Tuna pasta with rocket gremolata

You probably already have most of the ingredients for this quick midweek meal lurking in your pantry and fridge.

TTFL - tinned tuna for life.

Ingredients

1 tbsp capers, drained
 1 cup curly parsley
 1 cup baby rocket leaves, plus extra to serve
 1 tsp finely grated lemon zest
 2 tbsp lemon juice
 ⅓ cup extra virgin olive oil
 4 slices sourdough, roughly chopped
 2 garlic cloves, thinly sliced
 400g spaghetti
 425g can chilli tuna in oil

Method

1. To make the gremolata, combine the capers, parsley, cup of rocket, lemon zest and juice and ¼ cup of the oil in a small food processor and process until finely chopped. Season and refrigerate until ready to use.
2. Heat remaining oil in a large non-stick frying pan over medium heat. Add the garlic and bread and cook, stirring occasionally, for 4-6 minutes or until golden. Set aside.
3. Cook the pasta in salted boiling water for 6-8 minutes or until al dente. Drain, reserving ½ cup of cooking water. Return the pasta to the saucepan with the cooking water, gremolata and tuna, and toss to combine.
4. Divide between bowls, serve with rocket and crunchy breadcrumbs.

hangover noodles with crunchy veg, egg noodles and a runny egg

This super-tasty, quick noodle recipe is perfect when you're feeling a little down in the dumps. It's all about that punchy dressing you toss hot veg and noodles through, which you then serve up with a fried egg and chilli sauce. Bend the recipe to suit the ingredients you've got to hand. Comfort in a bowl.

Ingredients

5cm piece of ginger
 1 clove of garlic
 2 tablespoons low-salt soy sauce
 3 tablespoons rice wine vinegar
 3 tablespoons sesame oil
 1 Chinese cabbage
 500g fresh or frozen broccoli
 250g medium free-range egg noodles
 200g snow pea
 4 large free-range eggs
 olive oil
 hot chilli sauce, to serve

Method

1. Peel the ginger and garlic and finely grate into a large bowl.
2. Add the soy sauce, vinegar, sesame oil and a pinch of black pepper, then mix to make a dressing.
3. Trim and shred the cabbage and put it into a large pan of boiling salted water with the broccoli (cut into florets first, if using fresh) and noodles to cook for around 3 minutes, then add the snow pea for a final minute.
4. Drain it all well, then toss in the bowl of dressing.
5. Fry the eggs in a large non-stick frying pan on a medium heat with a lug of olive oil until cooked to your liking (I like mine with a runny yolk).
6. Divide the noodles between bowls, pop an egg on top of each one, and serve drizzled with chilli sauce for that all-important added kick.

The article of the day read:

Culverden-Hanmer Road Blocked: An Overturned Traction Engine
Traffic on the road from Hanmer (Canterbury) was completely blocked on February 10 by the overturning of a traction engine belonging to Mr R Giles of Balcairn. The accident occurred in the Waiau Ferry Cutting, quite close to the bridge. The chain of the steering gear snapped when going down the incline, and the engine ran into the side of the cutting and overturned right across the road. Mr Giles and the steerer escaped with a severe shaking.

2022 ACHERON EAST POSSUM CONTROL OPERATION

Vector Free Marlborough (VFM) wishes to advise the public of its intention to aerially apply the toxin Sodium fluoroacetate (1080) to parts of Molesworth Station for the purpose of controlling possums. The Acheron East operation is being carried out on behalf of OSPRI as part of its TBfree New Zealand programme, which aims to eradicate bovine tuberculosis from wildlife vectors that pose a risk to farmed cattle and deer.

Description of Area

The Acheron East permission area takes in approximately 66,168 hectares between the Acheron and Clarence catchments. The boundary of the permission area extends from the vicinity of the Acheron Campsite in the south-west and heads north to the vicinity of Isolated Saddle, taking in the east-facing catchments immediately west of the Acheron Road. From Isolated Saddle, the permission area extends to its northern most point at Wards Pass before following the Rachel Range south, taking in the Guide River and Half Moon Stream catchments and excluding the Awatere River catchment, thence in a north easterly direction to St Bernard peak at the southern extent of the Inland Kaikoura Range, before turning south to the Clarence River. The permission area then follows the Clarence River south-west before turning west toward the confluence of the Acheron and Clarence rivers in the vicinity of the Acheron Campsite.

Most land in the permission area is administered by the Department of Conservation but several small tracts of land held by various private and institutional owners are also included. Coordination with affected leasehold farming operations remains in place. The Acheron road is excluded from aerial application of 1080 in this operation. A detailed map may be obtained from VFM as per contact details below.

Commencement Date

Subject to favourable weather, control is now planned to commence **from Saturday 1 October 2022**, with the aerial application of non-toxic cereal pre-feed pellets. This will be followed approximately 7-10 days later by the aerial application of bait containing biodegradable sodium fluoroacetate (1080). All work is weather dependent, and commencement may be later than indicated. In the event of an extended delay, further notices will be placed to advise the public.

Bait Description

Aerial and ground control using 1080:

- Pre-feed - Non-toxic cereal-based pellet, approximately 16 mm long, cinnamon-lured and non-dyed (straw coloured).
- Toxic bait - Cereal-based pellet, approximately 16 mm long, cinnamon-lured and dyed green with a toxic loading of 0.15% Sodium fluoroacetate (1080).
- All prefeed and 1080 bait for aerial and ground application will contain deer repellent.

Ground control using cyanide:

- Feratox encapsulated cyanide in the form of a capsule, dyed green/blue, presented with feed-paste or similar attractant, contained inside reusable bait stations. Bait stations will be installed 130cm above the ground.

Precautions

The public are reminded of the danger that toxic baits and possum carcasses pose, particularly to children and dogs.

- **DO NOT TOUCH OR EAT BAITS**
- Children must be kept under strict supervision in the control area
- Dogs must be kept under strict control at all times and not have access to, or be taken into, the control area, as they are particularly susceptible to harm from contact with toxic baits and poisoned carcasses. The risk that poisoned carcasses pose to dogs may extend downstream of the control area.
- Toxin warning signs will be installed at main public entry points and the public are reminded that it is an offence to remove this warning signage. Please follow the instructions on the signs.
- Game animals should not be sold or taken for eating from within or adjacent to this area until it is declared clear of pesticides.

Needless reviews its disposal of property

What to do with Council property that is not for sale is part of the draft Disposal of Property Policy adopted by Councillors at this week's Strategy and Policy meeting.

The draft Policy will provide clarity on Hurunui District Council's position on how to dispose of property other than through sale, considering a range of options.

Chief Operations Officer Dan Harris said Council has a range of options to choose from when considering property that is surplus to requirements.

These include repurposing the property for another valid purpose, gifting property that is no longer financially beneficial to Council, selling the property, or demolition.

"Challenges had arisen around the distribution of the proceeds from sale of property, and last year it was first determined that a Policy review would help address this issue."

The draft Policy will go to the full Council meeting at the end of the month, where it will be tabled for adoption.

Te Ahi Ora Fire Spinning.

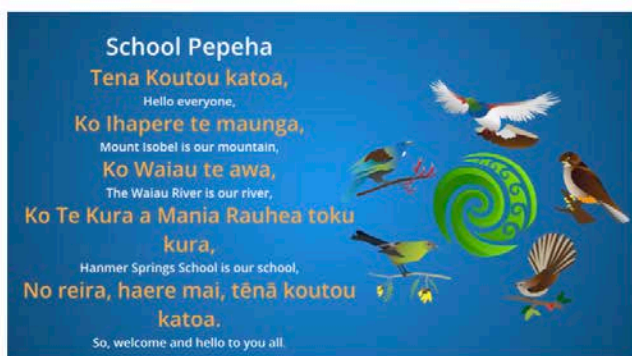

Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori – Māori Language

We celebrated Māori Language Week by doing some different activities. On Wednesday at 12 noon, the whole school sang the waiata He Honore to celebrate the moment 50 years ago when the Māori Language Petition was taken to Parliament. The petition wanted te reo to be recognized as a language of NZ and to teach it in schools. Tui class has been learning the waiata He Waka Eke Noa. It is about rowing a waka together. The message of the waiata is that if we all work together it will be like a dream and we can all get on together. We have also been learning rakau sticks. We have been learning to tap them on the ground and tap them together. It is a bit tricky to keep everyone on time. It is hard to throw the sticks up and catch them again. We have been learning some new words and phrases. Tui Rua class has written their own pepeha and they are learning how to say them. They have matched groups of objects with the correct number, writing it in te reo. They have been counting and have learned āe/yes and kāo/no. Piwakawaka class has been learning simple te reo phrases – Kei te pehea koe?/ how are you? In Ti Rakau they have been learning to follow a sequence using a rhythm and have been practicing using Ti Rakau with waiata. "They have made wasp traps, which link to the concept of Kaitiakitanga and look after our local environment. Korimako class have been working on a debate where they split into two groups, one for and one against the topic 'Should te reo Māori be taught in schools?' based on the views in 1972 (the year the Māori Language Petition was taken to parliament). They researched their side and their opinions in 1972 and found facts to argue their point. Afterward, they held a debate to argue their side backed up by what they had discovered.

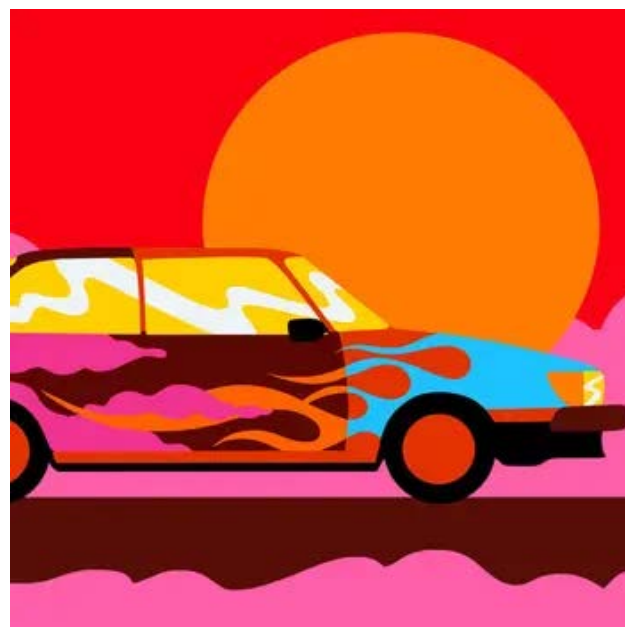
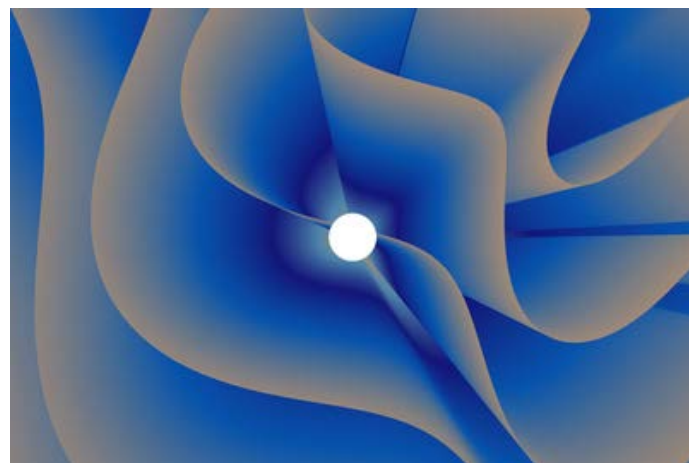

Out of hours recycling facilities for paper, card, cans, plastics types 1, 2 & 5 only and glass bottles are provided; please ensure recycling is clean, loose and all lids are removed. Soft plastics (i.e. those you can scrunch in your hand) are not recyclable and must be placed in the refuse.

Kerbside refuse and recycling collection – Monday 8am

Only official refuse and recycling bags will be collected; these can be purchased from Hanmer Springs Service Station and the library.

Via the recycling bags clean paper, card, cans and plastics types 1, 2 & 5 only can be recycled.

If in doubt – place it in the refuse to save contaminating recycling.

Non complying bags and recycling bags containing glass and soft plastics will not be collected.

Please Note that HDC garbage & recycling bags are no longer available from the Four Square supermarket . Henceforth, bags will only be available from Hanmer Springs Service Station, the library , The Log Cabin and Super Liquor



Refuse and recycling changes



Due to the Queen Elizabeth II Memorial Day on September 26th, refuse and recycling in Hanmer Springs will be collected one day later than normal on Tuesday 27th September.

When using the refuse and recycling collections, please remember the following.

- Only official Hurunui Council bags will be collected.
- Bundles of cardboard will not be collected; but can be recycled via the transfer stations.
- Bags must be securely tied and at the kerbside or collection point by 8am. The crew will not return to collect bags placed out late.
- Bags must not exceed 15kg.
- Bags split prior to the crew's arrival and non-official bags will not be collected.

What is accepted via the recycling collections?

The following can be recycled, providing they are clean and loose in a Council recycling bag.

- Newspapers, magazines, office paper and telephone directories.
- Cardboard, greetings cards, junk mail, envelopes, and egg boxes.
- Food, drink, and pet food cans.
- Rigid plastic bottles and small containers, types 1, 2 and 5 with lids removed.

What cannot be recycled?

Soft plastics (i.e. those that can be scrunched), plastics 3, 4, 6 and 7, tetrapaks, polystyrene, plant pots, plastic strapping, clothing and shoes, food-stained paper or cardboard, coffee cups, plastic lids, foil trays and food waste are not recyclable.

If in doubt throw it out; contaminated recycling bags will be stickered and left.

Recycling glass bottles

Glass bottles must not be put in recycling bags but can be recycled via any transfer station.

In Hanmer Springs, household glass bottles are collected providing they are in a Council issued recycling box with all lids removed.
