COVID IN THE COMMUNITY UPDATE

Hanmer Springs Health Centre, Sunday 17th July 11am

As expected, the number of newly reported COVID-19 positive cases in the community is slightly higher than last week. We are also seeing some re-infection cases in our community.

Stay well this winter and help protect each other by:

- Booking our COVID-19 2nd Booster shots by calling/txting 020 4091 0704, if eligible.
- Getting up to date with our vaccinations for flu, and measles.
 Reminder –Tamariki aged 3-12yrs are eligible for a FREE flu vaccination.
- Wearing a mask indoors whenever we are not at home.
- <u>Staying home if we are unwell</u> and test for COVID-19 using a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) yourself or book an appointment with the Health Centre to be tested.
- Calling our reception team on 03 315 7503 if you have COVID-19 symptoms or feeling unwell.

If you **perform your own Rapid Antigen Test** (RAT) for COVID-19, you should **record your results**, **whether positive or negative**, on the same day by:

1. Going online and recording it at https://mycovidrecord.nz

OR

Calling 0800 222 478 and choose option 3

If you are living with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 you also need to isolate and have a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) for COVID-19 on days 3 and 7 of your isolation.

We record also the passing of Rex ANDERSON until recently a resident of Hanmer Springs. Rex and his wife of 56 years, Leonie moved to Hanmer after the Christchurch earthquake, but Rex's association with the town went back much further. He had lived here as a child when his father was the village butcher and he always had a great love for Hanmer.

His son-in-law Reece Gardner wrote us a note about Rex's passing,

"My father-in-law, Rex Anderson, passed away on 11 July 2022. He was 80 years old. Rex was a top man. I was blessed to call him my father-in-law, the grandfather of Jem & Hope, and he was also my dear friend. We did heaps together, both as a family, but also just the two of us. We picnicked, we camped, we had family dinners, we walked, we got stuck in mud (and walked some more), we cut firewood, we trimmed hedges, we mowed lawns, we played golf, we sang, we watched sport and we also spent many many hours fishing together. We both loved "over the back" from Hanmer Springs – the Rainbow and the Molesworth. We loved that country! He often told me he would happily die over there, fishing, and he told me that if I ever found him, "Reece, just dig a shallow grave and roll me in – I'd be very very happy".

"The funeral on Friday was a beautiful send off to an awesome man. I was so proud of Jem and Hope and their contribution to the service. The other grandchildren were awesome too. Our dear friend, Sarah Gardiner (Hanmer Springs), was the celebrant. She taught Jem and Hope at Hanmer Springs Primary School and was also a lay-minister at the Anglican Church we attended."

Lamb rice pilaf with nuts and yoghurt

A little Moroccan, a little Turkish, a little Lebanese, and a lot hearty, delicious and filling.

Ingredients

2 tbsp olive oil

1 onion, halved and finely sliced

300g minced lamb

1 tsp ground cinnamon

1 tsp ground ginger

1 tsp ground allspice

pinch of dried chilli

sea salt and pepper

200g basmati rice, rinsed

100g sultanas or raisins

2 tbsp tomato paste

400ml water

100g mixed walnuts, pistachios and pine nuts

2 tbsp finely chopped dill, plus 1 tbsp sprigs

150g natural yoghurt

Method

Heat oil in a deep saucepan and cook onion until golden. Add minced lamb, cinnamon, ginger, allspice and chilli and cook until lamb changes colour, about four minutes. Drain off any excess oil. Season lamb generously with sea salt and pepper. Add rice, sultanas, tomato paste and water to the pot and bring to the boil, stirring.

Cover tightly and simmer on the lowest heat for 18 minutes.

Turn off the heat and leave for 10 minutes.

Toast the nuts in a dry frypan. Mix chopped dill into the yoghurt.

Fluff the rice pilaf with a fork and serve on warm plates, topped with dill yoghurt, dill sprigs and nuts.

Poule au Pot

This simple poached chicken with vegetables is a whole meal in one pot. Just serve it with French bread, butter and mustard.

Ingredients

4 chicken Marylands

2 bay leaves

few sprigs of thyme

few sprigs of parsley

4 medium potatoes, peeled and halved

1 onion, peeled and quartered

4 carrots, peeled and cut into 5cm lengths

2 sticks celery, halved

1/4 cabbage, cut into wedges

1 tsp salt

1 litre salt-reduced chicken stock

1/4 cup white wine

1 loaf French bread, to serve

butter, to serve

Dijon mustard, to serve

Method

- 1. Cut between the thighs and drumsticks to separate each Maryland into two pieces. Wrap the herbs in muslin and tie into a bundle. Place the chicken, potatoes, onion, carrots, celery and cabbage in separate areas of a heavy-based pot. Pour over 1 litre of boiling water, add the salt, chicken stock, white wine and herbs. Cook at a very low simmer for 45 minutes, skimming off any scum that rises to the surface in the first 10 minutes or so.
- 2. Check that the vegetables are softened to your liking, then taste the liquid and adjust seasoning. Serve the chicken, vegetables and broth with buttered bread and Dijon mustard.





The Mask of Indifference

The state of general apathy over masks seems to be a major symptom of 'Covid Fatigue'. Most of us seem reluctant to admit that we cannot return to the freedoms we once had. A quick survey of Hanmer with the influx of visitors shows that that a large proportion of people in retail premises are not bothering to mask up In fact the biggest proportion of mask wearers seem to be in the over 60 age group, probably because they are the demographic with the most to lose from a dose of Covid. Some shops have signs at the door demanding mask wearing as a condition of entry, others do not. In reality you can hardly expect a business like the supermarket to try to enforce a mask rule when all their customers are flagrantly doing their best to disregard it. (Your correspondent has been openly chided by other customers for wearing a mask.)

All of this prompted us to check exactly what the current regulations are as there appears to be a great deal of ignorance and confusion and apathy over the regulations which we are expected to follow.

Regulations state that you are *encouraged* to wear a mask whenever you leave the house. You are **obliged** to wear a mask when:

- *On public transport including taxis and share ride vehicles
- *On domestic flights
- *In public venues such as libraries and museums (but not swimming pools)
- *When visiting health care services or aged care facilities
- *At vet clinics
- *Inside any retail business for example supermarkets, pharmacies, petrol stations and take-away food outlets.
- *At premises operated by local and central government and the police
- *In premises operated by NZ Post


There are more situations that we haven't listed but that is the backbone of what we are expected to do. Maybe we should leave the last word to Ashley Bloomfield

"I am confident people will listen and follow through on this message. We have seen that New Zealand's successful response to the pandemic to today has relied on people doing the right thing.

"There was no way we could police our way through a lockdown - we relied on people, and they did it. Our message here today is, it's important people - again – recommit. We are not through this yet."

I wish I could share his confidence, because as a member of the older and more vulnerable generation I can't help the feeling that the prevailing attitude among the younger age group is along the lines that, if we catch we get over it quickly and we are quite prepared to sacrifice the geriatrics in order to pretend we can go back to living the life we want to lead.

And by the way, with increased numbers of non mask-wearers in town this week - surprise, surprise, the Health Centre reports increased case numbers, including re-infection.



Where is New Zealand Heading

A Few Thoughts, Comments and Suggestions

- 1. New Zealand household budgets are having to tighten up there is simply less discretionary cash for spending.
- 2. For how long probably 12 months maybe 18 months
- 3. Our exports are holding up well so far.
- 4. Our employment rate is also holding up well.
- 5. Getting the DVD/watching YouTube will be a lot cheaper than travelling.
- 6. Single income families will be under major financial pressure.
- 7. There is nothing wrong with a Student Loan for \$20,000-\$30,000 to keep your children's education plan on target our New Zealand children must develop skills.
- 8. The move of many young New Zealand men and women to Australia over the next 6-12 months must be expected the numbers will be significant and could easily be 50,000 or more.
- 9. New Zealand house prices since 1 January 2022 have dropped by 4.9%.
- Forward thinking New Zealanders normally think long term but a shorter term for the next 12 months would be smarter.
- 11. Without agriculture and tourism, New Zealand is really in the third world group many New Zealand people just don't grasp this key issue.
- 12. The sanctions against Russia are starting to look as though they may not be enough North Korea, Iran and Cuba are all examples which are surviving after 10-15 years or longer.
- 13. The members of the European Union (28) and the total EU countries (44) are starting to fray a little with their long term commitment to Ukraine.
- 14. If Russia completely cuts off oil and gas to Europe then Europe will revert to coal in part, but politically it will bring about major problems. Europe is much too dependent upon Russia for energy.
- 15. Will the current financial pressure on New Zealand households turn yes, but some things like wages, energy costs, rates, interest and fuel will not go back down to the old costs.
- 16. Accept financial help from the two sets of grand-parents if it's offered square this up later.

- 17. The Christchurch City Council need higher power support on the stadium the real issue though with the stadium, almost regardless of how it is financed, is who is going to pick up and cover the almost certain lifetime of annual cash losses.
- 18. New Zealand is short of teachers, nurses, hospitality workers, aged care workers and almost all businesses that have a significant seasonal work cycle. It is hard to see this issue fixing itself many New Zealand people deep down just do not actually want to work anything approaching a 40 week New Zealand needs immigrants to get the economy working at an efficient level.
- 19. New Zealand has always tended to go over the top and down the bottom re demand and supply cycles. Right now we have moved from around 20,000 housing consents 10 years ago up to close to 50,000 now within perhaps 12-18 months this cycle may go the other way. There are 630,000 New Zealand families at present who are renting a large proportion of this number will never purchase their own home our politicians do not want to take this comment on board because it is unpalpable but reality often is.
- 20. There will be more liquidation of builders and hospitality businesses over the next 9-12 months this will be unavoidable simply because they are on the wrong side of our business demand and supply cycle.
- 21. In New Zealand it looks as though we will all go through a down cycle for the next 12-18 months, but the smart money may start moving in 9-12 months. But many parts of Africa (54 very different countries) are going to go through hell and back we will read about this over the next 24 months.
- 22. The undeveloped countries of the world have got no financial room to move on anything but food at best the developed countries also have their hands full with conflicts, floods, fires, energy and never-ending political issues. The point being, that substantial financial funds to help cope with climate control is just not available or foreseeable over the next five years or so and maybe longer.


