

COVID INFORMATION

Household contacts who have not had COVID-19 in the past 29 days should RAT daily for five days from when the first case in the household tests positive. There is no need to restart daily testing if another household member tests positive



within the first person's 7-day isolation period, or within 10 days of when the first case is released from isolation. Household contacts should undertake further RAT testing if symptoms develop.

Each year thousands of fellow countrymen and countrywomen, and children (not to mention our international visitors), come to visit the stunning natural environment we call home; Hanmer Springs.


Did you know that we're about to welcome them with a perfectly straight concrete footpath? Straight lines, and a material, that are never found in nature.

fisherman's pie

Seafood is topped with creamy mash that blends into a rich sauce. Who says you shouldn't mix seafood and cheese?

Ingredients

- 150g hot-smoked salmon, broken into chunks
- 400g fish fillets, cut into 5cm chunks
- 400g good-quality marinara mix
- 2 cups frozen peas
- 2 tbsp finely shredded parsley
- 2 tbsp finely shredded dill
- 2 cups grated cheese
- Salt and white pepper, to season

Mornay sauce

60g butter

- 1 onion, finely diced
- 1/2 bulb fennel, finely diced
- ¼ cup plain flour
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cube fish or chicken stock
- 2 cups grated cheese

Mashed potatoes

- 1kg potatoes, peeled and cut into chunks
- 150ml thickened cream
- 50g butter
- Method
- 1. Heat your oven to 200C fan-forced (220C conventional). For the mornay sauce, heat a medium saucepan over medium heat and add butter, onion and fennel. Fry for about 2 minutes until softened. Add the flour and stir to cook for a further minute or two. Add the milk a little at a time and stir to create a thick sauce. Crumble in the stock cube and stir through the cheese until melted. Combine the sauce with the seafood, peas, parsley and dill, reserving a little of the herbs for garnish. Transfer to a large baking dish.
- 2. For the mashed potatoes, place the potatoes into a large saucepan and cover with cold water. Simmer for about 15 minutes until the potatoes are tender. Drain, return to the pot and mash with the cream and butter to a smooth mash. Season very well with salt and pepper.
- 3. Top the seafood filling with the mash and scatter with the cheese. Bake for 15-20 minutes until the cheese is melted and golden brown. Scatter with the remaining herbs and serve.

seafood chowder pot pies

Fish pie is about as comforting as food gets, and this simple no-fuss version is no exception.

Ingredients

600g peeled green prawns, chopped

200g snapper fillet, chopped

200g hot smoked salmon, flaked

2 tbsp plain flour

200ml creme fraiche

kernels from 2 corn cobs

1 leek, thinly sliced

1 long green chilli, finely chopped

1 tsp finely grated lemon zest

2/3 cup fish stock, warmed

4 sheets frozen butter puff pastry, thawed

1 egg, lightly beaten

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C fan-forced (200C conventional). Place the prawns, snapper, salmon and flour in a bowl and gently toss to coat. Add the creme fraiche, corn, leek, chilli and lemon zest and mix to combine.
- 2. Season with salt and pepper and divide between $4 \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$ cup capacity ovenproof dishes. Top with stock.
- 3. Cut the pastry sheets into circles that are 3cm larger than the ramekins. Brush the ramekin edge with beaten egg to help it stick, press a pastry on top, then brush the top of the pastry with egg. Sprinkle with pepper.
- 4. Place on a baking tray and bake for 30 minutes, then serve.







The future of tourism in the Hurunui District has been formalised in a Plan that aims to grow and maintain the industry in a way that benefits communities, iwi, businesses and the environment.

The Hurunui Tourism Destination Management Plan (DMP) was adopted at the Hurunui Tourism Committee Meeting on Tuesday September 27th.

A Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) initiative, it is aimed at guiding the future of tourism in communities.

Shane Adcock, Sales and Marketing manager for Hanmer Springs Thermal Pools & Spa and Hurunui Tourism, said as part of the funding provided by the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE), Hurunui Tourism was tasked with developing a DMP for the District – as were Districts all around New Zealand.

Public community sessions were held in May, alongside online submissions as well as discussions with a range of stakeholders. Adcock said common themes emerged, which helped to shape the first draft of the Plan. Overall, feedback reflected that the community and the environment came first, followed by the need to make the most of the district's natural assets and ensure they are here for future generations to enjoy.

Adcock said the Hurunui District has a historical connection to supporting wellbeing.

"So perhaps it is unsurprising that the sentiment that came out of the community sessions, and the overall vision for the DMP, is 'Hurunui is a place where visitors come to lift their spiritual, mental and physical wellbeing.' In turn their visit enriches the health and wealth of our communities and environments." The first draft was presented to the Board in August, followed by further community feedback which created the final Plan draft which was adopted this week.

The Plan's Strategic Priorities are to; Become an Iconic Self-drive Destination, Enhance The Visitor Experience, develop Targeted Destination Marketing, and achieve Effective Destination Management.

"It's about protecting and sharing what we treasure," said Adcock.

Mayor Marie Black was delighted with the support for the Plan, for a District that has been welcoming people for generations. "Through creating the Destination Management Plan, we can better appreciate that a vital part of our future is to continue to embrace a holistic approach and grow our sustainable visitor economy."

Mayor Black added that in recognising the unique features of the Hurunui District, there is also the recognition of the importance of manaakitanga, to embrace the District's visitors along with demonstrating the values of kaitiakitanga. "In this way we will ensure we achieve the balance of our people, our communities and our environment."

This Destination Management Plan has been developed through extensive discussions with the Hurunui community, and with partners and groups from within and outside the District. Mayor Black wished to acknowledge all who participated or were involved in the development of the Plan, in particular, the members of the advisory group who worked closely with Hurunui Tourism staff: Chevy Allen and Clint McConchie – Ngāti Kuri, Darron Charity – Select Contracts, James Caygill – Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency, Nicki Murray – Hurunui District Landcare Group, Nicola Kirby – Hurunui District Council, Briar Nash – Christchurch International Airport, Ian Wightwick – Department of Conservation, and consultants TRC Tourism in bringing this plan together.

"Whilst the formation of this Plan has been driven by Hurunui Tourism and Hurunui District Council, the Plan is owned by the District."

Facts, The Hurunui District:

Geography: It begins at Leithfield Beach and extends to the Conway River south of the Kaikoura Peninsula. It is bordered on the west by the Southern Alps and on the east by the Pacific Ocean.

Main centres: Amberley and Hanmer Springs.

Population: 12,5581 people, an almost even split between males and females, including 1,074 Māori which is 8.5% of the population.



Finding a rural property needs to be easy

Locating a rural property must be an easy job for emergency services, and one solution is the Rural Address Property Identification (RAPID) system.

These are the blue plates with white numbers, mounted at the entrances of rural properties throughout the Hurunui District.

Culverden Fire Chief Craig Ritchie on behalf of Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ) had worked alongside Hurunui District Council and dedicated an abundance of hours over the past 12 months to make sure rural people have the correct RAPID number at their gate.

To date, Ritchie has put a particular focus on the Amuri Basin and wider Culverden area, its dairy farming hub creating many shared driveways with multiple dwellings which can make location identification challenging. Nearly 600 RAPID numbers, which are based on the distance to a property entrance from a clearly defined reference point, have been assessed so far in the Amuri Basin, which is around 70% of the Basin's total.

So far, about 95% of the rural properties checked have needed assistance with the RAPID number. "We can't just give someone a number without checking it's true and correct, therefore following up on the progress is a big part of the job," said Ritchie.

Council's planner Scott Rose has been working with Ritchie, and said many

external agencies will benefit from the RAPID number system, such as LINZ, MainPower and the Police.

"It's a good accurate location system for everyone, whether you're telling a friend where you live, mail is being delivered, you're updating your medical records, or you have an emergency," said Rose. Bill Suckling lives on Inniskillen Drive, a newly named right-of-way off Isolated Hill Rd on the Amuri Plain.

Up this right-of-way are 10 dwellings, three dairy sheds across three farms, and 10 RAPID numbers. Suckling has owned Inniskillen Dairy Limited for 17 years, and saw huge benefit in having this numbering system revised recently.

"We used to all have the same RAPID number, nobody had any idea where they were unless there was the name of the farm."

Ritchie said FENZ also responds to St John 'purple' calls, which occur when the incident is immediately life-threatening, and the tell tail signs of danger such as smoke or flames are not always evident.

Rob Field lives in Hurunui and has been involved with St John since 2002, has a RAPID number on his own gate, and encourages all rural property owners in the District to make sure they have one too. "The key issue is multiple dwellings on one accessway, even with the best Google Maps you are still scrubbing around trying to find out which sleepout or house the patient is in," said Field. Ritchie said working together as a District is key.

"I believe the collaborative approach is the best approach, there is still a lot of work to be done."


