

Cuban-style pulled-pork sandwiches

Ingredients

- 8 garlic cloves, peeled 1½ tsp ground cumin
- 1 tsp freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tsp dried oregano
- 1 tbsp fresh oregano, chopped
- juice of 2 oranges
- juice of 2 limes
- 4 tbsp olive oil
- 1.5kg boneless pork shoulder, skin off
- 1/2 bunch mint leaves, chopped, to serve
- 6 bap rolls*, to serve
- white onion, thinly sliced, to serve

Method

1. For the marinade, crush the garlic with a pinch of salt using a mortar and pestle until it forms a smooth paste. Transfer to a small bowl along with the cumin, black pepper, oregano, orange and lime juices and olive oil and stir to combine. Reserve half to set aside in the fridge.2. Place the pork in a tray and pour the remaining marinade over the pork. Sprinkle liberally with salt, cover and refrigerate overnight (or, at most, 24 hours). 3. The next day, heat your oven to 200C fan-forced (220C conventional). Place the pork inside an enamel-lined Dutch oven or a deep roasting dish and pour all the juices from the tray over it. Cover with a lid or, if using a roasting pan, place a sheet of baking paper over the pork and then wrap tightly with foil. Place into the oven and immediately reduce temperature to 120C fan-forced (140C conventional). Cook for 7-8 hours until the meat is tender and beginning to fall apart (this can be done overnight).4. Next, uncover the meat and increase the temperature to 200C fan-forced (220C conventional), cooking for 30-45 minutes until the top starts to brown. Remove from the oven and rest for at least 20 minutes. Lift the meat out of the pot and place onto a chopping board and use two forks to shred it into large chunks. Pour all the dripping from the pot into a measuring cup and return the meat to the roasting dish.5. Discard half of the fat, scooping it from the top of the cup. Mix the remaining dripping with the reserved fresh marinade and chopped mint. This is your sandwich dressing.6. Slice open the soft rolls. Fill with a generous scoop of shredded pork, drizzle over the dressing and garnish with thin slices of white onion. Close the bun and serve.

Pork burger with smoky apple bbq sauce and kale slaw

Ingredients

- 500g pork mince
- 1 tbsp coarsely chopped sage
- 1 tbsp coarsely chopped parsley
- 1/3 cup dried breadcrumbs
- 1/4 cup finely grated parmesan
- 1 egg
- 1/3 cup toasted pecans, coarsely chopped
- 1/2 cup store-bought apple sauce
- 1 tbsp smoked paprika
- 1/4 cup maple sauce
- 1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1 large beetroot, peeled
- 2 cups trimmed kale leaves
- 4 slices cheddar cheese (about 100g total)
- 1 green apple, thinly sliced
- 4 burger buns, toasted

Method

1. Mix together the mince, herbs, breadcrumbs parmesan, egg and pecans. Divide the mince into four patties. Set aside.

2. Combine the apple sauce, paprika, maple syrup and Worcestershire in a small saucepan over medium heat. Cook for 1-3 minutes, until reduced and sticky. Set aside.

3. Using a spiraliser or peeler, shred the beet-root. Set aside.

4. Heat a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Cook the patties for 3-4 minutes each side or until cooked through.

5. Spread the sauce between buns. Top with kale, beetroot, cheddar, apple and patties. Sandwich and serve with extra sauce.





Letter to the editor

Kia ora,

On a recent holiday in Hanmer, I was surprised to see a one way traffic system implemented at the entrances to Brooke Dawson Reserve (Dog Stream Reserve).

I am in favour of a one way flow of traffic entering and exiting the reserve but am bemused by the entry being a right hand turn at the end of Bath Street, rather than a left hand turn. The right hand turn 'Give Way' exit has also added further complexity to the flow of traffic. I am intrigued to have a professional explain the rationale for the new system. For a layman, such as myself, it seems more logical to turn left into Brooke Dawson Reserve at the end of Bath Street and then exit the reserve by turning left back on to Bath Street.

I'm hoping that The Pinkie can get to the bottom of this! Nga mihi, Nathan Gargiulo (Nelson)

This was forwarded to the Hurunui District Council who responded

'It was simply done that way in an attempt to slow traffic down, particularly during high volumes. Anecdotally we'd heard people were going left without slowing down from Bath Street, just seeing it as an extension of the road.'

Refuse and Recycling Hanmer Springs

Due to Labour Day, for one week only, refuse and recycling in Hanmer Springs will be collected one day later than normal on Tuesday 25th October.

Please remember the following:

- Only Hurunui Council bags will be collected. In Hanmer Springs these can be purchased from the library, Super Liquor, and the Service Station.
- Bags must be securely tied and at the kerbside by 8am as collection times may vary to normal; the crew will not return to collect bags that are placed out late.
- Refuse bags must not exceed 15kg.
- Bags split prior to the crew's arrival and non-official bags will not be collected.
- Bundles of cardboard will not be collected but can be recycled via the transfer station.

What is accepted via the recycling collections?

The following are accepted, providing they are clean, free from food waste and loose (papers should not be tied in bundles) in a Council recycling bag.

- Newspapers, magazines, office paper and telephone directories.
- Cardboard, greeting cards, junk mail, envelopes, and egg boxes.
- Food, drink, and pet food cans.
- Rigid plastic bottles and small containers, types 1, 2 and 5 only with lids removed.

What cannot be recycled?

Soft plastics (those that can be scrunched), plastics 3, 4, 6 and 7, tetra paks, polystyrene (including meat trays), plant pots, strapping, clothing and shoes, food stained paper or card, coffee cups, lids, foil trays and food are not recyclable.

If in doubt throw it out as contaminated recycling bags will be stickered and left.

Recycling glass bottles

In Hanmer Springs, household glass bottles are collected providing an official Council recycling box is used. Glass bottles must not be put in recycling bags but can be recycled via

the transfer station.



A book that you just finished reading. Actually, it's too short to be a book. I'll keep writing anyway.Ahem!



Tui Y1 class have been learning about koru. They have learnt it is a spiral shape based on the unfurling silver fern frond found in nature. The koru is a symbol in Māori art and carving where it symbolises new life, growth, strength and peace. They have learnt to draw koru and can recognise koru shapes in artwork. They each created a koru using clay and painted it, then glued it onto hessian and black paper to display it.

"I enjoyed making my koru using clay. It was fun rolling the clay into a long snake and then making the spiral shape" - **Meila.** "I had fun making my koru shape using clay. My snake was long and thin and I rolled it around to make a spiral shape" - **Harry.** "After my koru had dried I painted it green. It needed two layers of green paint. Then we stuck it onto hessian and black paper" -**Isaac.**

A	PET	Polyethylene terephthalate - Fizzy drink bottles and frozen ready meal packages.
23	HDPE	High-density polyethylene - Milk and washing-up liquid bottles
හ	PVC	Polyvinyl chloride - Food trays, cling film, bottles for squash, mineral water and shampoo.
23	LDPE	Low density polyethylene - Carrier bags and bin liners.
ES)	PP	Polypropylene - Margarine tubs, microwave- able meal trays.
B	PS	Polystyrene - Yoghurt pots, foam meat or fish trays, hamburger boxes and egg cartons, vending cups, plastic cutlery, protective packaging for electronic goods and toys.

Kerbside refuse and recycling collection – Monday 8am


Only official refuse and recycling bags will be collected; these can be purchased from Hanmer Springs Service Station and the library.


