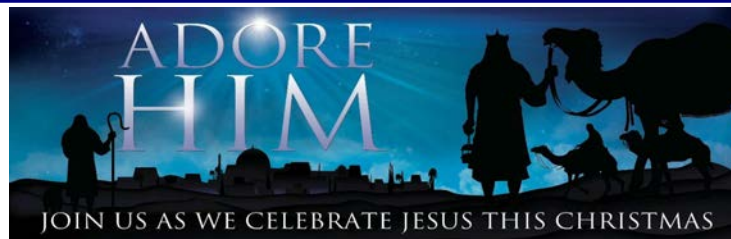

Extension of COVID-19 second boosters

Māori and Pacific Peoples aged 40-49 are now eligible for a second booster to provide additional protection against serious illness from COVID-19.

Many eligible people still need to get their vaccinations up to date: First boosters continue to be available for everyone over 16 years old. Second boosters continue to be available for everyone over 50 years old. Everyone is encouraged to stay up to date with their recommended vaccinations to protect from the risk of serious illness, hospitalisation or death from COVID-19.

If you call our clinic phone out of hours, your call is always answered by a registered nurse who will assess your needs, offer advice or, if required, pass the call to our on-call clinician. It can take several minutes to answer the phone so please be patient and hold, and follow the voice prompts carefully

Egg Dishes

the old saying goes, 'if you have an egg you have a meal'



Prawn Egg Foo Yung

There's a different version of Guangdong's famous egg foo yung in every country it's spread to, and that's a lot. This Japanese "ebitama" version is with fluffy, pillowy egg and sweet-sour savoury gravy

Ingredients

200g raw, peeled prawns
6 eggs
¼ tsp salt, plus extra to season
a good pinch of white pepper
3 tbsp peanut oil
3 thin spring onions, finely sliced

Sauce

150ml chicken stock or water
1 tbsp soy sauce
1 tbsp oyster sauce
1 tbsp rice vinegar
2 tbsp sugar

1½ tsp cornflour, mixed with 2 tbsp cold water

Method

1. Butterfly the prawns by cutting backs almost completely through and flattening the bodies with the flat of your knife. In a small bowl, beat the eggs with the salt and white pepper and set aside.
2. To make the sauce, combine the stock, soy sauce, oyster sauce, vinegar and sugar in a small saucepan and bring to a simmer, stirring to dissolve the sugar. Add the cornflour mixture in a thin stream, stirring vigorously, until the sauce thickens to a silky consistency. Keep the sauce warm while you prepare the eggs.
3. Heat the wok over medium heat and add the oil around the edges. Add the prawns to the wok with a good pinch of salt. Toss the prawns for about two minutes until just cooked through. Pour the beaten egg around the edges of the wok and allow it to run to the centre. Immediately draw your wok tool or spatula a few times through the egg to form soft folds, like scrambled egg. Turn the egg and prawns out from the wok while the egg is still quite runny (it will continue to set off the heat) and pour over the sauce. Scatter with the sliced spring onions and serve immediately.



Shakshuka

This is a great, hearty breakfast meal, particularly if you have a few ripe tomatoes lying around. Cook and serve this dish in a small cast-iron skillet to avoid making a mess.

Ingredients

4 large ripe tomatoes or 410g can chopped tomatoes
1 tbsp olive oil
1/4 brown onion, diced
1 small jalapeño chilli, sliced
1/2 small green capsicum
1 tsp paprika
1 tsp ground cumin
salt and pepper, to taste
2 free-range eggs
1 tbsp flat-leaf parsley, finely chopped

Method

If using fresh tomatoes, blanch them for 3 minutes, then peel, seed and chop them, and set aside.

Over a medium flame, heat oil in skillet, add onion and cook until transparent.

Add chilli and green capsicum, and cook for 4 minutes.

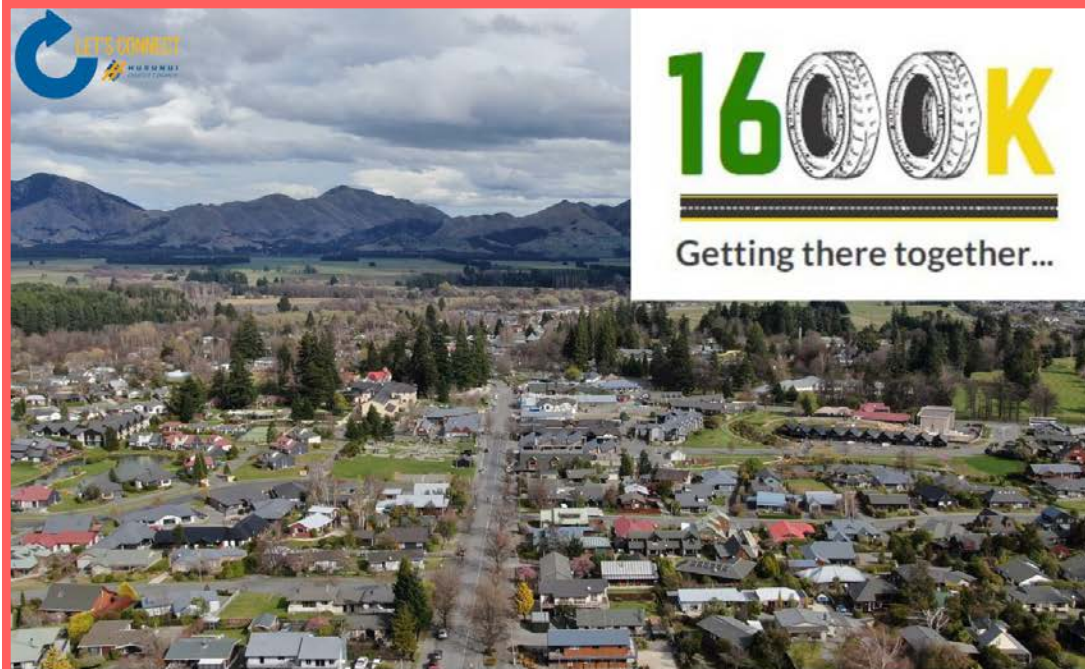
Add tomatoes, paprika and cumin, and cook for 5 minutes, allowing mixture to reduce.

Add salt and pepper to taste.

Make 2 small depressions in mixture and crack eggs into them.

Cover and cook until eggs are done.

Stop and think about speed

What do you think about the future of speeds on the roads in the Hurunui District?

The Council is keen to hear what you think, using your input to formulate an Interim Speed Management Plan for 2023-2024.

Council's Roading Manager Kushla Tapper said having a Plan does not result in immediate changes. A Plan will provide Council with a new, more flexible framework to allow alterations to speeds as they are required, including outside and surrounding the 13 school in the Hurunui District.

"As well as reviewing speed limit changes road-by-road, the focus is around broader options such as speeds around

schools, 'challenging' routes, and areas with high numbers of vulnerable users," said Tapper.

Tapper said anyone can provide input using the 1600K Community Driven Road Safety Map which was launched three years ago across the District and was a big success.

"If you think there are areas or roads that need to be addressed or reviewed, or if you want to let us know what you're happy with and want to keep, please get in touch."

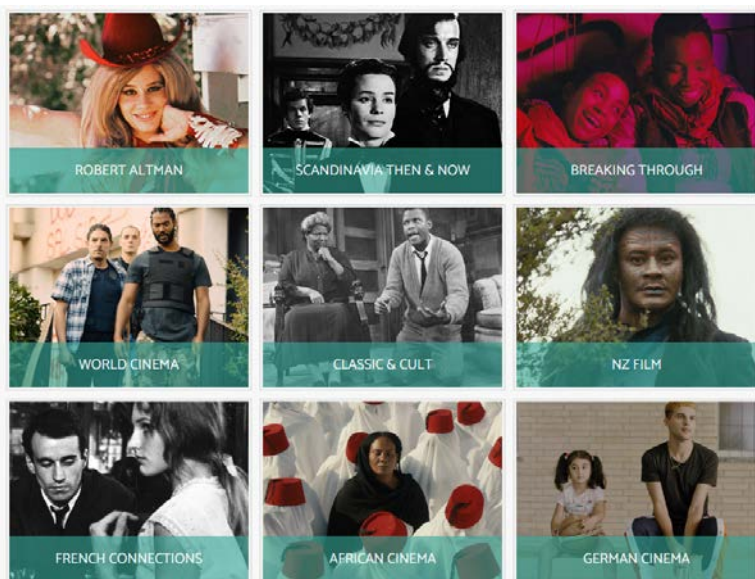
The NZ Film Society plays an important role in bringing us a diverse range of international and arthouse films not shown in public cinemas.

The Real Problem Is Not Just Fossil Fuels

What's the matter here? Why has so little progress been made on climate change, even as the dangers have become ever more apparent?

According to one school of thought, the problem has to do with incentives. There's a great deal of money to be made selling fossil fuels—just in the first quarter of 2022, twenty five of the world's largest oil-and-gas producers announced profits of close to a hundred billion dollars—and still more money to be made by burning fossil fuels to make stuff to sell, from sunglasses to steel girders. Meanwhile, the costs of climate change can be fobbed off on someone else. To use the technical term, they are a “negative externality.” In the words of the Stern Review, a report commissioned by the British government in 2005, climate change “is the greatest and widest-ranging market failure ever seen.”

By this account, the obvious solution is to realign the incentives—to internalise the externalities. If the cost of the damage caused by a ton of CO₂ was borne by the business (or individual) responsible for emitting that ton, then the business (or individual) would be motivated to cut back. “A carbon tax offers the most cost-effective lever to reduce carbon emissions at the scale and speed that is necessary,” a 2019 statement signed by thirty-five hundred economists, including twenty-eight Nobel Prize winners, declared. Such a tax would move “the invisible

hand of the marketplace to steer economic actors towards a low-carbon future.”

According to a second school of thought, the trouble runs a whole lot deeper. Our political system is dominated by corporate money in general and fossil-fuel money in particular. (Last year, the oil-and-gas industry reportedly spent a hundred and twenty million dollars lobbying Washington, and it probably spent a great deal more via front groups, not to mention in other countries). It's therefore naïve to imagine that policies that cut into fossil-fuel profits will be enacted. And even if they were, they wouldn't solve the essential problem, which is that the “invisible hand” always grasps for more. If it's not more oil, it will be more lithium to build batteries, and if it's not more lithium it will be more cobalt, mined from the bottom of the sea.

“When it comes to global warming, we know that the real problem is not just fossil fuels—it is the logic of endless growth that is built into our economic system,” Jason Hickel, an economic anthropologist at the University of Barcelona, has written. Climate change can't be dealt with using the tools of capitalism, because it is a product of capitalism. It can be dealt with only by throwing off capitalism in favour of something else—a system aimed not at growth but at “de-growth.”

“The difficult truth is that, to prevent climate and ecological catastrophe, we need to level down” is how the British environmental writer George Monbiot recently put it.

A third line of thought—perhaps too bleak and unpopular to be called a school—is that, if big change is hard, bigger change is even harder. How are we going to build a whole new economic system if we can't even enact a carbon tax?

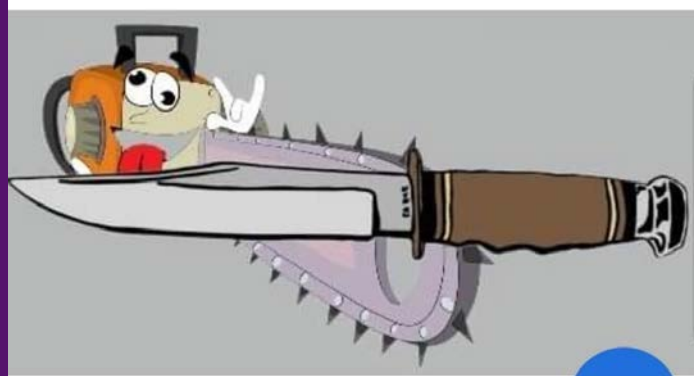

New Exhibition Open at ACAC Gallery

TABLET TO BE ERECTED AT HANMER

To commemorate the work done in the development of the Hanmer township and district by Mr Duncan Rutherford, a bronze tablet will be unveiled at Hanmer next Wednesday by the Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. G. W. Forbes. Mr Rutherford, whose death occurred in 1917, had been a resident of the district for many years, working energetically for the advancement of Hanmer.

When the Hanmer Progress League was formed this year, it was felt that some public recognition should be made of Mr Rutherford's unselfish devotion to the interests and progress of the town, and the league decided to erect a tablet to his memory.

The tablet, which will be placed on the rock at the summit of Majuba Hill (Conical Hill), bears the following inscription:

"In grateful memory, Duncan Rutherford, of Leslie Hills, 1853-1917, and of his untiring activities in the development and progress of this district. Erected by the Hanmer Progress League, 1933."

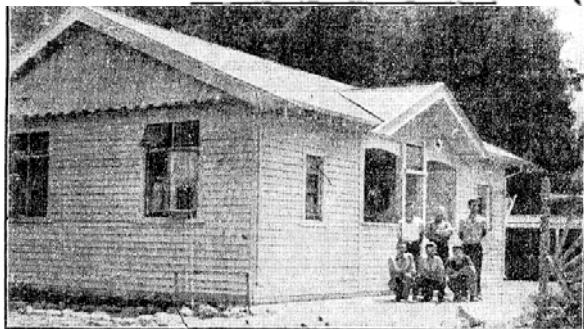
CHRISTCHURCH, June 16.

Mr A. W. Rutherford, M.H.R., has addressed a long letter to Sir Joseph Ward on the subject of Hanmer Springs, requesting the Government to put a sum on the Estimates next session for the following purposes:—Water supply, drainage, electric light, improved train service, improved communication between Culverden and Hanmer, and a recreation ground. He adds: "Vast sums have been spent by the Government in developing and making attractive the North Island thermal springs and their surroundings, but comparatively little has been expended at Hanmer. Hanmer is to the South Island what Rotorua is to the North Island; and I venture to ask you, therefore, to at least repair to some extent the neglect of the past."

Sir,—The proposal to convert the Queen Mary Hospital at Hanmer Springs into a prisoners' detention centre is interesting, for Hanmer Springs would be the only place in the South Island where the rehabilitation of prisoners could be assisted by providing hot mineral pools, pony trekking, forest walks, golf, tennis, ski-ing, and escape to the hills. Should the proposals come about, I trust that the Justice Department will advertise the conditions of entry so that all may participate.—Yours, etc.,

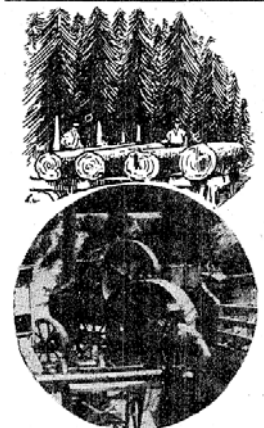

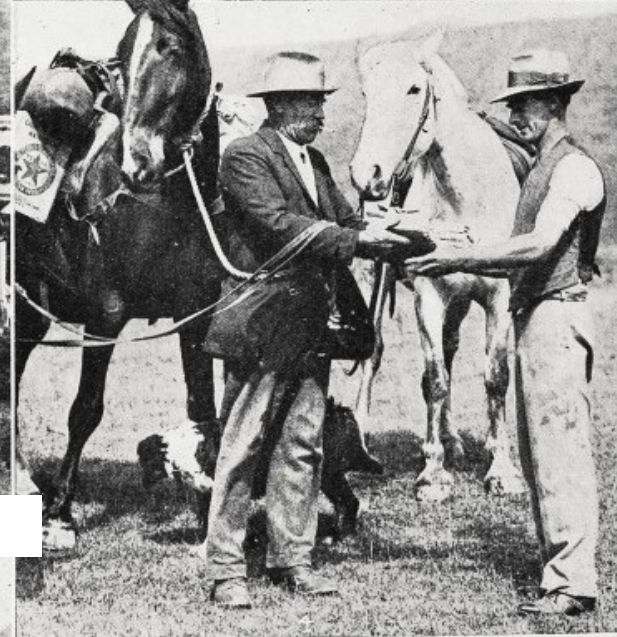

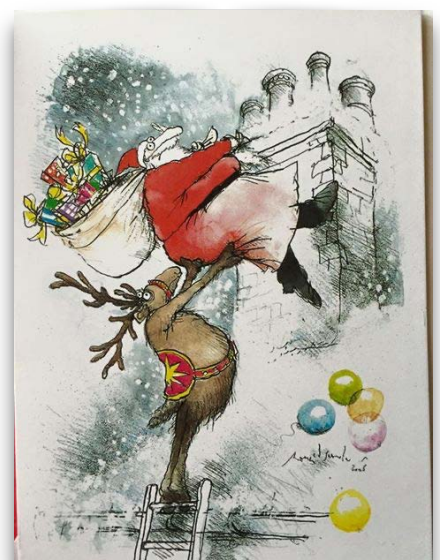
