Hanmer Springs to use sulphur aroma to lift tourism standing

Hanmer Springs Thermal Pools and Spa is now sharing the famous aroma from its sulphur pools with the rest of the South Island village.

Starting today, the complex is capturing the aroma in smellitisers, a system commonly used at Disney World, and sharing them with businesses across the village at no cost.

General Manager Graeme Abbot says smell has a strong link to emotion and scent marketing is well-practised around the world.

"Businesses use aromas to entice customers into their premises, to buy certain products and to increase visitor spending. It's a successful strategy.

"Our sulphur pools have an iconic smell – some have likened it to rotten eggs but we prefer to think of it as freshly cut lawn with a mud base.

"You only need to look at Rotorua to see how successfully it can attract visitors to a destination – we're looking to walk in that iconic destination's footsteps."

The smellitiser system has been carefully crafted and tested over a number of months to ensure that it is safe and enjoyable for Hanmer Springs residents. The smell will be diffused at low levels throughout the town using a specially designed system, which will allow for consistent and controlled distribution.

TOP 10 Holiday Park manager Liesl Grounds is looking forward to hosting one of the smellitiser units in their reception area.

"Beyond the unique and memorable sensory element, this will also provide our guests with the health benefits of hydrogen sulphide. It's just one more way that we can enhance our guests' well-being and satisfaction during their stay."

As visitor numbers have steadily improved since COVID-19, the new initiative is expected to entice visitors over the winter.

"By introducing the thermal aroma, we are creating a unique and memorable experience for visitors to Hanmer Springs," says Graeme. "This has worked for our friends in Rotorua, and we know it will work for us."

PROTECTING OUR LANDSCAPE FROM WILDING PINES

WHAT'S WRONG WITH PINES IN THE LANDSCAPE?

'Wilding pines' include several species of introduced conifer, which are self-seeded.

Unlike well-managed plantation forests, wildings are tree weed infestations. They grow and spread fast, doing more harm than good. They soak up water, smother native ecosystems and productive land, and cost more to control the bigger they get.

In the years ahead, a dark blanket of conifers could replace our unique and fragile ecosystems including habitats for at-risk and threatened species. A lot of work is going on to protect what we've got.

Vietnamese pork and pineapple

noodles Ingredients

300g leftover roast pork (with crackling)

200g dried vermicelli noodles

500g pineapple, peeled, cored, cut into batons

- 1 medium Lebanese cucumber, cut into batons
- 1 cup fresh coriander leaves
- 1 cup fresh mint leaves
- 4 green onions, thinly sliced diagonally
- 1 small red onion, thinly sliced
- 2 1/2 tbsp lemon juice
- 2 tbsp fish sauce
- 1 tbsp brown sugar

Method

Step 1

Remove crackling from pork. Cut meat into batons. Preheat oven to 250C/230C fan-forced. Line a baking tray with foil. Place <u>crackling</u> on tray. Roast for 10 minutes or until reheated and crisp. Place on a plate lined with paper towel. Using kitchen scissors, roughly

cut crackling into pieces. Step 2 Meanwhile, place <u>noodles</u> in a heatproof bowl. Cover with boiling water. Stand for 5 minutes or until tender. Drain. Rinse. Drain. Transfer to a large bowl.

Step 3

Add pork, <u>pineapple</u>, <u>cucumber</u>, <u>coriander</u>, <u>mint</u>, <u>green onion</u> and <u>red onion</u> to noodles. Place <u>lemon juice</u>, <u>fish sauce</u> and <u>sugar</u> in a small bowl. Stir until sugar has dissolved. Drizzle lemon juice mixture over noodle mixture. Toss to coat. Sprinkle with crackling. Serve.

Vietnamese Spring Rolls with Pork and Shrimp

Goi Cuon Tom Thit is a refreshing appetizer made up of shrimp, pork, vermicelli noodles, and an assortment of vegetables rolled in rice paper. They are served at room temperature with a creamy peanut sauce or nuoc Cham. **INGREDIENTS**

2 lbs shrimp (peeled and deveined)

1 lb pork belly (substitute with pork shoulder for a leaner version)

1 shallot (peel and slice thin)

1 14-oz bag thin rice vermicelli

Assortment of vegetables and herb (lettuce, bean sprouts, sorrel, perilla, garlic chives, mint, etc.) Vietnamese peanut dipping sauce or nuoc cham 1 package 12-oz dried rice paper

INSTRUCTIONS

To a medium pot, add water and shallots. If you have other aromatics such as ginger or green onions, add those too. Bring the pot to a boil. Add shrimp and cook until they turn color (about 3 minutes). Remove from pot and slice in half along the backside. Set aside.

Read notes below if pork belly has an odor. Add pork belly to the now empty pot and cook for 30 minutes or until chopstick-tender. Remove pork, rinse, and pat dry. Once cooled, slice thinly and set aside.

Cook rice noodles per package instructions. Drain, rinse with cold water, and set aside.

Assemble the rolls: Wet the rice paper quickly and shake off excess water. The rice paper will only take 10 seconds to become pliable. On the bottom end of the rice paper, add a bed of noodles, vegetables of your choice, and pork belly slices. Start rolling everything up from the bottom, tightly tucking and rolling. Fold in the sides when you are halfway up. Add the shrimp, facing down, toward the other end of the rice paper. This will make the shrimp stand out and look more appetising. Continue to roll up to seal. Serve with Vietnamese peanut sauce.

Encouraging local enthusiasm for reserve beautification

When communities work together on their reserves, a lot can be achieved.

This is just some feedback that has come out of the review of Hurunui District Council's (HDC) Reserves Management Plan.

Community committees and reserves committees around the District are being asked for their feedback and thoughts around how to best use their recreation and local purpose reserves.

Chief Operations Officer Dan Harris said the Plan's review takes place every 10 years, providing a good opportunity to collate feedback and have a close look at the District's green spaces.

"Generally, people are really happy with the way the reserves are looking and how they're being used."

He said in some reserves community groups just get on and do things, like managing their own maintenance and plantings, which is great.

Undertaking this review also feeds into creating funding streams for projects and developments.

"We look at the reserve's individual policies including amenity and native planting, development of walkways, and what people would like to see in the future."

For local groups to have working bees to trim or remove

request to HDC, including a health and safety plan and a planting plan under the Tree Management Policy and Reserves Act.

At Motunau Beach, the green fingered enthusiasm amongst the community is in abundance.

Working within these guidelines, Motunau Beach campground manager and President of Motunau Beach Residents and Ratepayers' Association Kalvyn Schenkel has cut down trees he deems a fire risk, and undertaken maintenance.

He encourages everyone to work within the guidelines, because when everyone is on the same page and working towards the same goal, community work in the reserves is harmonious.

"We want to do intelligent planting and sustainable planting, this means species which won't be a fire hazard, and will help stabilise hillsides."

Harris agreed with Schenkel, saying the more work that can be done in reserves from a local level, the better. "Having the right people in each community to ensure the work can be done smartly and safely is important, and it's encouraging that there are these people out there."

The Council's Tree Management Policy will be going out for wider consultation soon. *HDC release*
