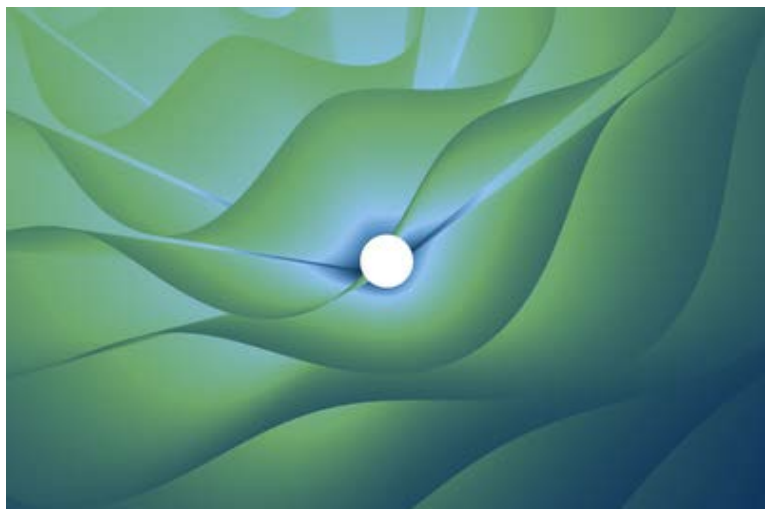

Seasonal produce is the hero this week.

Asparagus season is in full swing, so make it a main player with dishes like asparagus salad and asparagus vinaigrette, or just cook it and dip it into hollandaise. It's really important to buy good quality local produce – not the imported variety – and support our farmers.



Pea risotto recipe

Ingredients

1 knob butter
1 small brown onion
300g arborio rice
250ml white wine
1L vegetable stock or whey
salt and pepper
100g ricotta
100g handful peas, de-shelled
100g handful snow peas, halved
1 lemon
1 tbsp olive oil
50g parmesan
1 tbsp chopped parsley, mint and basil
40g handful rocket leaves

Method

Place a pot on heat and add the butter. Dice the onion and cook it in the foaming butter. Add the rice and white wine. Gradually add the stock or whey, stirring occasionally until the rice is just cooked. If more liquid is needed to cook the rice you can add a little water. Season with salt and pepper, ricotta, some of the peas, lemon and olive oil. Pop in a bowl and top with herbs, nasturtium leaves, raw peas and mint oil

Asparagus, pea and buttermilk quiche

Ingredients

12 asparagus spears or green beans
1 leek, sliced
150g peas
1 zucchini, sliced
6 x 55g eggs
200ml buttermilk
Grated nutmeg
sea salt and pepper
100g grated cheese, eg, cheddar, gruyere
Pastry:
150g plain flour, sifted
75g butter, chilled and diced
pinch of salt
Method

1. To make the pastry, whiz the flour, butter and salt for 10 seconds until it looks like coarse crumbs. Slowly add up to 60ml of icy-cold mineral water, pulsing, until it comes together as a ball of dough. Wrap and chill for 30 minutes.
2. Heat the oven to 200C. Roll the pastry to desired thickness and use it to line a 23-centimetre-wide fluted tart tin. Trim the pastry, with the pastry and trim, allowing for shrinkage. Line the pastry with foil and fill with raw beans or pastry weights.
3. Bake for 10 minutes then remove the foil and weights, and bake for a further five minutes. Remove from the oven.
4. Cut the asparagus in half, and slice the bottom half, keeping the top half whole. Add the asparagus, leek, peas and zucchini to a big pot of simmering salted water. When it returns to the boil, cook for 30 seconds, then drain and refresh vegetables in iced cold water. Drain well.
5. Turn the oven down to 190C. Beat the eggs, buttermilk, nutmeg, salt and pepper together. Toss the vegetables with cheese and arrange in pastry base. Pour the egg mixture over the top, and bake for 40 minutes or until set and golden. Serve warm.

Pools News

News from the indicates that admission figures are much as expected despite the fact the recent school holidays were down about 10 % over the previous year. At the moment the pattern appears to be that there is no pattern. But the good news is that international visitors are back, mainly from Australia but also the UK and Asia. (The Government has said they expect international visitor numbers to be back to pre-Covid levels by January, (which some consider a big ask). The complex is confident that it can get back to 9 pm closing by December, but this will be dependant on staff levels. An upgrade to the sulphur pools is planned for the immediate future.

News Briefs

Fly Ride - The hearing of an objection to this by a local group is set to be held in the Environment Court on the 27th February.

Old Soldiers Block - Reliable sources inform us that we can finally expect some action with the upgrade of this building and soon.

Real Estate Sector - There is still plenty of demand in the real estate sector but this is somewhat hampered by the lack of properties on the market. Informed opinion is that prices have plateaued. There are plenty of sections available for sale and it is anticipated that because of planned developments, at least another 200 will be added in the next few months.

Top 10 Holiday Park - The Top 10 holiday Park management advised us that they were the purchasers of the land etc. of the adjacent mini-golf complex. They also advise that they are planning a Teddy Bear's Picnic probably on November 20th. They have promised us more details in the next week or so.

Tom Davies Reflections

I hope we can have more murals and beautification of our fantastic village and area.

I also look out for instances of great service and contribution to our community. These are based upon my observations and experiences and are purely my opinions. I am happy to shout out other examples that you see. I would like to give a big hand to Hanmer Springs Hotel. This is a great hotel and Cesare Stella is a great Chef. I love drinking and eating there. I thoroughly recommend you do the same.

During my journey to become Councillor I was helped and supported by many locals, and I would like to give them a huge thanks. Rosemary, Neroli, Stacey, and Grum were wonderful. There are many more too. I think that Hanmer Springs School (where I work part time) and our new Principal John McBride have been incredibly helpful, flexible, and supportive too. Mary Holloway leaves a big legacy and will be a hard act to follow. Thank you, Mary.
