Daffodil Day 2022


On Friday the 26th of August 2022 it was daffodil day! So the Hanmer Springs School hosted a yellow mufti day and

Our Hot Pools Tour. By Kaitlin Knight On Wednesday the 17th of August 2022

The years 6-8 went on a tour at Hanmer Springs Thermal Pools to learn all about where the hot water comes from and the pumps to keep it hot! We started our journey by going to a shed that had a pipe that was 500m long. It pumped the hot water out of the ground. The water coming out was 58.8 degrees celsius. We walked in and touched the pump. They were hot but not too hot.

Next we headed to the back of the hot pools. The tour leader Neil Wilson talked to us about the pumps and tanks that separated the hot water and methane. We got to press our ears up against a white tank and we heard the bubbling on the inside. Then Nick Lambie (also a tour leader) opened up a shed where we saw a big pump but this one we didn't touch. After that we headed to the back car park to go underneath the cafe which has a room called the plant room full of pumps, pipes and other things that looked like they had something to do with the hot water. In that room there was a tank so we went up some stairs and looked inside. It looked pretty deep to me but it wasn't that deep. It had filthy stuff in it and white bars that were like 4 metal squares all in a line but you could only tell they were squares when you looked at them from an angle, there were about 4 or 5 of those.

Underground we went into a room that was more obvious that you were under a deck. It had only a few mini tanks. We looked in one and we saw just blackness. We didn't know how deep it was but we felt it and it was hot unlike the one beforehand that was lukewarm. We asked Neil if he had been in any of the tanks and he said yes to the hotter one to clean it. We then went to the plant room 2 that was above ground and it was the same sort of thing: pumps and pipes. We last went into a meeting room. It was a room with a huge tv, a longish table and chairs. The tv wasn't

working so a guy called Greg got it working for us "thanks Greg ". so then we looked at maps of the pipes and pumps at different parts of the hot pools and also looked at data info

Fun facts: sand can filter 15 micros of sand

The chlorine comes from the paper mill

The hot water in the ground is 173 years old

Thank you so much Greg, Nick and Neil and also our teacher Mrs Hay for organizing it.

Promoting and enabling small local groups or individuals around the District to develop and maintain them, is the primary role of the Hurunui Trails Trust.

The Trust's members are seeking new faces and ideas, due to a handful of vacancies around the table.

Trustee Mary Holloway said the Trust is the champion promoter and implementer of Hurunui District Council's Walking and Cycling Strategy, seeking not only to develop a well-maintained network of tracks and trails for walkers, cycles, horses and some fully- accessible trails, but it also aims to develop routes that can be used throughout the District to link communities and avoid State Highways.


