Thai favourite to make at home

With the warm weather upon us, this is the time to try making Thai food at home — the crunch of peanuts, the zing of chilli and lime leaf. Start with this Pad Thai masterclass

The Ultimate Pad Thai

Ingredients

- 1 tbsp dried shrimps
- 200g dried rice stick noodles
- 3 tbsp Thai fish sauce
- 2 tbsp tamarind puree or lime juice
- 1 tbsp tomato sauce
- ½ tsp dried chilli flakes or 1 tsp chilli sambal
- 1 tbsp shaved palm sugar or brown sugar
- 4 tbsp vegetable oil
- 250g boneless chicken thigh, sliced (or leftover roast chicken)
- 8-12 green prawns, peeled
- 3 shallots, finely sliced
- 100g smoked tofu, diced
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 10 garlic chives, chopped
- 200g beansprouts, rinsed and drained
- 1 cup coriander sprigs
- 2 tbsp roasted beer nuts or peanuts, lightly crushed
- 1 lime, quartered

Method

- 1. Cover the dried shrimps in boiling water and soak for 30 minutes then drain, reserving two tablespoons of the water. Cover the noodles with hot tap water and leave for 20 minutes or until you can twirl a noodle around your finger. Drain and rinse.
- 2. Mix together the fish sauce, tamarind puree, tomato sauce, chilli flakes or sambal and sugar.
- 3. Heat two tablespoons of oil in a wide, flat-bottomed frypan. When hot, add the chicken, tossing well over high heat until it turns white. Add the prawns and fry briskly for one minute until just cooked. Transfer chicken and prawns to a bowl.
- 4. Add one tablespoon of oil to the pan and fry the shallots, tofu and dried shrimps for 30 seconds. Add the noodles, tossing well.
- 5. Push the noodles to one side of the pan.

Add the remaining one tablespoon of oil to the empty space and add beaten eggs. Let set a little then cover with noodles. Return the chicken and prawns to the pan, add the sauce mix, and most of the beansprouts and coriander. Toss well over high heat. Add the shrimp soaking water if dry.

6. Divide between warm plates, and scatter with remaining beansprouts and coriander, crushed peanuts and lime wedges. Serve with fork, spoon or if you prefer, with chopsticks.

Tips

- Use a wide, flat-bottomed frypan rather than a wok.
 The wider surface area helps evaporate the liquid and stops the noodles going gummy.
- Don't soak the noodles for too long or they will fall to pieces when cooked. Cover with hot tap water and leave for 20 minutes, until you can twirl a noodle around your finger.

LIFE IS REALLY JUST A BUNDLE OF NUMBERS

Let's have a look at a few:

1. You aim to live to, say, 93 years of age - this means you will:

Live for 1,116 months.

Which is 33,480 days.

Probably clean your teeth 66,960 times.

2. Your life span may be:

 18 years with Mum and Dad
 (19.35%)

 49 years working your tail off
 (52.69%)

 26 years more or less retired
 (27.96%)

 93 years
 (100.00%)

3. If you earn the New Zealand median wage/salary for that 49 years this will represent (in today's dollars of around \$62,500/year) \$3,062,500 Plus

26 years earning, say, 60% of

the median wage \$975,000 Possible gross lifetime earnings \$4,037,500

(Note: This figure is based on you earning less than the New Zealand median wage for 24.5 years and more than median wage for 24.5 years.)

4. You travel 12,000 km/year on average in your car for 49 years 588,000 km

And travel, say, 8,000 km/year

for the last 26 years 208,000 km

Lifetime car travel - spread perhaps over say 10 cars - that is a car replacement

every 7.5 years 796,000 km

- **5.** It is 2022 and you are 24 years old you and your employer work together very well and he says if you stay with me for the next 46 years until you retire I will increase your salary by 4% a year every year. Your present gross salary is \$62,500. What will his gross salary be when he is 70 years old with his employer \$160,000.
- **6.** The June 2022 number of unemployed people in New Zealand was around 96,000 if they were all fully employed at, say, \$26.00/hour what would the overall cost to their employers somewhere be: 96,000 people x 40 hours per week x 52 weeks per year x \$26 = \$5.191 billion a lot of potential earnings lost.
- 7. You and your partner are working hard, you are both 20 years old. You purchase two bottles of wine a week and 14 cups of coffee a week (that is each purchase one cup a day) at the local café. This continues from the age of 20 years to 93 years old. What have they spent over the 73 years:

Wine (2 x \$15 x 52 x 73) \$113,880 Coffee (14 x \$5.50 x 52 x 73) \$292,292 Total over the 73 years \$406,172 (Approximately half a house value.)

- **8.** You and your partner are aged 25 years and have saved \$15,000 and want to delay a house purchase until they are 65 years old because they have very mobile jobs. They also have no Bank of Mum and Dad. What is the minimum they will need (in today's dollars) to save to purchase a house costing \$800,000 in 45 years' time and also have \$600,000 to invest to help their retirement income over the final, say, 28 years? They will need to save and invest \$14,000/year at a compound return rate of 4% for the 45 years, such that their investment balance tax paid at 65 years of age will be \$1,405,775 not impossible but would need discipline.
- **9.** The USA has a Senate with 100 members (24 women and 76 men) and a House of Representatives comprising 435 voting members (123 women and 312 men). That is a total Government of 535 men and women.

The USA current population is: 332,403,650, such that the average number of USA voters per politician is: $332,403,650 \div 535 = 621,315$.

The current population of New Zealand is: 5,124,100 with 120 Members of Parliament, so the average number of NZ voters per politician is: $5,124,100 \div 120 = 42,701$. A big difference in the politicians to population ratio between the two countries.

(There are considerable housing and travel allowances also associated with these salaries - in many cases their annual income increases significantly after their tenure as Prime Minister from conferences, seminars, publications and consultancy work.)



The Snake Man


My grandfather used to live in India. He often told me this story and I fell in love with it. I hope one day to visit India and visit the places he used to live.

Antarctic Heritage Trust



Antarctic Heritage Trust is a organization that goes around giving kids a chance to see inside Sir Edmund Hillary's Hut. This hut was built when Sir Edmund Hillary was in Antarctica, crossing the South Pole.

The website has a little introduction - "Scott Base's oldest building, a hut built by a Sir Edmund Hillary-led team, Is about to open doors to the public - virtually." Users can explore five different rooms where you can click on glowing blue circles to get more information. All of the Antarctic Heritage Trust's projects are on VR headsets. VR is short for virtual reality, Virtual reality needs to have a headset, and 2 remotes. When we put the headset on, we were in the snow with an instruction board in front of us. 
