





FLU VACCINE – EXTENDED ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA



Pharmac (Te Pataka Whaioranga) are pleased to announce that they are widening access to influenza vaccine from 1 April 2023

for the following two groups, for the duration of the 2023 calendar year:

- Children who are 6 months to 12 years of age;
- Māori and Pacific peoples who are 55 to 64 years of age;
- Tamariki under 9 years of age who have not previously received flu vaccine will need two doses given four weeks apart to gain full immunity for 2023;

Once the vaccine arrives will contact eligible people within the next couple of weeks, or you can TXT/CALL our dedicated COVID/FLU mobile number 020 4091 0704.

From 1 April 2023 we will be able to provide additional COVID boosters, irrespective of how many prior booster doses that you have received, provided you meet the any of the following criteria:

- Anyone aged 30 years and over who has completed a primary course, as long as it has been at least six months since their last Covid-19 booster or positive Covid-19 test.
- Those at increased risk of severe illness from Covid-19 who have completed a primary course as long as it has been six months since their last Covid-19 booster or positive Covid-19 test.


The following high-risk groups also fall into the 30 years and over criteria:

- people aged 65 years and over
- Māori and Pacific peoples aged 50 years and over
- health, aged care, and disability workers aged 30 years and over


The memorial is being made neater and tidier and Amuri Ave always looks splendid.





Vietnamese Crispy Prawn Cakes

INGREDIENTS

- 50 grams shelled large prawns, coarsely chopped
- 1/4 cup cornflour, more for dusting
- 2 tablespoons minced lemon grass (tender inner stalk only)
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 serrano or jalapeño chilli peppers, seeded and minced
- 4 spring onions, thinly sliced, white and light green part separated from dark green tops
- 1 tablespoon plus 2 teaspoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon coarse salt
- 1/4 cup Asian fish sauce nuoc mam
- Finely grated zest of 1 lime
- 1/4 cup fresh lime juice (from 2 to 3 limes)

Peanut oil, for frying

Cooked rice noodles, optional, for serving

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup fresh coriander leaves, optional, for serving

Step 1

In the bowl of a food processor, combine shrimp, cornstarch, lemon grass, garlic, chiles, white and light green scallion bottoms, 2 teaspoons sugar and salt. Pulse until mixture forms a coarse paste.

Step 2

In a small bowl, whisk together fish sauce, lime zest and juice, 1 tablespoon sugar and the dark green scallion tops.

Step 3

Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Wet hands to keep shrimp paste from sticking. Form 2 tablespoons of shrimp mixture into a ½-inch-thick patty. Dust patty with cornstarch. Repeat with remaining batter. Fry patties in batches until golden brown, 2 to 3 minutes per side.

Serve over rice noodles, if desired, drizzled with fish sauce mixture and strewn with coriander.

Champinones Al Ajillo, Spanish Garlic Mushrooms

Ingredients

10 Large Button Mushrooms, quartered

5 Cloves Garlic, minced

3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

1 tablespoon lemon juice

2 tablespoons dry sherry

1/4 Teaspoon Spanish Paprika

Ground Black Pepper and Sea Salt to season

1/4 - 1/2 Teaspoon dried chili flakes, optional to suit1 Tablespoon Fresh, chopped flat leaf parsley

Instructions

- Quarter the mushrooms, chop the parsley, crush the garlic.
- 2. Over a medium heat, add the olive oil and sautee the mushrooms for a few minutes. Then add the remaining ingredients EXCEPT the parsley. Cook for a further 5 minutes, stirring. Then remove pan from heat, add the chopped parsley and stir through. Serve hot with some crusty bread.



What Will Become of the Dispossessed?

Twenty-one Million People Being Displaced Each Year by Weather Events

One of climate change's many compounding injustices is that the highest costs will be borne by those who have contributed the least to the problem.

Several low-lying island nations, including Tuvalu and Kiribati, are destined simply to disappear.

In Bangladesh, some two thousand people arrive every day in the capital, Dhaka, many driven by storms or rising seas that have made village life difficult. In Pakistan, this past summer, flooding caused by supercharged monsoon rains killed a thousand people and forced six hundred thousand more into relief camps.

In 2016, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees estimated that, globally, an average of twenty-one million people were being displaced by weather-related events every year. The U.N.'s International Organisation for Migration has projected that by 2050 as many as a billion people may be on the move. In the coming decades, "huge populations will need to seek new homes," Gaia Vince, a British journalist, has written. Either "you will be among them, or you will be receiving them."

Almost as much as climate change itself, this great displacement will test national and international institutions. One possibility is that climate refugees will be welcomed. This could happen because it's the right thing to do, or it could happen for less high-minded reasons. As Akka Rimon, a former foreign secretary of Kiribati, has observed, "Countries like Australia need workers," while the citizens of countries such as Kiribati will soon need a different place to live. These needs are complementary. The E.U., too, faces a labor shortage. A communiqué issued by the European Commission in April noted that there's a strong "economic case" for allowing in more legal immigrants, especially since "the transition to a climate-neutral economy" will require "additional labour and new skills."

Climate migrants could play a key role in decarbonisation, providing a new kind of win-win narrative.

Another possibility is that climate migrants, like millions of migrants before them, will be despised. Rich countries—including those in the E.U.—will try to keep refugees out, and those who manage to slip in will be herded into camps. In an effort to gain power, right-wing politicians will vilify them, and this will encourage yet more racism and xenophobia—a social feedback loop. Giorgia Meloni, who recently became Italy's Prime Minister, has said that her country ought to "repatriate the migrants back to their countries, and then sink the boats that rescued them."

Both the effort to limit climate change (by replacing the world's energy systems) and the effort to adapt to climate change (by erecting dikes and seawalls) will take place in the context of climate change, which is to say as cyclones, drought, fire, and sea-level rise force millions of people to flee. It's possible that cascading crises will accomplish what thirty years of climate negotiations have not, and unite the world to seek the best way forward. Or it's possible that the same forces that have prevented coöperation in the past—nationalism, corporatism, sectarianism, fear—will, under the stress of nationalism, corporatism, sectarianism —will, under the stress of climate change, only intensify.

Everyone is required to take part because the census is so important. The information gathered ensures better decisions are made on things like providing hospitals, schools, public transport and infrastructure like roads.

Census staff will be following up with people who have yet to complete their forms. When a census collector visits, they can provide help with filling in census forms or provide new and additional census forms if needed.

If you don't have a paper census form or an access code, call the helpline on 0800 CENSUS (0800 236 787) or go online at www.census.govt.nz. The helpline can answer questions about the census, forms, and access codes.

While most people are doing their census online, Stats NZ is helping everyone complete the census in a way that works for them, through providing more paper forms, more census collectors, more work with communities, and more accessible formats and language support.
