COVID IN THE COMMUNITY UPDATE

**Hanmer Springs Health Centre,
Sunday 31st July 4.15pm**

We are pleased to report the number of newly recorded COVID-19 positive cases in the community over the last seven days has significantly dropped to around the same number as early June.

This is great news and let's continue to stay well this winter and help protect each other by:

- *Booking our COVID-19 2nd Booster* shots by calling/txting 020 4091 0704, if eligible. Next clinic Wednesday 3rd August.
- Getting up to date with our *vaccinations for flu, and measles*. Reminder – Tamariki aged 3-12yrs are eligible for a FREE flu vaccination.
- *Wearing a mask indoors* whenever we are not at home.
- *Staying home if we are unwell* and test for COVID-19 using a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) yourself or book an appointment with the Health Centre to be tested.
- Calling our reception team on 03 315 7503 if you have COVID-19 symptoms or feeling unwell.

If you **perform your own Rapid Antigen Test (RAT)** for COVID-19, you should **record your results, whether positive or negative**, on the same day by:

1. Going online and recording it at <https://my-covidrecord.nz>

OR

2. Calling **0800 222 478** and choose **option 3**

If you are **living with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19** you also **need to isolate** and have a **Rapid Antigen Test (RAT)** for COVID-19 on **days 3 and 7** of your isolation.

- ✓ Māori and Pacific Peoples older than 50
- ✓ People who are severely immunocompromised
- ✓ Health, aged-care and disability workers over the age of 30.

NOTE: A minimum of 6 months after your first booster must have passed before you can have the second. (or three months post Covid-19 infection whichever is the later date)

From 1 July free flu vaccinations will be extended to:

- Children aged 3-12 years
- People with serious mental health or addiction needs

Free flu shots are already available for a large group of people including:

- Over 65s
- Māori or Pasifika aged 55+
- Long list of underlying health conditions

Don't forget that if people are not sick, you can give COVID-19 vaccination to those eligible at the same time. **The Health Centre are also doing MMR vaccinations. Call us on 020 4091 0704 to book an appointment.**

If you call our clinic phone out of hours, your call is always answered by a registered nurse who will assess your needs, offer advice or, if required, pass the call to our on-call clinician. It can take several minutes to answer the phone so please be patient and hold, and follow the voice prompts carefully

School Welcomes New Principal

Last Monday Hanmer Springs School officially welcomed their new Principal and his whānau to the school and community with a Mihi Whakatau - a traditional Māori welcome that can be done off of a Marae in places like schools. John McBride and 11 members of his family were walked into the school grounds by Stacey Ingles, school mum, with a karanga, then received karakia, waiata, and haka from the students as well as speeches from Tiff Wafer (board chair), Mary Holloway (district councillor), and Marie Black (Hurunui Mayor), and a closing speech and karakia from school dad Dee Keepa. John spoke on behalf of his group and outlined his excitement to be here, as well as a few of his aspirations for the students - to be respectful community members who enjoy coming to school to learn and have fun. A big emphasis was placed on the importance of learning, and creating a positive school culture from student to teacher to family and community.

John has over 15 years as an educator and holds three degrees in education, the highest being a Masters in Educational Leadership. He has experience both here in Aotearoa as well as overseas. His most recent post was in Panama, Central America where he was coaching other teachers to improve their practice. This is his first principalship and he would like to thank all of the various school contacts within the village who have already offered their support to both him in his new role and his family in their new surroundings! He has moved to the Village with his lovely wife Astrid and one year old son, EJ.

Kung Pao Prawns

INGREDIENTS

500 grams peeled and deveined medium prawns, thawed if frozen
 2 tablespoons Shaoxing wine or dry sherry
 2 teaspoons cornstarch
 Salt
 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
 3 tablespoons soy sauce
 2 tablespoons Chinkiang (black) vinegar or balsamic vinegar
 ½ teaspoon Sichuan peppercorns, coarsely ground, plus more to taste
 1 red or orange bell pepper
 5 garlic cloves
 ¼ cup neutral oil, such as grapeseed
 ½ cup unsalted roasted peanuts
 ¾ cup small dried red chillies (23 grams; see Tip)
 3 large scallions, cut into 1/2-inch lengths

PREPARATION

Mix the prawns, Shaoxing wine, 1 teaspoon cornstarch and a pinch of salt in a bowl until the prawns are evenly coated. Let stand while you prepare the other ingredients.

Stir the sugar, soy sauce, vinegar, Sichuan pepper and remaining teaspoon cornstarch in a separate bowl. Dice the bell pepper and thinly slice the garlic. Have all your ingredients ready next to the stove.

Heat the oil in a wok or large skillet over medium-high heat for 15 seconds. Add the peanuts and stir until browned in spots, 30 to 60 seconds. Add the bell pepper and garlic, and sprinkle with salt. Cook, stirring, until the pepper is bright and the garlic starts to become translucent, about 30 seconds. Add the chillies and stir well, then add the prawns with the marinade. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the prawns are curled and just opaque, 2 to 3 minutes.

Add the scallions and stir until glossy, about 15 seconds, then add the sauce. Cook, stirring, until the sauce thickens and coats everything evenly, about 1 minute. If any of the starchy sauce has stuck to the bottom of the pan, add a splash of water and scrape up any browned bits. Taste and add more Sichuan pepper if you'd like.

Immediately transfer to a dish and serve hot.

Tip - The small dried red chiles typically used in kung pao dishes are available in Chinese markets. Any small dried red chillies work, though they do range in heat and texture. For a similar spice level, I use sambal oelek or fresh chillies.

Winter Vegetable Curry

INGREDIENTS

3 tablespoons vegetable oil
 1 teaspoon cumin seeds
 1 teaspoon coriander seeds
 1 teaspoon turmeric
 ¼ teaspoon cayenne
 1 2-inch piece of ginger, grated
 6 small garlic cloves, minced
 4 small hot red Asian chillies (or use sambal oelek)
 1 large onion, diced, about 2 cups
 Salt and pepper
 2 tablespoons tomato paste
 2 cups courgette, unpeeled, in 3cm slices, or butternut squash, peeled, in 3cm cubes
 1 cup parsnips, hard centre core removed, in 3 cm slices or chunks
 250 grams tiny potatoes,
 2 cups small florets of cauliflower
 1 cup cooked chickpeas, preferably home-cooked and the liquid reserved
 Coriander sprigs, for garnish
 Steamed basmati rice (optional)

PREPARATION

Put oil in a wide, heavy pot over medium-high heat. When oil is hot, add cumin seeds and coriander seeds and let sizzle for about 1 minute. Add turmeric, cayenne, ginger, garlic and chillies and stir to coat.

Add onion and season generously with salt and pepper.

Cook, stirring, until softened and lightly coloured, about 10 minutes. Add tomato paste and stir to coat. Add squash, parsnips and potatoes, salt lightly, then add 3 cups chickpea cooking liquid or veg stock or water, or enough to just cover vegetables. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to maintain a brisk simmer. Cover and cook until vegetables are tender but firm, about 15 minutes.

Add cauliflower and chickpeas and stir gently to combine.

Cover and continue cooking 5 to 8 minutes more, until cauliflower is tender. Taste broth and adjust seasoning, then transfer to a wide, deep serving platter or bowl.

Garnish with cilantro sprigs. Serve with steamed basmati rice



Hanmer's State of the Art Camera System



If you were considered the idea of a life of crime in Hanmer Springs, let us give you a heads up - don't bother, we've got you covered

One day last week the Pinkie spent a couple of hours in the police station being guided by Constable Dave Felstead through the amazingly complex and up-to-the-minute camera system that is operating in the Hanmer valley. About ten or twelve years ago when we last looked into the system there were three or four cameras which didn't always function as they should. As an example the camera mounted opposite Harcourts was supposed to pan the main street but sadly was not always panning in the right direction, witnessed by the fact that a burglary of furniture from Jollie Jacks happened while the camera was stuck pointing up Conical Hill Road. This is certainly not the case today, with a system of some 24 cameras which cover not only downtown Hanmer Springs but other vital areas such as the turnoff into Clarence Valley Road, the Ferry Bridge and Lewis Pass turnoff.

As Dave quickly explained to us, this is definitely not a case of big brother watching over the populace, there is not somebody sitting in front of a bank of screens checking up on us all. Rather it is a tool to check movements around, and in and out of the village of suspect people or vehicles which all been recorded and is available for following their movements. As an example he quoted the incidences of the theft of the pounamu from the Pools and the desecration of the Thomas Hanmer statue. In the case of the pounamu the Pools own camera system was able to see a man taking an unusual interest in the piece of greenstone and then its subsequent theft. Once away from the Pools the community camera system kicked in and the thief was not only traced leaving the village but the numberplate recognition system was able to lead to the perpetrator and ensure the immediate return of the pools' icon. Dave stressed that it was not a case of having to sit down and watch hours of footage in the hope something will show. To demonstrate this, he told us he had crossed the Ferry Bridge that morning so to substantiate the system's capabilities he fed the licence number of the vehicle into the computer and within two seconds the screen showed a photograph of the vehicle crossing the bridge on the way out and on its return and the times this had occurred.

The system has already proven itself time and again and he gave us some great examples of major incidences of theft and other criminal activities that had been thwarted by the use of the cameras and some excellent police

deduction. Sadly, we can't elaborate on too much of this because it is still in the judicial system, but as an example, a suspected crime had been committed in Clarence Valley Road and the camera gave the time the alleged offender had turned into the road and the time he had returned, thus giving the police a window of time (and thus parameters of distance travelled) narrowing down a search area to the point where the offence was able to be solved with a little extra legwork.

It is more than obvious that our local police are very proud of the system and it is highly beneficial in the many hours that the cameras save and the crimes it helps solve. We commented that it is unlikely any other town of this size in New Zealand would have a system of this competence and cost effective productivity.

The existence of the system is down to a combination of factors. Both the Community Board and the Hanmer Springs Business Association had the original input, but systems of this nature are very costly, so along with considerable input from the Hanmer Springs Community Trust and the Mainland Foundation, funds were raised to cover the expense. A big thanks goes out also to the Hanmer business community who donated a lot of the necessary dollars. One of the influencing factors in the introduction and installation of the system have been the services of a retired policeman who has been instrumental in procuring and installing of equipment at close to cost price. The only reason we've been able to get so many cameras around the district in so many places, is also because of the generosity of Chris Roberts at Amurinet. Chris has donated a significant amount of equipment, time and ongoing data for nearly all of our more remote sites to operate. (Just another great community member doing great things.)

And while we sometimes may consider ourselves vulnerable for only having one entry and exit point in the Ferry Bridge, when it comes to police work, it is of great assistance.

So, on behalf of the people of Hanmer we thank everyone involved in the implementation of this system, with a special thank you to Dave Felstead and Tim Shearer, our hard-working and dedicated local police team.
