COVID IN THE COMMUNITY UPDATE

Hanmer Springs Health Centre, Sunday 21st August Covid numbers in the past week were down to as low as they were the first week Covid was detected in Hanmer. With that in mind, unless there is a marked difference, this will be the last week of Pinkie updates.

Let's continue to stay well this winter and help protect each other by:

- Booking our COVID-19 2nd Booster shots and/or our tamariki for their 1st/2nd COVID-19 vaccination by calling/txting 020 4091 0704. Next clinic Wednesday 10th August.
- Getting up to date with our vaccinations for flu, and measles. Reminder –Tamariki aged 3-12yrs are eligible for a FREE flu vaccination.
- <u>Wearing a mask indoors</u> whenever we are not at home.
- <u>Staying home if we are unwell</u> and test for COVID-19 using a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) yourself or book an appointment with the Health Centre to be tested.
- Calling our reception team on 03 315 7503 if you have COVID-19 symptoms or feeling unwell.

If you **perform your own Rapid Antigen Test** (RAT) for COVID-19, you should **record your results**, **whether positive or negative**, on the same day by:

1. Going online and recording it at https://mycovidrecord.nz

OR

2. Calling 0800 222 478 and choose option 3

If you are **living with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19** you also **need to isolate** and have a **Rapid Antigen Test** (RAT) for COVID-19 on **days 3 and 7** of your isolation.

Make Your Own Baked Beans

INGREDIENTS

2 cups navy beans

Salt

¹/₂ pound slab bacon, cut into cubes

1 medium onion, peeled and chopped

¹∕₃ cup molasses

2 teaspoons dry mustard

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

PREPARATION

Soak beans in a large bowl of water for 6 hours or overnight. Drain beans and put them in a large oven-safe pot with a heavy bottom and a tightfitting lid. Add 1 teaspoon salt and enough cool water to cover 2 inches above the beans. Bring to a boil, then lower the heat and simmer gently, stirring occasionally, until the beans are just tender, approximately 30 to 40 minutes. Drain and remove beans.

Heat the oven to 250 degrees. Bring a kettle full of water to a boil on the stove. Return the heavy-bottomed pot to the stove and turn the heat to medium high. Cook the bacon in the bottom of the pot until it begins to brown, then turn off the heat and add the chopped onion and, on top of it, the beans. Mix together molasses, mustard and black pepper, and add the mixture to the pot. Pour in enough boiling water to cover beans, put the lid on and bake, occasionally adding more water to keep beans covered, until they are tender but not falling apart, 4 to 5 hours. Remove beans from oven, uncover, stir and season with salt. With the lid off, return pot to oven and let beans finish cooking, uncovered and without additional water, until the sauce has thickened and the top is deeply crusty, about 45 minutes more.

(Or to cheat: Canned white beans make fantastic baked beans in about an hour. If you use them, you'll need four 400 gram cans. Drain and then follow the directions from para 2 on to the end. Please understand that you'll need much less water and much less time to get them where you want them to be.

Blond Puttanesca (Linguine With Tuna, Rocket and Capers)

Garlic, anchovies, capers and tuna come together in this briny, tomato-less take on the classic pasta puttanesca. The sauce is prepared while the pasta cooks, so you can get dinner on the table in no time INGREDIENTS

salt

350 grams linguine

3 tablespoons olive oil

3 garlic cloves, thinly sliced

1/2 teaspoon red-pepper flakes, plus more for serving if desired

10 anchovies, roughly chopped

3 tablespoons capers, rinsed well if salt-packed

100 grams baby rocket or other young greens, such as pea shoots

1 (6-ounce) jar oil-packed Italian tuna, drained and flaked ¼ cup chopped Italian parsley, plus more for serving if desired

Black pepper

Flaky salt, for serving (optional)

Lemon wedges, for serving (optional) PREPARATION

Bring a large pot of well-salted water to a boil. Add pasta and cook until it is just under al dente, about 7 minutes. Drain, reserving 1 1/2 cups of the pasta cooking water.

While pasta cooks, make the sauce: Heat olive oil in a large skillet over medium-low heat. Add garlic and red-pepper flakes and cook until garlic is pale golden, about 1 minute. Add anchovies and capers and cook until anchovies have melted and capers begin to brown slightly, about 1 to 2 minutes.

Turn heat to medium. Ladle a 1/2 cup of reserved pasta water into the skillet and bring mixture to a simmer. Cook until mixture is reduced by about half, about 2 to 3 minutes. Add in arugula and ladle in an additional 1/2 cup of pasta water, tossing together until wilted. Increase heat to medium-high and scoop pasta directly in to the skillet tossing with sauce until well coated. Add tuna to pasta and toss again until it is just warmed just through, about 1 minute. Ladle in an additional 1/4 cup pasta water or more, to loosen up sauce and toss again. Sprinkle parsley over pasta and toss again. Season with salt and pepper.

Serve in bowls, with flaky salt, a squeeze of lemon, additional parsley and red-pepper flakes, if desired.



Tom Davies Councillor Elect

Since the exclusive Hanmer Springs Councillor seat at the Hurunui Council table was abolished and we became a part of the West Ward we have been fortunate that we have had a Councillor from Hanmer Springs elected as a West Ward Councillor, firstly with Jason Fletcher and then with Mary Holloway. The next term will be no exception with Tom Davies having been elected to represent us.

Tom steps into these shoes, but he is already very much involved with the local community as a Civil Defence member, a trustee of the Forest Camp, a member of the Mountain Bike Club committee, a trail Town trustee and as an advocate for Beautiful Hurunui.

Tom and Lorna, his wife of 36 years have owned a house in Hanmer for about six years and moved here permanently almost two years ago. The couple have three children all of whom live and work in New Zealand.

Tom taught mathematics in Christchurch for 17 years and currently shares his teaching skills with the Hanmer Springs School on a part time basis. He is an Educational Consultant and honorary Professor of Mathematics at Hangzhou Normal university in China. He loves Hanmer for its biking and walking and he enjoys swimming. He has also been involved with Amuri Players, for whom he has stage managed, and has done the same for the school's production of 'Madagascar'.

The Pinkie had a chat with Tom last week and asked him what he sees as his role representing us at the Council table.

As the town grows, he said, he would like to see more facilities with attention to infrastructure being critical.

From a tourism point of view he would like to see us doing more to develop our resources wth cycling and walking trails and diversification of what we offer visitors to our town. To this end he sees it as important that we have a broadening of our horizons reflected in the Council's Long Term Plan.

He feels that it is very important that we are not left behind when it comes to catering for the tourist dollar and he cited as an example some of the incredible work being done in Central Otago with towns like Cromwell putting together some incredible trail experiences that attract thousands of people of a weekend as well as starting festivals like their new ebike project. He sees having the inclusion of forward thinking and funding in this area as critical to our future.

One of the other things Tom said he would love to see would be a morning bus to Christchurch in order for people to go to Christchurch for the day for medical appointments and shopping. He would love to see more car-pooling available, especially for older residents who need to get to Christchurch for medical appointments. There are an increasing number of people who see Hanmer Springs as a place to retire and will be imperative that infrastructure will include accommodating these people's needs.

Tom is very keen on the arts especially painting and sculpture. He was active in organising the Rustic Cafe mural and is very keen on more murals to enhance the town. A movie theatre would be great for locals and visitors alike. Perhaps too, locals could be encouraged to display sculptures and art in their gardens, properties and businesses to create art tours and trails.

He is very much looking forward to being a Councillor who will help and motivate our need to diversify and to push for an improvement in our community facilities.

Hanmer Events to Resume with December Marathon

After a hiatus of what seems an age, special events will begin again with the Hanmer Holiday Homes Alpine Marathon and associated events this coming December

Fusion Events which has been organising and running Hanmer events for the previous to or three years advised the Hanmer Springs Community Trust in May that they would no longer be involved in Hanmer events and wished to concentrate on their own events.

Subsequently the Trust advertised for a person or organisation to take over management of events and Kerry Higgs of the Community Trust told us that they were delighted with the quality of those who applied.

As a result of meetings and interviews, Simon Carter has been appointed to take over starting with the Alpine Marathon this December. (This will be with the forest course and not running from Lake Tennyson)

It was decided that Hanmer Events will, in the meantime, concentrate on three events The Alpine Marathon the Four Square Half Marathon and the Isobel Classic, along with the other events generally associated with these days, for example the 10K fun run that is run alongside the Half Marathon.

Resumption of other events will be looked at in the future, primarily the Tombstone and 4 & 8 Hour events.

Simon Carter of Carter Consultants has already made a start on our first event which will be the H.H.H Alpine Marathon on the 3rd of December.

Simon is no stranger to Hanmer as he and his company have already staged events in Hanmer, notably last year's 'Bandquet'.

These events are a boost to the town's economy, both in terms of accommodation booked and the average spend in pubs, restaurants and retail shops.

Simple surveys in the past have demonstrated that events like the Half Marathon and the annual MotoFest which we hope to see back in the Domain next year, can provide an injection of

more than a.million dollars into the local economy.

The NZ Statistics Department has recently advised that the 2021 year survey shows that the median net worth of NZ households is \$397,000 - an increase of 21% since the 2018 survey and 39% higher than the 2015 survey - median meaning half are above \$397,000 and half are below \$397,000 (the survey covered 4,400 NZ households). The total NZ households at the present time are around 1,880,000.

- 3. The median net worth of the wealthiest 20% of NZ households increased to \$2,002,000 this figure includes houses, investments, real estate, retirement savings, shares less all loans, mortgages, students loans and credit card debt.
- 4. The wealthiest 20% hold 69% of total NZ household net worth, which is uneven, but NZ is approximately in the middle of developed countries regarding this ratio.
- 5. Around 64.5% of NZ householders (1,212,000) own their own home with around 32% (602,000) renting and around 3.5% (66,000) living in dwellings that are rent free.
- 6. Some of this data is changing every day, but as at March 2022 the average NZ borrower had a mortgage of \$401,601, with the first-home buyer's average debt being \$568,720.
- 7. NZ overall household debt increased by 29% in 2021 compared with 2018.
- 8. It is interesting that only 32% of people owing a house have a mortgage secured over their primary residence.
- 9. What is the present average NZ total household debt outside of a house mortgage around \$23,000.
- 10. In a recent NZ survey, 40% of participants said they would be unable to access \$5,000 in the event of an emergency.
- 11. It looks as though NZ employers are going to have to rethink some of their employment structures in that the number and quality of employees as in the past is just not going to be available - this is not going to be easy to fix, but it is a real issue. Immigrants are only a part of the answer.
- 12. NZ house rents are stable, or falling in some localities. In many rural regions though there is a major shortage of accommodation for employees Hanmer Springs is very much in this group.
- 13. The present NZ inflation rate is 7.3%, UK is 9.4%, USA is 9.1%, Australia is 6.1%, Russia is 19.2%, Germany is 7.6%, Japan is 2.4% and Switzerland is 3.4% all data is for June 2022.
- 14. A 2021 USA Federal Reserve article advised that the average net worth of an American household was US\$748,000. If the conversion of US\$ to NZ\$ is relevant, then the comparative figure in NZ dollars would be

1,204,280 (on the basis that one American dollar is presently worth NZ\$1.61).

- 15. Don't be too greedy some 9-12 months ago our NZ banking industry offered a five-year fixed loan at 2.99% it was not the lowest rate on offer at the time but not enough borrowers took up this structure you don't need to get the bottom price on things getting in at the lower level for a five year fixed period is good business.
- 1. One marriage is enough; a further marriage can have an enormous effect emotionally and financially what are the effects the writers see:
 - (a) A loss of at least 5-7 years of financial progress.
 - (b) Another house is required.
 - (c) One or both parties have to start again.
 - (d) The children almost invariably suffer for a period.
 - (e) Both parties may have to work 5 years longer beyond 65 years.
 - (f) There is a good chance that one of the parties will not own a house ever again.
 - (g) NZ wide, the number of marriages that fail is around 1 in 5-6. In agriculture this figure is not quite as bad but the ods are still bad - get this right the first time.
 - (h) Peace of mind.
- 17. The average US farming family has an overall debt of around 14% of their gross assets at the present time the figure has been slowing rising the comparable NZ figure would probably be 17%-20%.
- The average house price in June 2022 in the USA was \$416,000 (US\$) this would convert to \$669,760 in NZ dollars.
- Italy has had a recent collapse of its coalition government. Italy has been a democratic republic since 1946, since then it has had 59 prime ministers, 12 presidents and 69 governments around one government change every 13 months. Italy is the third largest economy in Europe, its population is 60 million and it is probably too big to bail out in financial terms.
- 20. Why is the present US dollar such a strong currency?
 - A weak starting point a few years ago.
 - Increasing interest rates.
 - The USA has always been considered a safe financial haven in a financial downturn.
- 21. Why is Sri Lanka in turmoil (population 22 million):
 - External shocks have absorbed all of its financial reserves.
 - Financially incompetent leadership.
 - Will need a substantial financial bailout.
- 22. Worldwide inflation rates have increased by more than the interest rate increases. This would suggest that interest rates have a little further to go there has historically been a reasonable relationship between inflation and interest rates over time.






