# COVID IN THE COMMUNITY UPDATE Hanmer Springs Health Centre,

Sunday 24th July 4.15pm

The number of newly reported COVID-19 positive cases in the community over the last seven days is similar to the previous week, including some re-infection cases.

Stay well this winter and help protect each other by:

- *Booking our COVID-19 2<sup>nd</sup>* Booster shots by calling/ txting 020 4091 0704, if eligible.
- Getting up to date with our *vaccinations for flu, and measles.* Reminder –Tamariki aged 3-12yrs are eligible for a FREE flu vaccination.
- <u>Wearing a mask indoors</u> whenever we are not at home.
- <u>Staying home if we are unwell</u> and test for COVID-19 using a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) yourself or book an appointment with the Health Centre to be tested.
- Calling our reception team on 03 315 7503 if you have COVID-19 symptoms or feeling unwell.

If you **perform your own Rapid Antigen Test** (RAT) for COVID-19, you should **record your results**, **whether positive or negative**, on the same day by:

1. Going online and recording it at <u>https://my-covidrecord.nz</u>

OR

2. Calling 0800 222 478 and choose option 3

If you are **living with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19** you also **need to isolate** and have a **Rapid Antigen Test** (RAT) for COVID-19 on **days 3 and 7** of your isolation.

# A Couple of years at Council School!

It has been an extraordinary honour to have been a West Ward representative on the Hurunui District Council. Not something I had planned... but there was a gap and I jumped into it. However, another worthy Candidate has now put his hand up, and there may be others, so I will step aside from the role this election.

The West Ward, a massive block of land that extends from Waikari to Hawarden, Mt Lyford to Boyle Village, Hanmer Springs, and everything in between is represented also by three other dedicated and hard- working people: Karen Armstrong, Ross Barnes and Nicky Anderson.

It is always a balancing act between personal life and Council business. I have nothing but admiration for those who have been long-term members of the Council and I have to say that our current Mayor, Marie Black has a massive workload and I believe is doing a sterling job of representing the Hurunui on the plethora of organisations that she must attend, not the least of which is C4LD, (Communities for Local Democracy), an organisation made up of many Councils just like ours, which is attempting to sway the Govt towards a fairer , more democratic and more workable solution to 3 Waters Reform.

Councillors often hear "the Council should do this or the Council should do that". Councillors are always aware that there is only YOUR money, RATE PAYER hard earned money. That's why decisions are made carefully sometimes very slowly!

The majority of our rate payers are farmers, in fact 80 %. Most of them only get an annual road grader visit for their big rates bill!

I also have admiration for the team of Planners, Administrators, Service workers, Youth workers, Librarians etc who all work for us under the leadership of the Chief Executive and his Senior leadership Team. Their workload is always demanding.

So, with all that I have learned over the last two years, I do intend to stand again for the Hanmer Springs Community Board, to use this knowledge for the betterment of our Village.

# Mulled Wine

With a fragrance, the aroma of red wine simmering on the stove with citrus and spices (and a little brandy for a bit more zing). Choose a red wine that isn't bone-dry—a little fruitiness is just fine here, try one of the more aromatic like a Gewurtztraminer

### INGREDIENTS

2 large oranges

- 4 1/4 cups red wine
- 1 ¼ cups brandy
- 1/2 cup dark brown sugar
- 2 cinnamon sticks
- 6 whole cloves

3 cardamom pods, slightly crushed

### PREPARATION

Using a peeler, remove the peel in strips from 1 orange, then juice the orange.

Slice the other orange into rounds and reserve for garnish. In a nonreactive saucepan, combine orange peel, juice and the rest of the ingredients. Stir over medium heat until the sugar dissolves, about 2 minutes.

Increase the heat to high, bring mixture to a boil, then immediately reduce the heat to low. Simmer

gently until flavours meld, about 30 minutes. Strain the mixture, discarding the solids. Contrary to popular belief,'cooking' the wine won't rid it of all the alcohol, but if you are a bit more dedicated to an alcoholic kick, I would suggest adding the brandy at the end of the process. It will certainly give it a kick Ladle into cups or mugs. Garnish each with a reserved orange round.



# Modern Hot Toddy

### INGREDIENTS

 teaspoon (or 1 individual bag) strong black looseleaf tea, such as English breakfast
 to 2 teaspoons brown sugar
 30ml medium-bodied rum, preferably gold
 20ml Campari
 15m fresh lemon juice
 Lemon slice, to finish
 PREPARATION
 Bring a kettle of water to a boil. Fill a 180ml heatproof

Bring a kettle of water to a boil. Fill a 180ml heatproof mug or glass with boiling water and set aside, 1 minute. Pour out the water, then add a tea bag or strainer and sugar to the warmed glass. Top with 120ml boiling water.

As the tea steeps, set another small heatproof mug or glass in a small saucepan or baking dish. Pour more boiling water around it, so the water comes halfway up the sides. Add the rum and campari to the mug, and allow to sit and warm through.

Once the tea has steeped for 3 to 5 minutes, remove the tea bag or strainer, add the now-warmed rum and amaro mixture, stirring to ensure the sugar is dissolved. Stir in the lemon juice and finish with a lemon slice. Serve immediately.

## Know your Plastic Codes as In Hurunui 1, 2 and 5 ONLY can be Recycled

Symbol	Acronym	Full name and uses	
A	PET	Polyethylene terephthalate - Fizzy drink bottles and frozen ready meal packages.	
23	HDPE	High-density polyethylene - Milk and washing-up liquid bottles	
හ	PVC	Polyvinyl chloride - Food trays, cling film, bottles for squash, mineral water and shampoo.	
A	LDPE	Low density polyethylene - Carrier bags and bin liners.	
ES)	PP	Polypropylene - Margarine tubs, microwave- able meal trays.	
B	PS	Polystyrene - Yoghurt pots, foam meat or fish trays, hamburger boxes and egg cartons, vending cups, plastic cutlery, protective packaging for electronic goods and toys.

Out of hours recycling facilities for paper, card, cans, plastics types 1, 2 & 5 only and glass bottles are provided; please ensure recycling is clean, loose and all lids are removed. Soft plastics (i.e. those you can scrunch in your hand) are not recyclable and must be placed in the refuse.

Kerbside refuse and recycling collection – Monday 8am

Only official refuse and recycling bags will be collected; these can be purchased from Hanmer Springs Service Station and the library.

Via the recycling bags clean paper, card, cans and plastics types 1, 2 & 5 only can be recycled.

If in doubt – place it in the refuse to save contaminating recycling.

Non complying bags and recycling bags containing glass and soft plastics will not be collected.

Please Note that HDC garbage & recycling bags are no longer available from the Four Square supermarket . Henceforth, bags will only be available from Hanmer Springs Service Station, the library, The Log Cabin and Super Liquor
