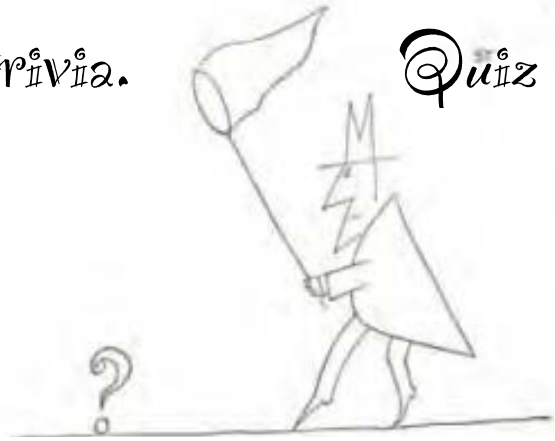

You can also explore the road gang hut and the old Jail, view the gigs, buggies and the large collection of horse harness.

A visit to the Waiau Village Green is a great way to spend a Sunday afternoon while exploring aspects of our local history that interest you. You will be spoilt for choice while you learn about early settlers, runholders, roading, sports, community groups and organisations to name but a few. The Amuri Historical Society has plans to build more display cases in order to protect valuable exhibits. This project will cost and we are seeking support from our residents across the Amuri Basin in the form of a \$10 per annum subscription. Your subscription to the Amuri Historical Society will help keep treasures that are from our area, in pristine condition so that current and future generations of residents and visitors can enjoy our rich and varied local history. The Village Green in Waiau is truly a wee gem, full of connections with the past and a visit definitely provides an opportunity to travel back in time. So, come along and spend an afternoon in Waiau. At Sunday's meeting they were happy to advise their members that Tiger Turf will not only return to replace the artificial turf but will use the material damaged in the storm to landscape the surrounds of the green. They have accepted the responsibility to complete the job as contracted and will begin work as soon as the new turf is manufactured and delivered. Work is expected to begin before the end of October with some of the under-surface needing repair work being done first.

It is hoped that the club members can enjoy their first roll-up in November, a year later than first anticipated. In addition to this work, fencing and signage boards will be installed and the Hanmer Mens' Shed have agreed to build an additional shed as well as making all the surrounding seating.

As well as the numerous grants and funding that Tina, Janet and the committee have organised, an additional \$94,000 has been raised solely from the Hanmer community, a pretty good effort from a small community which is so often asked for help by local organisations

Potato Flat Bread

Three ingredients. No knead. Soft and pliable.

Ingredients

- 150g (1 cup) plain flour
- ¼ tsp cooking salt
- 240g (1 cup) mashed potato, at room temperature or fridge-cold
- 1 tbsp melted unsalted butter

Method

1. To make the dough, use your hands to mix together the flour and salt in bowl. Make a well, add potato and butter, then mix to incorporate. It will seem dry and crumbly at first but will eventually come together to form a smooth ball of dough.
2. On a lightly floured work surface, roll the dough into a 20cm log, then cut into 8 equal pieces. Roll each piece into a ball using your hands, then use a rolling pin to flatten into 15cm rounds.
3. Preheat a cast-iron skillet (no oil) on high heat until you see wisps of smoke. Place a flatbread in the pan and cook for 1 minute until it bubbles up in places and the underside has dark brown spots. Flip and cook the other side for 45 seconds to 1 minute until there are brown spots, then remove.
4. Repeat with remaining dough, stacking the flatbreads on top of each other. Best served warm – they can be reheated in the microwave or in a 150C oven (for 15 minutes wrapped in foil).

ginger and lime dipping sauce

- 1 large red chilli, seeded and chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, chopped
- 3 cm (1¼ inch) piece ginger, chopped
- ¼ small red onion, chopped
- 125 ml (4 fl oz/½ cup) lime juice
- 60 ml (2 fl oz/¼ cup) fish sauce
- 1 tablespoon shaved palm sugar or soft brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons light soy sauce

Put the chilli, garlic, ginger and red onion in a mini processor and whizz in short bursts for 15 seconds, or until thoroughly chopped. Add the lime juice, fish sauce, sugar and soy sauce. Whizz in short bursts until combined.

Spicy Beef Empanadas

Ingredients

- 4½ cups plain flour
- 1 ½ tsp salt
- 125g softened butter, cut into small pieces
- 1 ¼ cups water
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 500g minced beef
- 1 tbsp fresh oregano, leaves picked and finely chopped
- 1 tbsp fresh coriander, leaves picked and finely chopped
- ½ tsp ground coriander
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 2 tsp smoky sweet paprika
- ½ tsp hot chilli powder
- 1 tsp salt
- ½ tsp black pepper
- 400g tin Italian diced tomatoes
- ½ cup raisins
- 2 hard-boiled eggs, peeled and coarsely chopped
- 1 egg yolk for glaze

Method

To make the pastry, place flour and salt in the bowl of an electric mixer. Add the butter and mix until like coarse breadcrumbs. Add the water, a little at a time, until the dough forms (you might not need all the water). Pat the dough into a ball and flatten it slightly. Wrap in plastic film and refrigerate for an hour. Alternatively, just buy packet of short or puff pastry and use that

To prepare the filling, cook the garlic and onion in the oil over low heat without colouring. Add the beef and cook until coloured. Add the herbs and spices, season with salt and pepper and stir well. Add the tomatoes and raisins and simmer for 10 minutes over low heat to reduce the liquid. Taste and adjust seasoning if required. When cool, stir through the hard-boiled eggs. Preheat oven to 200C. Divide the dough into four-centimetre balls (you should get 24) and roll each one out on a floured surface to make a thin circle. Place a heaped tablespoon of the mixture into the middle of each, seal the edges with a little water and pinch the edges or twist them to seal. Line two oven trays with baking paper and arrange the empanadas on top. Brush with egg yolk to glaze. Bake in the top of the oven for 25-30 minutes or until golden brown.

UNITED KINGDOM - A DEEP DIVE

(THE ORIGINAL SOURCE OF MANY PRESENT NEW ZEALANDERS)

1. With the recent resignation of Boris Johnson, the UK now has a new Prime Minister, Liz Truss.
2. The vote for the next Prime Minister was by the 160,000 Tory Party members.
3. At the time of writing it has been reported that one in six UK families (4.7 million) are in serious financial difficulties.
4. Current population: 67,250,000 (1/7/2022) - around 13.4 times the NZ population of 5,127,100.
5. The UK land area is 243,610 sq km - slightly smaller than the NZ land area of 268,021 sq km.
6. UK households: 28.3 million (around 14.15 times more than the NZ household number of around 2 million).
7. UK Sterling: £1 = NZ\$1.9243 (10/08/2022).
8. Median UK income in NZ\$ is \$50,000 (the NZ median net income presently is around \$58,000) - in London this median figure in NZ\$ is \$76,425.
9. Current UK inflation rate is 10.1% (NZ around 7.3%) and it is felt that it may get to 12%.
10. UK household energy prices have increased over the last 12 months by 54% and may rise further.
11. When was Brexit finalised: 31 January 2020 (just on 2.5 years ago).
12. Current unemployment rate in the UK is 3.8% (NZ around 3.3%).
13. Basic salary of an MP in the UK is \$161,918 in NZ\$, which is similar to NZ.
14. What, specifically, are UK households struggling with: energy costs, food and fuel - the UK is looking down the barrel of an economic recession, probably more than any other developed country at this point in time.
15. Prior to Brexit, UK farmers received around NZ\$6.74 billion in subsidies. In a broad sense, this represented, in England, around 9% of gross farm revenue and 61% of net farm profit. Going forward, the picture looks complicated but the subsidy amounts in total probably will not change greatly.
16. The UK has at least 1.9 million dairy cows and is the 13th largest milk producer in the world. Like many other dairying countries, the number of dairy farms has declined steadily - presently, the UK has some 11,000 dairy farms with an average cows milked figure of 160-200 cows - the NZ average is around 440 cows.
17. The UK has approximately 30 million sheep - broadly similar to NZ at around 26 million.
18. Around 63% of UK people own their own house - again very similar to NZ.
19. The average house mortgage debt in the UK is around \$288,800 in NZ\$. The UK banks lend up to 4.5 times your annual household disposable earnings - sometimes 5 times - in NZ this figure is often more like 6 to 7.
20. The NZ current all borrower's average house loan is \$401,601, and the average for first home borrowers is \$568,720.
21. Population split of the UK:
 - England 56,521,000 (84.05%)
 - Scotland 5,538,000 (8.23%)
 - Wales 3,267,000 (4.86%)
 - Northern Ireland 1,924,000 (2.86%)
 - _____ 67,250,000
22. What might the effect of a recession be for the UK:
 - (a) Businesses will try and save money so jobs will be lost and unemployment will increase.
 - (b) With inflation and higher costs, people will not be able to cover the essentials.
 - (c) A family's emergency fund will become very important.
 - (d) A period of general to significant unhappiness with aspects of civil unrest.
 - (e) Government will increase welfare benefits.
 - (f) Household gross income will fall.
23. The real threat is how long will inflation stay up around 10% or more - if it becomes embedded in everyday costs, then this is trouble - central banks have all moved too slowly as it has turned out, which is easy to say in retrospect, but they generally want to see their country's inflation rate quickly down to 2% - 3%.
24. A ceasefire and negotiated peace, somehow, in Ukraine would improve a few issues worldwide, although the world is going to have to find perhaps 500-1,000 billion (\$US) to help rebuild Ukraine.
25. Why is the UK struggling more than most other developed countries:
 - (a) Poor management politically for several years.
 - (b) Brexit has not produced (as yet) anything like the positives that was estimated and hoped for.
 - (c) The UK National Health Service (NHS) was under pressure long before COVID - COVID simply pushed it deeper.
 - (d) The price of milk increased in June 2022 by 21% compared with 12 months earlier.
 - (e) The UK imports more than 50% of its food and the majority of its gas and oil which makes it very vulnerable in a down cycle.
 - (f) Tax increases are needed to pay for the pandemic, but the UK people and businesses are already over stretched.
 - (g) An ageing population badly affected by inflation (19% or around 13 million people are over 65 years, the NZ figure is around 16%).
 - (h) UK overseas trade since Brexit is poorer than planned.
 - (i) The UK has 1,900,000 fewer workers than in 2019 (people retired, stopped work or have not re-entered work).
 - (j) UK R & D spending is lower than similar developed countries.
 - (k) It is estimated that 1 in 7 UK business firms are facing financial collapse.
 - (l) The UK debt to GDP ratio is around 96%, with NZ being around 32% - NZ owes Michael Cullen and Bill English a real credit for NZ's more controlled position.
 - (m) 6.6 million UK people are on a waiting list for treatment and surgery.

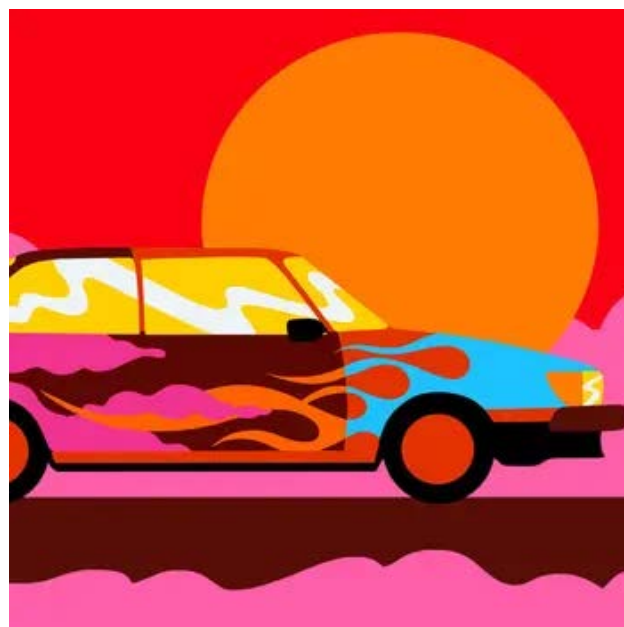
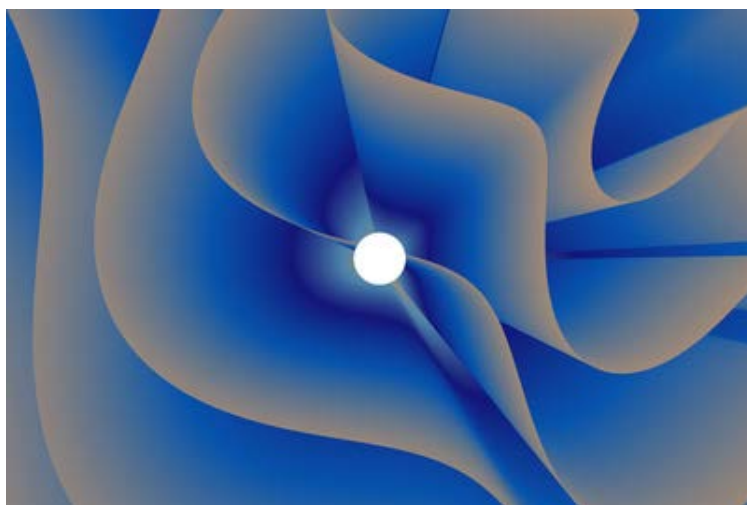

	LDPE	Low density polyethylene - Carrier bags and bin liners.

Kerbside refuse and recycling collection – Monday 8am

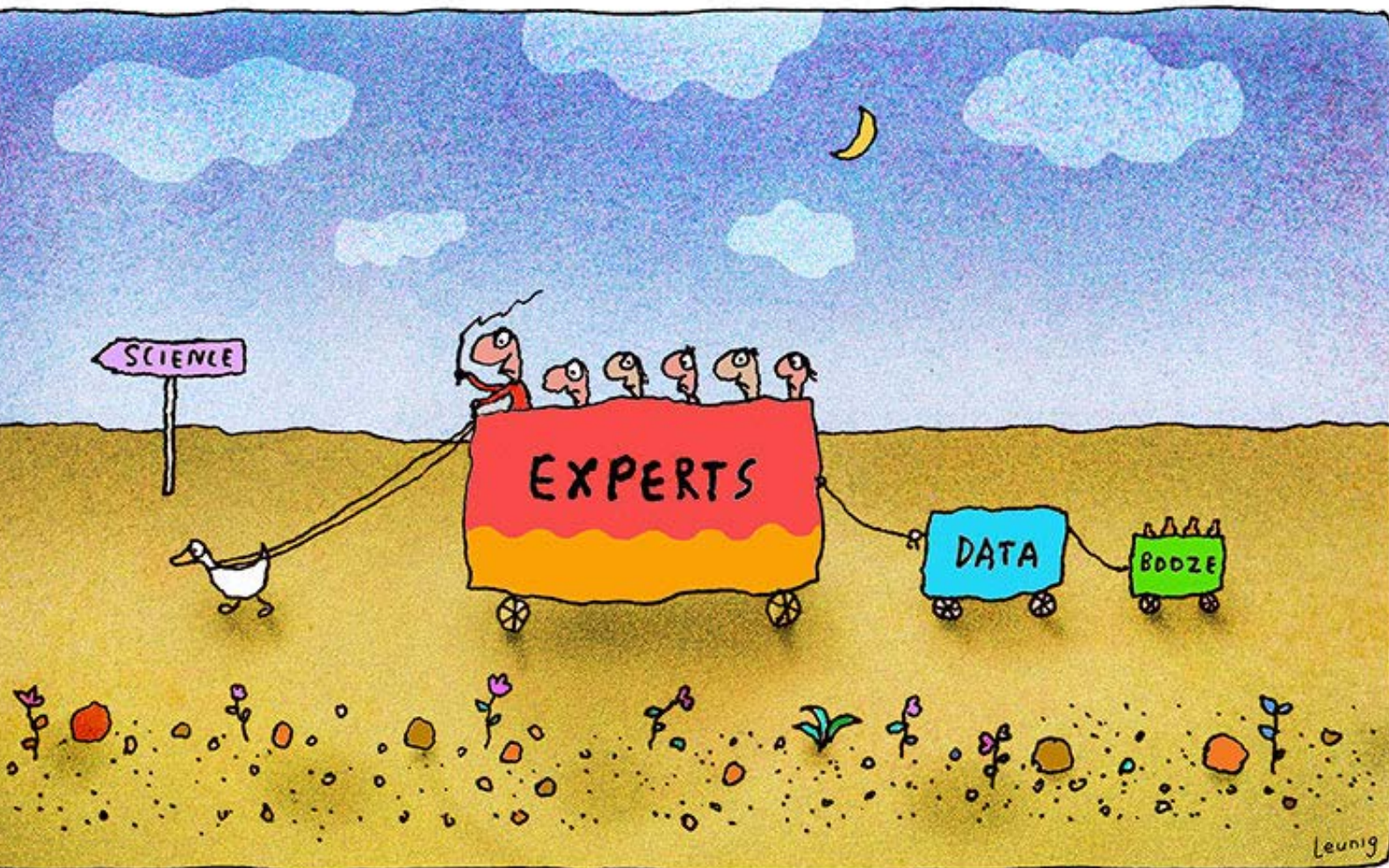
Only official refuse and recycling bags will be collected; these can be purchased from Hanmer Springs Service Station and the library.
