### Vandalising Queen Mary Hospital deemed unforgivable

Vandalism is on the increase at the QMH site in Hanmer Springs, and it's causing concern.

The Queen Mary Hospital Heritage Reserve in the alpine village is the home of three historic buildings, victim to broken windows and attempted forced entry. The Chisholm Ward has suffered two recent break-ins, resulting in smashed windows and forced entry damage that will be expensive to repair.

Hurunui District Council's Chief Strategy and Community Officer Judith Batchelor was disappointed to see this unique area of Hanmer Springs a target of this mindless damage, commenting that vandalism incidents seem to increase around school holiday time.

"We are asking the community to keep an eye out for any suspicious activity around the grounds and buildings, and to please report anything untoward to Council."

Batchelor said Council continues to take the approach of repairing broken windows, rather than boarding them up which occurs in the southern block on the Crown Public Health land.

"We would prefer to keep the windows in as much as possible, in mark of honouring its historical significance." In July 2020 the Hospital site was subject to a similar spate of vandalism, resulting in three broken doors, two broken windows and the destruction of an irreplaceable map, which police, security staff and Council staff reeling in frustration.

"It's nothing less than disheartening to see this behaviour repeating itself."

# Boneless Chicken Thighs Are the Star of Easy Dinners

To tired home cooks, the boneless, skinless chicken thigh can feel like a dinnertime paragon of protein. There are many reasons to love it: Unlike its more finicky cousin — the boneless, skinless chicken breast — the dark-meat thigh is able to retain its moisture even when blasted with high heat, so it's difficult to dry out. And with or without the bone, the cut, sometimes referred to as a "chicken thigh fillet", is easier and quicker to prepare, not to mention more flavourful.

It is, arguably, the best cut of chicken for everyday cooking.





#### Sticky Coconut Chicken and Rice

#### **INGREDIENTS**

750 grams boneless, skinless chicken thighs, each thigh cut in half

- 1/4 cup neutral oil, such as safflower or canola
- 2 teaspoons sea salt
- ½teaspoon black pepper
- 2 tablespoons minced fresh ginger
- 1tablespoon minced garlic
- 11/2 cups short-grain white rice, rinsed until water runs clear
- 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cups chicken broth
- 1 x 400g can full-fat coconut milk
- 1red pepper, cored, seeded and chopped (½-inch pieces)
- ½ cup roasted cashews, coarsely chopped
- 3 spring onions, green and white parts, thinly sliced
- 2 tablespoons coarsely chopped coriander
- Hot sauce, for serving

#### **PREPARATION**

Step 1 Heat oven to 180 degrees. Rub chicken with 1 tablespoon of oil, and season with 1 teaspoon of salt and ¼ teaspoon of pepper Step 2 In a large Dutch oven, heat 2 tablespoons of the oil over medium. Working in two batches, brown chicken, turning halfway, until no longer pink, around 5 minutes per batch. Transfer to a plate. Step 3 Add the remaining 1 tablespoon oil, the ginger and the garlic to the empty pot, and stir until fragrant, 30 seconds. Add rice and stir until evenly coated in the oil. Add broth, coconut milk,red pepper, cashews, scallions and the remaining 1 teaspoon salt and ¼ teaspoon pepper. Stir to lift up any browned bits on the bottom of the pot. Arrange chicken on top, add any accumulated juices from the plate and bring to a boil over high. Step 4 Cover and bake until all of the liquid is absorbed, rice is tender and chicken is cooked through, 25 minutes. Scatter cilantro over the chicken and rice, then divide among bowls. Serve with hot sauce

#### Chicken and Apricot Masala

1cup dried apricots

½ teaspoon ground chilli1teaspoon ground cumin

1teaspoon ground coriander

4cloves

4 cardamom pods, lightly crushed

1tablespoon minced garlic

1 tablespoon minced ginger

¼ cup peanut oil

1 cinnamon stick

2 onions, peeled and finely chopped

1 teaspoon salt


1/1/4 kg boneless, skinless chicken thighs, diced

- 4 medium tomatoes, cut into 1 cm dice
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste, diluted in ½ cup water
- 3 tablespoons chopped coriander leaves

#### **PREPARATION**

Step 1 Soak apricots overnight in 2 cups cold water, or cover with 2 cups hot water and soak until swollen and softened, 2 to 3 hours. Step 2 Prepare masala: In a small bowl, combine hot pepper flakes, cumin, coriander, cloves, cardamom, garlic and ginger. Add ¼ cup water, and stir to make a paste. Set aside. Step 3 In a large sauté pan over medium heat, heat oil and cinnamon stick. Add onions and salt, and sauté until onions begin to soften, 2 to 3 minutes. Add masala, and stir. Add chicken, and stir for about 5 minutes. Add apricots and their soaking liquid, diced tomatoes and diluted tomato paste. Step 4 Cover and simmer until chicken is cooked through, about 30 minutes. Check cooking liquid about halfway through; if chicken is covered with liquid, remove cover for remainder of cooking. Transfer to a large bowl, sprinkle with coriander and serve hot.



#### NAME OF HANMER TOWNSHIP

## NO RECONSIDERATION OF CHANGE

(From Our Parliamentary Reporter)
WELLINGTON, November 9.

The decision to change the name of Hanmer Springs to Hanmer could not be reconsidered, as all formalities had been complied with, and the final decision gazetted, said the Minister of Lands (Mr E. B. Corbett), in reply to representations by Mr W. H. Gillespie, member of Parliament for Hurunui.

Mr Gillespie asked that the township should continue to be called Hanmer Springs. He said many people had made representations to him asking for a reversion to the old name.

The original subdivision near the springs area was part of a larger block known as the Hanmer Plains Reserve, and in official records was referred to by both names, replied the Minister. The name used on departmental maps for many years had been Hanmer.

The Lands and Survey Department asked for clarification some years ago, and in 1939 the honorary Geographic Board decided on Hanmer, said the Minister. On the reconstitution of the Geographic Board in 1946, the decisions of the honorary board were officially adopted. Several objections were received, but the board decided that Hanmer was the more practical name.

Sir,—The proposed change of name from Hanmer Springs to Hanmer is lacking in purpose and will take away the very part which gives the place distinction and meaning. The fact that through ignorance, laziness, or a desire for brevity, individuals, firms, and boards use only half the name is no valid reason for pandering to this failing. I strongly object to reducing the name to Hanmer, and I think the general opinion is in agreement with this objection. It is a matter for regret that verbal objections have not so far become recorded ones, especially from such a body as the Hanmer Springs Progress League.—Yours, etc.,

#### Suggested Summary

- (a) The New Zealand Government Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2022 are better than anticipated a function mainly of tax revenue holding up well.
- (b) The New Zealand Government gross debt as at 30 June 2022 is around \$23,187 per New Zealand man, woman and child or

- around \$39,650 per New Zealand adult.
- (c) Two of New Zealand Ministers of Finance have played a major role in keeping the New Zealand Government debt to GDP down to a lowish level Michael Cullen and Bill Englis
- (d) Right now, climate control issues are not in the top three priorities for many countries.
- (e) It does look as though a number of countries may move into recession over the next six months.
- (f) The New Zealand Government needs to move the Income Tax brackets for individuals (these have been unchanged for some 10 years) from, say, 1 April 2023 to something like:

- (g) Right now, the world is short of sound leaders, in many countries
- (h) Some countries will not be able to cope financially with the equivalent of another event like COVID-19 New Zealand would be able to but another \$33 billion would push the New Zealand debt to GDP ratio up from 33% to around 42% and even then, only if the New Zealand GDP figure held up.
- (i) The Christchurch City Council has still not indicated how they are going to fund the stadium many Christchurch ratepayers do not have a money tree approximately \$200 million still needs to be found.
- (j) The financial rebuilding of Ukraine in due course will cost a fortune.
- (k) The energy issue in the UK and Europe is surprisingly bad both financially and politically and looks as though it will continue for some time
- (I) Almost all of the world's central banks moved too slowly with increasing interest rates, which is easy to say now but New Zealand needs its inflation rate to come down to no more than 3% probably within 9-12 months.
- (m) More and more countries are presently sliding into financial problems such as Turkey, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, UK and quite a number of countries in the continent of Africa.
- (n) The cost of food production must rise, as will the value of food some countries will have a food requirement problem but no money to pay for it the International Monetary Fund could easily find itself lending money for a country to purchase food which could be a never ending exercise.
- (o) In the year ended 20 June 2022, the New Zealand Government spent \$48.3 billion on welfare issues that is 34.1% of their total income in that year this looks high enough for a country that prides itself on being able to live within its income and to stand alone through thick and thin see the (PS) below for more specifics.

#### **PS:** As at 31 March 2022:

- (a) There were 348,339 people (from 18 years to 64 years) who received a means tested main benefit from the New Zealand Government that is 11.1% of the working age population of 3,138,189.
- (b) There were a further 850,000 people approximately receiving New Zealand National Superannuation.
- (c) Points (a) and (b) mean that just on 1,198,339 New Zealand people were receiving a New Zealand Government welfare benefit of some kind in the year ended 30 June 2022.




