You will be spoilt for choice while you learn about early settlers, runholders, roading, sports, community groups and organisations to name but a few. The Amuri Historical Society has plans to build more display cases in order to protect valuable exhibits. This project will cost and we are seeking support from our residents across the Amuri Basin in the form of a \$10 per annum subscription. Your subscription to the Amuri Historical Society will help keep treasures that are from our area, in pristine condition so that current and future generations of residents and visitors can enjoy our rich and varied local history. The Village Green in Waiau is truly a wee gem, full of connections with the past and a visit definitely provides an opportunity to travel back in time. So, come along and spend an afternoon in Waiau. Saffron Salmon Kababs

Ingredients

About 1¹/₂ teaspoons saffron threads (0.35 grams)

Pinch of granulated sugar

- 3 tablespoons fresh lime juice, plus lime wedges for serving
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 large garlic cloves, finely grated

1¼ teaspoons sea salt

- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano, crushed between your fingers
- 1/2 teaspoon ground coriander seed
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon ground turmeric
- 750 grams skinless salmon, cut into 1-inch pieces
- Fresh herbs, such as mint, cilantro and basil, for serving

Preparation

Step 1

Using a mortar and pestle or small bowl and the handle end of a wooden spoon, grind the saffron with a pinch of sugar to a fine powder (about ¼ teaspoon). Transfer to a large bowl. Bring 2 tablespoons water to a boil in a saucepan, kettle or using the microwave, then let stand for 2 minutes to allow the water temperature to drop slightly. Add to the ground saffron powder, gently stir, cover and steep for 5 minutes.

Step 2

To the saffron water, add the lime juice, olive oil, garlic, salt, oregano, coriander, pepper and turmeric. Stir to mix, add the salmon pieces and combine until the salmon is well coated. Cover and marinate in the refrigerator for 30 minutes.

Step 3

As the salmon marinates, prepare a charcoal grill until the coals are ashed over and slightly cooled to medium-hot and or heat a gas grill to medium-high. Skewer the salmon and save any remaining marinade. Grill the skewers, brushing with the remaining marinade and turning every couple of minutes, until tender and buttery, about 10 minutes total. Serve with lime wedges for squeezing over the fish. Enjoy,

Roasted Fish With Spice Butter and Tomatoes

Ingredients

1pint cherry or grape tomatoes (halved or quartered, if they are large)

- Kosher salt
- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
- 3 garlic cloves, finely grated or minced
- 1 teaspoon finely grated lemon or lime zest
- 1 to 2 teaspoons spice blend of choice

4 (6-ounce) mild white fish fillets (for example, cod, hake or blackfish)

2 scallions, white and green parts, thinly sliced Fresh lemon or lime juice, for serving Torn fresh herbs, such as mint, dill, cilantro or pars-

ley, for serving

Preparation

Step 1

Heat oven to 450 degrees. Place tomatoes on a rimmed baking sheet, sprinkle lightly with salt, and roast for 10 minutes as you prepare the fish. Step 2

In a small bowl, stir together butter, garlic, zest, spice blend and a pinch of salt.

Step 3

Season fish lightly with salt. Pull pan from the oven, and nestle fillets among the cherry tomatoes. Pour spice butter over fish and tomatoes, tossing the tomatoes to coat them. Sprinkle scallions on top of everything.

Step 4

Roast until fish is flaky and cooked through, about 5 to 10 minutes, depending on the thickness of the fillets. Top with a squeeze of citrus juice and fresh herbs, and serve.

Our Wellington correspondent telegraphs that Mr Meredith has been interesting himself in the matter of the production of a hand-book to the Hanmer Springs, and has interviewed the Minister of Lands on the subject. He suggested that the publication, which is to be illustrated by photographs of the springs, and of the scenery in the vicinity, should contain a description of the springs, an analysis of the waters, and include personal testimonies to their curative powers. The usual information contained in such publications as to accommodation and routes should also be included. Such a guide, he said, would largely increase the number of visitors to the springs. The Minister, favourably entertained Mr Meredith's proposal, and promised that such a book would be compiled and every endeavour made to have it ready in time for the approaching season.

A	LDPE	Low density polyethylene - Carrier bags and bin liners.
B	РР	Polypropylene - Margarine tubs, microwave- able meal trays.
