grilled salmon with tomato and oregano dressing

This salmon dish is perfect at this time of year with fresh, just-boiled asparagus. If you don't like salmon, try scallops, prawns or any other fish that grills well. The dressing is similar to salmoriglio and is something of an all-rounder, matching well with both fish and poultry, even steak. Soup it up with chopped anchovies, capers and olives. Vegans can grill eggplant or zucchini, or both, in place of fish.

Ingredients

4 x 180g salmon steaks, skin on

For the dressing

½ bunch oregano, leaves picked, washed and dried

¼ bunch flat-leaf parsley, leaves picked, washed and dried

1 tomato, finely chopped

1 garlic clove, crushed and minced

finely grated zest and juice of 1 lemon

½ tsp salsa macha*

½ cup extra virgin olive oil

Method

1. To make the dressing, mince the herbs on a chopping board with a very sharp knife, add them to a mixing bowl, then add all other ingredients. Combine well and check the seasoning, adding more lemon, salt or pepper as necessary.

2. Preheat the barbecue to hot. Make sure the grill bars are clean. Liberally sprinkle the salmon fillets with sea salt and brush with extra virgin olive oil. Put on the grill skin-side down at a 45-degree angle to the straight bars and cook for 3 minutes. Turn the fish to 45 degrees in the opposite direction and cook for a further 3 minutes. Then turn over and cook for a further minute. Rest for 2 minutes.

3. Place a salmon fillet on each of 4 plates skin side up, which should be nice and charred. Spoon the dressing evenly over each fish.

* Salsa Macha is a Mexican sauce that can be bought from specialty stores or made by frying dried chipotle chiles (mainly the morita kind) in a generous amount of olive oil, along with garlic cloves. Then it is seasoned with salt. Some versions add fresh chiles such as [serranos](#) or [jalapeños](#) into the mix. Many times [peanuts](#) are added and sesame seeds too. As a substitute you can use sambal oelek.

Vietnamese rice noodles

with nuoc cham

These simple noodles are the basis for so many delicious dishes. Add some grilled chicken (or even a bit of roast chook), some stir-fried beef or a fish fillet and you have a delicious meal ready to go.

Ingredients

200g rice vermicelli

1 Lebanese cucumber

2-3 cups mixed fresh herbs, such as coriander, mint, Vietnamese mint and Thai basil

2 cups shredded lettuce

½ cup crushed roasted peanuts (optional)

Nuoc cham

juice of 1 lemon or 2 limes

1 tbsp white vinegar

3 tsp sugar, or to taste

1-2 tbsp fish sauce,

2 bird's-eye chillies, finely chopped

3 cloves garlic, crushed

Method

1. For the rice vermicelli, place the noodles in a heatproof bowl and cover with freshly boiled water. Stand for 5 minutes, then rinse under cold running water until completely cool. Drain.

2. Peel the cucumber to give it a striped appearance, halve it lengthways, then cut into thin crescents on a sharp diagonal. For the nuoc cham, mix the citrus juice and vinegar and add the sugar a teaspoon at a time, tasting the mixture as you go until it becomes a pleasant balance of sweet and sour. Add the fish sauce a little at a time, again tasting as you go, until the dressing is savoury and a little on the salty side. Stir through the chilli and garlic.

3. Serve the noodles with the cucumber, herbs, lettuce, peanuts (if using) and nuoc cham.

Tip: These noodles make a fantastic picnic dish. Pack the cooked noodles in the base of a container and top with cooked turmeric fish, spring onions and dill, then pack the herbs, peanuts, cucumber, lettuce and a jar of nuoc cham dressing in a separate container.



Pools News

A chat with Pools GM Graeme Abbot last week showed us that the Pools are doing well and business at the Spa is booming.

Figures for the Pools are 12 % up on what they were last year with almost 70,000 through the complex since Boxing Day. We still haven't got back to the pre-Covid figures, mainly because in that time about 20% of the people who passed through were international visitors. They are coming back though, with businesses around the village reporting that the internationals are starting to return.

As well as the encouraging figures for the Pools and the Spa, the Tea Kiosk has been doing really well. On one day last week they produced 380 pizzas. The iSite is also managed by the Pools and they are reporting not only an increase in foot traffic but also in retail sales.

Things happening in the near future of the complex are the replacement of the old water slide. Plus introducing a new bore pump and some pipes, all happening starting May, at 120 meters down.

The Spa is also being kept up to date and ahead of the trends. A couple of the Pools staff had recently been to Australia looking at any new innovation in the industry. In a business of this nature it is important to keep ahead of the competition.

In other news, a small group of people who have taken it on themselves to object to the proposed Conical Hill Fly Ride, will get their day in court on the 27th of February.

Flight

The Alia, a sleek, all-white aircraft with angular wings, looks like the offspring of an F-16 and a seabird. It has four propellers mounted on poles that bisect the wings horizontally; these rotate ceiling-fan style. I'm sitting in the cockpit of a mockup of the plane which is used to train pilots. My flight instructor, Vince Moeykens, directs me to pull, very gently, on a lever attached to the floor. The four propellers start to spin, the floor vibrates, and the surprisingly convincing simulacrum of the ground that's being projected onto a screen in front of us begins to fall away.

"We're really starting to climb," Moeykens says, encouragingly. I lower the lever; the propellers on the top of the plane stop spinning, and one in the back takes over. We are now ostensibly moving forward, toward a large lake.

Moeykens assures me that I am doing a great job, but soon the ground appears to be whizzing back toward us, and I tug on another lever to lift the plane's nose. I steer us out toward the simulated lake, and we glide peacefully over the simulated water. Just as I think I am starting to get the hang of things, it's time to turn around. I bank too sharply and, remarkably convincingly, the plane seems to pitch. As I attempt to land, the aircraft lurches, and we have a near-miss with what looks like a parking garage. The queasiness I feel on stumbling out of the cockpit is entirely genuine.

The Alia runs solely on electricity. It's manufactured by a company called Beta, which was founded, in 2017, by a former professional hockey player named Kyle Clark. (Clark studied mechanical engineering as an undergraduate, at Harvard; while there, he wrote a thesis about a plane that could be piloted like a motorcycle.) Beta occupies a U-shaped building overlooking a hangar at the Burlington airport. On the day I visited, several planes were parked in the hangar, including an Alia. The other Alia—only two exist—was wending its way back to Vermont from Bentonville, Arkansas, where it had been flown, in several hops, as a test. Clark had piloted the plane on some of the return-trip hops.

"Each one of those legs was about a hundred and eighty miles," he told me. We were sitting in a conference room one floor up from the flight simulator, overlooking the hangar. The Alia, Clark explained, had been shadowed by a Cessna Caravan carrying a crew collecting data. On each leg, Clark estimated, the Alia had gone through about twenty dollars' worth of stored electricity.


To travel the same distance, the Cessna had burned about six hundred dollars' worth of jet fuel.

"The reason I bring that up," Clark continued, "is that, ultimately, what we are paying for in those two cases is energy. And the difference is a product of how much you're wasting."

Compared with internal-combustion engines, electric motors are extremely efficient; an electric car can travel at least twice as far as a conventional sedan on the same amount of energy. The challenge for electrifying flight is that batteries are heavy. (Jet fuel, too, is heavy, but it's a lot more energy dense, plus its weight drops as it gets burned.)

Yet, as the Alia shows, rapid progress is being made. Beta has already applied to the Federal Aviation Administration for approval to transport cargo. UPS has placed an order for up to a hundred and fifty Alias, the first of which are supposed to be delivered in 2024. There are also electric passenger planes in the works. Eviation, a company headquartered in Washington State, has produced a prototype of a nine-seater dubbed Alice. Cape Air, based in Hyannis, Massachusetts, has said it intends to buy seventy-five Alices. Wright Electric, headquartered in Albany, New York, is planning to transform a British Aerospace commuter jet, the BAe 146, into an electric hundred-seater. "All short flights can be zero-emissions starting in 2026," Wright's Web site proclaims.

The Beta Alia, which runs on battery power, can travel a hundred and eighty miles on about twenty dollars' worth of stored electricity.





Symbol	Acronym	Full name and uses
	PET	Polyethylene terephthalate - Fizzy drink bottles and frozen ready meal packages.
	HDPE	High-density polyethylene - Milk and washing-up liquid bottles
	PVC	Polyvinyl chloride - Food trays, cling film, bottles for squash, mineral water and shampoo.
	LDPE	Low density polyethylene - Carrier bags and bin liners.
	PP	Polypropylene - Margarine tubs, microwave-able meal trays.
	PS	Polystyrene - Yoghurt pots, foam meat or fish trays, hamburger boxes and egg cartons, vending cups, plastic cutlery, protective packaging for electronic goods and toys.
	Other	Any other plastics that do not fall into any of the above categories. For example melamine, often used in plastic plates and cups.
