Hi everybody,

Hopefully you've had a great beginning to 2023 and you've managed to squeeze in some rest and relaxation and spent some quality time with friends and family. It's been a busy festive period for the Hanmer Springs Police team; with lots of visitors to town and vehicles on the road there's been plenty going on. Just some of the events keeping us occupied:

- A two car crash on State Highway 7 just north of the Hanmer Springs Road intersection on the 28th December. All occupants very lucky to walk away without injuries.
- At 10pm on the 31st December a vehicle crashed into a dwelling house on Jollies Pass Road. No one was in the house at the time. A 22 year old man was processed and charged for driving with excess breath alcohol. The occupants of the vehicle received minor injuries with one person transported to hospital.
- Around the same time a male on a dirt bike failed to stop for Police on Amuri Avenue.
- At 2am on the 1st January a 21 year old man was arrested on Conical Hill Road for smashing a window. He was charged with wilful damage and resisting arrest.
- Hanmer staff have been supporting the investigation into the unexplained death on Dalbeg Road in Amberley since the 3rd January.

As always, with the warm summer months we see an influx of visitors to our town. The vast majority come to enjoy everything Hanmer has to offer. Unfortunately there is always a small number of undesirable people visiting Hanmer too, who come to take advantage. Please don't get complacent and become a victim. Get into the habit of keeping vehicles and properties secure and make it difficult for thieves. Always report suspicious behaviour to Police at the time. We need to know about it!!

This summer, road safety is a major focus for the Hurunui Police. You can expect to see a Police presence on the roads in and around Hanmer Springs enforcing the rules and encouraging good driver behaviour. Remember; ALWAYS wear your seatbelt, no matter how far you are travelling and for how long.

If you are enjoying a few drinks, ensure you have an alternative option for getting yourself home safely afterwards.

Drive phone free, stay focused on the job at hand and avoid distractions like cell phones while driving.

Know the speed limits and keep to them.

If you see poor driving behaviour, report it to Police using *555.

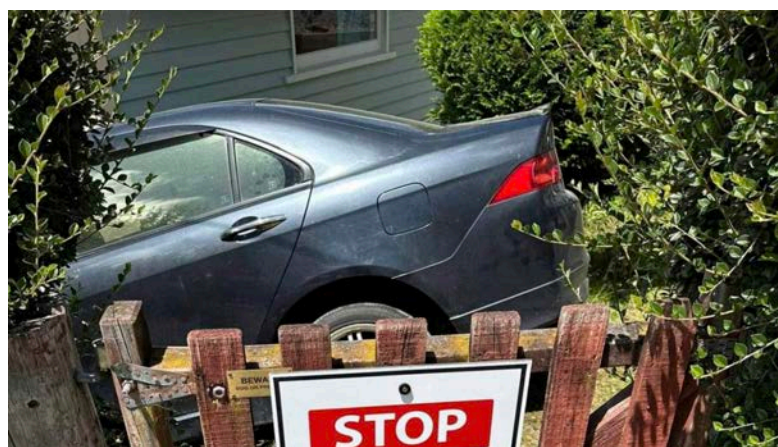

If the incident you require Police for is happening now, call **111**. If the incident has happened and you wish to report it to Police, call **105**. Alternately, lodge your complaint online using the 105 online tool on the NZ Police website, or by using the Rural Lookout Police Application on your phone. Whichever way you choose to contact us, your message will get through, and if requested, someone will contact you as soon as they are available to do so.

We'd like to thank the community for the continued support we receive. We simply couldn't do this job effectively without it. We can't be everywhere all the time, so we really do rely on you as our eyes and ears 24/7.

fried eggplant and feta fattoush

Often a breakfast dish in the Middle East designed to make use of leftover pita, this recipe can easily be turned into a hearty evening meal.

Ingredients

¾ cup olive oil
2 Lebanese-style pita, cut into 3cm squares
1 large eggplant, cut into 2cm cubes
300g cherry tomatoes, halved
2 Lebanese cucumbers, finely chopped
1 red capsicum, seeded and finely chopped
½ red onion, finely sliced
1 cup loosely packed flat-leaf parsley, coarsely chopped
1 cup loosely packed mint leaves, coarsely chopped
6 radishes, thinly sliced on a mandoline
1 tbsp sumac
juice of ½ lemon
½ tsp honey
100g feta

Method

1. Heat a medium frying pan over medium heat and add the oil.
2. Fry the pita squares until crisp, then remove from the pan and drain. Drain oil from the pan until about ¼ cup remains and fry the eggplant for about 8 minutes, stirring occasionally until well browned and soft. Remove from the pan and set aside to cool with the pita.
3. Combine the pita and eggplant with all the remaining ingredients except the feta in a large bowl and toss to combine. The eggplant and pita will add quite a bit of oil to the mixture so you shouldn't need extra, but add some if necessary. Transfer to a serving plate, and crumble over the feta to serve.



Simple Potato Flatbread

Three ingredients. No knead. Soft and pliable. There's a reason they call this a magic potato flatbread.

Ingredients

150g (1 cup) plain flour
¼ tsp cooking salt
240g (1 cup) mashed potato, at room temperature or fridge-cold
1 tbsp melted unsalted butter

Method

1. To make the dough, use your hands to mix together the flour and salt in bowl. Make a well, add potato and butter, then mix to incorporate. It will seem dry and crumbly at first but will eventually come together to form a smooth ball of dough.
2. On a lightly floured work surface, roll the dough into a 20cm log, then cut into 8 equal pieces. Roll each piece into a ball using your hands, then use a rolling pin to flatten into 15cm rounds.
3. Preheat a cast-iron skillet (no oil) on high heat until you see wisps of smoke. Place a flatbread in the pan and cook for 1 minute until it bubbles up in places and the underside has dark brown spots. Flip and cook the other side for 45 seconds to 1 minute until there are brown spots, then remove.
4. Repeat with remaining dough, stacking the flatbreads on top of each other. Best served warm – they can be reheated in the microwave or in a 150C oven (for 15 minutes wrapped in foil).

Leapfrogging.

In 1947, the year India gained its independence, telephones were a rarity in the nation; there were fewer than a hundred thousand in the entire country. In the decades that followed, they remained scarce; as late as 1989, India had just four million phones for eight hundred and fifty million people.

Three-quarters of rural villages lacked any phone connection at all; the official wait time for a line was almost four years, and, when one was finally installed, service was often dismal.

Then, practically all at once, phones were ringing everywhere. In 1994, the country auctioned off its first round of cellular licenses. The auction process was deemed “a mess”; nevertheless, cell service exploded. By 2010, six hundred million Indians were subscribers. (The country’s 2011 census revealed that more households had phones than had toilets.)

In 2015, cell subscriptions hit a billion. India effectively skipped fixed-line phones and went straight to wireless, a process that’s become known as leapfrogging. Today, India is home to 1.4 billion people. They consume a thousand watts per person, less than one-tenth of what Americans use.

Were India to follow the fossil-fuel-slicked development path pursued by China, Europe, and the U.S., the result would be planetary disaster. Yet asking India to forgo prosperity on the ground that prosperous nations have already consumed too much is obviously impossible. Fewer than half of all households in the country own a refrigerator. Only one in ten owns a computer. And, even though temperatures in Delhi reached a hundred and twenty-one degrees this past spring, just one in four has air-conditioning.

Leapfrogging represents a way—maybe the best way,

maybe the only way—out of this dilemma. India is sun-drenched. Instead of building out a grid that relies on coal and natural gas, it could shift to one that relies on solar power and iron-air batteries. Most Indians have never owned a car, so the country could skip over gas-guzzlers and go straight to E.V.s. Ditto for flying. The vast majority of Indians have never been on a plane; the first one they board could be an electric aircraft like the Alice. The same holds true even for stoves. More than five hundred million people in India still cook with wood or dung; instead of transitioning through gas, they could jump straight to induction. In other words, electrify everything!

“India is in a unique position to pioneer a new model for low-carbon, inclusive growth,” the International Energy Agency recently declared. And what goes for India, the I.E.A. noted, also goes for “a whole group of energy-hungry developing economies.”

India “hasn’t contributed much to the climate problem,” Ashish Gulagi, a researcher at Finland’s Lappeenranta University of Technology, told me. “But it can contribute to the solution.”

What a Load of Rubbish

Happy New Year to you all, residents and visitors.

The garbage situation in Hanmer has been perplexing me all holiday. Not the most savoury of topics but hugely important nonetheless. Here are a few personal thoughts and ramblings.

The first issue was the camper van and toilet disposal site on Hanmer Springs Road as you come into our village, being out of use. The two dumps were both blocked. The suspicion was that it was caused by disposable nappies. Contacting staff and getting staff out over the holiday period was difficult. Thankfully the situation was resolved and on Friday 6th further clearance work was undertaken.

I was dismayed that the recycling facilities were removed from the village centre, but equally HDC staff and contractors should not have to sort nappies and human waste from recycling. What is the answer? Should we provide more bins in the village? I particularly like the bins in Reefton that have historical details on the sides along with advertising. However, the more bins that are provided will probably incentivise people to not buy the

HDC rubbish and recycling bags. Indeed, this may be a problem where individuals are abusing the rubbish and recycling facilities.

The Transfer Station is opening on reduced hours due to a lack of personnel. Until recently there was little interest in the vacancy there. However, there has been interest shown and we hope for a successful appointment and a return to normal hours in the not too distant future.

A big shout to our Rubbish and Recycling collectors who were faced with unprecedented amounts of rubbish and worked well beyond their normal hours on a Public Holiday

Rubbish and waste are one of those "out of sight, out of mind" subjects. We all generate waste and rubbish but its disposal is often viewed as someone else's problem. It is often dirty, smelly and can be a health hazard so most of us do not want to be confronted with the problems generated or get our hands dirty. Inevitably the greatest problems always seem to occur at the most inconvenient times. There is, in my mind, an issue of communication and education when it comes to waste disposal in the village. Soiled disposable nappies were commonly found by our tamariki when we cleaned up the village as part of the school involvement in the "keep New Zealand Beautiful" week. Nappies are a common thread I fear.

How do we get the "buy in" from all our residents, business owners and visitors. I know Hanmer Holiday Homes record of dealing with rubbish and recycling is second to none. Thank you and well done, leading by example.

MOTORING TO HANMER.

MR. T. E. DONNE'S EXPERIENCES 1906

Yesterday, at about midday, Mr T. E. Donne arrived from Hanmer by motor-car, after having spent a couple of days at the health resort. When seen by a reporter Mr Donne stated that Hanmer had but a few visitors at present but it had a very good season and the place was looking in excellent condition. He had enjoyed a pleasant motor-car journey to and from Hanmer. Mr Bockaert had driven up a party of five in a large Darracq car and had accomplished the run from Christchurch to Hanmer in four hours forty minutes, even though some time had been lost through the car being stuck in the Hanmer River. Owing to the colour of the water the driver of the car had been unable to gauge the depth of the ford, and before anything could be done to avert it, the car had been stuck in the river, with the water running in and out of the body of the car. A team of horses from a waggon had given friendly help and dragged the car out of the water. The time from Christchurch to Culverden was two hours thirty minutes, and from Culverden to Waiau forty minutes, from Waiau to Hanmer thirty minutes. The return journey had been accomplished at a faster rate. From Hanmer to Culverden the car occupied thirty-eight minutes and the run from the Hanmer River to Cathedral Square took three hours fifteen minutes.

"I think that is a record," said Mr Donne. "The roads between Christchurch and Hanmer are splendid for motoring; in fact, I think the road is the best for motors in New Zealand, and it would be considerably improved if one or two of the rivers were bridged. It would then be possible to go to, and return from, Hanmer, in one evening."

The reporter asked Mr Donne if there was a possibility of the bridges being erected in the near future, and he replied that he thought that they would be built, but he did not know when.

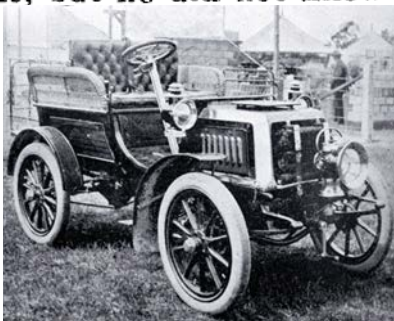

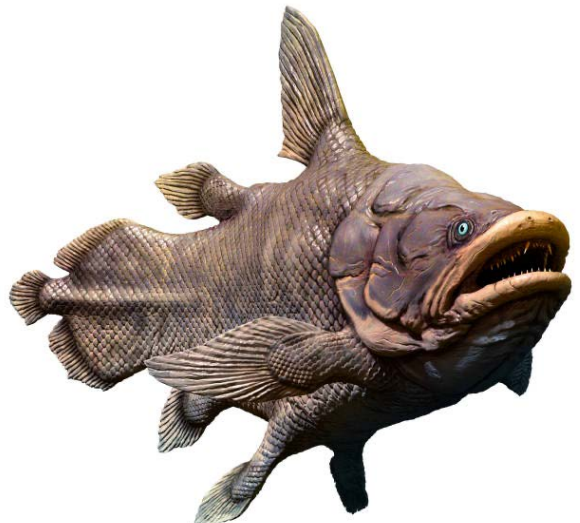

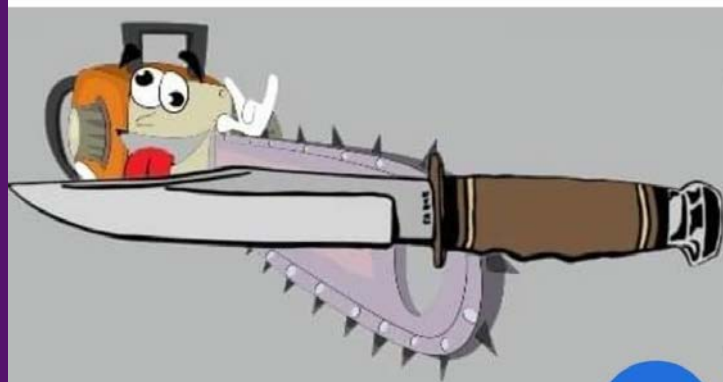

Symbol	Acronym	Full name and uses
	PET	Polyethylene terephthalate - Fizzy drink bottles and frozen ready meal packages.
	HDPE	High-density polyethylene - Milk and washing-up liquid bottles
	PVC	Polyvinyl chloride - Food trays, cling film, bottles for squash, mineral water and shampoo.
	LDPE	Low density polyethylene - Carrier bags and bin liners.
	PP	Polypropylene - Margarine tubs, microwaveable meal trays.
	PS	Polystyrene - Yoghurt pots, foam meat or fish trays, hamburger boxes and egg cartons, vending cups, plastic cutlery, protective packaging for electronic goods and toys.
	Other	Any other plastics that do not fall into any of the above categories. For example melamine, often used in plastic plates and cups.
