issue, the distribution of food is another issue, the increase price of food is another issue, the payment for food is another issue again it can't all be simply aid.
- 14. An average UK family spends 10% of its household income on food in Pakistan and Kenya it is over 40% of its household income.
- 15. Conflict is the biggest driver of hunger, that is why Africa in the main will be shambles over the next 20 years.
- 16. Enormous amounts of aid money have not added much to Afghanistan and extreme sanctions have not had as much effect as was anticipated with Cuba, North Korea and Venezuela (a combined population across the four countries of around 106 million).
- 17. Since 2016 the Brazilian Amazon has become a net emitter of carbon dioxide quite a turning point for climate control.

Spicy Prawn Masala

INGREDIENTS

750 grams prawns, peeled and deveined (16 to 20 prawns)

1 teaspoon ground cumin

Sea salt

3 tablespoons olive oil

1 ½ teaspoons grated ginger

1 teaspoon grated garlic

1 tablespoon (or less) sambal oelek. (Chilli sauce)

¼ cup lime juice

1 teaspoon lime zest

3 tablespoons roughly chopped coriander

PREPARATION

In a large bowl, toss together the prawns and the cumin until well coated. Season with sea salt and toss again. Heat the olive oil in a wok or heavy pan over medium heat.

Add half the prawns to the pan in one layer and cook undisturbed until they just start turning pink, about 1 minute. Flip and cook for about 1 minute more, then remove from the pan and set aside. They may not be fully cooked at this time, and that's O.K. Repeat with remaining prawns and leave in the pan.

Add the reserved prawns back to the pan with any juices that have accumulated. Stir in the ginger, garlic and chilli, if using, and cook for about 30 seconds, stirring to make sure the garlic doesn't burn.

Add the lime juice to pan and scrape up any brown bits that have formed at the bottom of the pan. Cook until the mixture is reduced by about half, about 1 minute more. Stir in the lime zest and scatter with the cilantro. Season with flaky salt, if desired.

Combination Fried Rice

INGREDIENTS

4 tablespoons olive or vegetable oil

8 garlic cloves, minced or pressed

1 large carrot, peeled and diced small or cut in julienne

4 ounces tofu, patted dry and cut in 1/2-inch dice

4 eggs, beaten and seasoned with salt and pepper

5 cups cooked rice, preferably jasmine rice

2 to 3 tablespoons Thai or Vietnamese fish sauce (to taste)

2 to 3 teaspoons sambal oelek (Indonesian chilli sauce) (to taste)

1 tomato, chopped

1 bunch spring onions, both white and green parts, chopped FOR THE GARNISH

½ cup chopped coriander

Thinly sliced cucumber

Lime wedges

Spring onions

Fish sauce with hot chillies and kecap manis (sweet soy sauce)

PREPARATION

Heat a large wok or large, heavy nonstick skillet over medium-high heat until a drop of water evaporates on contact. Add the oil and swirl, then add the carrot and tofu. Stir-fry until lightly coloured, about two minutes. Add the garlic and stir-fry until golden, about 30 seconds. Pour in the beaten egg. Stir-fry until scrambled, then add the rice. Cook the rice — scooping it up and pressing it into the pan, then scooping it up again — for about two minutes. Add the fish, chilli sauces, tomato and chopped spring onions, then stir together for about a half-minute. Serve, garnishing each plate with the coriander and cucumbers and passing lime wedges, scallions and fish sauce with chillies. Diners should squeeze lime juice onto their rice as they eat.

Tip

Advance preparation: Cooked rice will keep for three or four days in the refrigerator. The dish is a last-minute stir-fry.

Feel free to add prawns or sliced pork to this recipe as well as, or instead of, the tofu





CONDITION OF HANMER SPRINGS

BY TELEGRAPH-PER PRESS ASSOCIATION. 1913-

HANMER SPRINGS, February 18.

Hon. R. Heaton Rhodes, Minister in Charge of Tourists and Health Resorts. paid his first visit as Minister to Hanmer, and received a deputation, which made a number of complaints regarding the condition of the pools and baths.

The Minister denied the allegations that the pools were dirty and insanitary, and stated that the water was discoloured owing to the old wooden pipes conveying the water from the springs to the pools leaking.

He said that the deputation alleged that the exports detailed by them were damaging to Hanmer, but the sanatorium had never been so full as it had been this year, and the takings showed an increase as compared with previous years.

The revenue in 1908-9 was £1,474; and the loss was £1,948. In 1909-10 the revenue was £1,434, and the loss £1,918; in 1910 £1565 and £1477, and the revenue for the current year up to February 1st was £1,761 a considerable improvement.

The figures for 1912-13 did not show that only a few people had availed themselves of Hanmer Springs as a health resort.

As a Canterbury man he was interested in Hanmer Springs, and it was his intention to do what he could for it as a health resort; but Hanmer Springs was not going to be spoon-fed nor was any health resort going to be spoon-fed, but Hanmer Springs would have its full share.



 - (f) Don't retire while you are still getting job satisfaction.
 - (g) Make every second cup of coffee yourself.
 - (h) Walk two kilometres a day.
 - (i) Think carefully about who you vote for.
 - (j) You need an emergency fund of probably \$2,500 per person.
 - (k) Pay the first \$2,000-\$3,000 of any medical event from personal drawings.
 - (l) A bit less travel and a bit more video.
 - (m) Work on living to 95 years.
 - (n) Reverse mortgages can have a place.
 - (o) One marriage is enough.
- In the USA the Government sometimes seconds (usually for a two year period) top performing people from the private sector to assist Government. This is a sound scheme and New Zealand needs to use it as it is a good move from the country's point of view to have the right person in the right place. 

Rural Lookout app a helping hand in crime reporting

The Reporting rural crime is easier now, after last month's successful pilot launch of the Police 'Rural Lookout' app.

Since its inception on May 4th, there have been more than 2100 community members download the App, and nearly 50 incidents reported.

Hurunui District's Mayor Marie Black is right behind the Rural Lookout initiative, and as a rural person herself she hugely values the purpose this app serves for rural property owners, workers and those on lifestyle blocks.

She is thrilled her District is part of the pilot programme, alongside Waimakariri District.

"How fortunate for rural residents of the Hurunui District to be part of the Police 'Rural Lookout' app, a fabulous tool to ensure reporting is easy for unlawful behaviours," she said.

She is confident the app will ensure communities can keep themselves safer, and have confidence they can get assistance from the police when it's needed.

"This two-year pilot programme will provide much needed information which is so valuable for police, to enable them to support rural crime prevention."

Senior Constable Tony Maw of Rangiora Police said the feedback from users has been great, comments including it was quick and easy to make a report, increased confidence to report occurrences that might not have otherwise been reported, and Police are doing well at following up app reports quickly.

Constable Maw said the most common reports have been about suspicious vehicles including anti-social driving such as 'boy racing,' damage to personal property, and

suspicious drone activity.

"If you see a vehicle you suspect is related to the unlawful drone activity, record the number plate and even take a photo."

He wanted to reiterate that the app is not for emergencies, and 111 is still the best option for anything that is happening now.

"While we are off to a good start, we really need the support of the rural community to download and use Rural Lookout, to ensure our success," said Constable Maw.
