Hanmer Springs -Easter Rubbish and Recycling

Week commencing 10th April, rubbish and recycling in Hanmer Springs will be collected one day later than normal on Tuesday 11th.

Only Hurunui District Council rubbish and recycling bags will be collected, must be at the kerbside by 8am on collection day.

Rubbish bags will not be collected if:

- ·The bag exceeds 15kg or is not securely tied.
- ·The bag contains something which could endanger the collector or damage the vehicle e.g. medical or hazardous waste, needles, animal waste, ashes, sharp objects, or liquids.
- ·The bag is full of bottles or contains unwrapped glass.
- The bag is split prior to the crew's arrival or a non-official bag.

Bundles of cardboard will not be collected but can be recycled via any transfer station

What clean, dry recyclables are accepted in the recycling bags?

- Newspapers, magazines, office wastepaper and telephone directories.
- ·Cardboard, greetings cards, egg boxes and trays.
- ·Food, drink, and pet food cans.
- ·Clean plastic bottles and containers number 1 i.e. soft drink bottles (no lids).
- ·Clean plastics bottles and containers number 2 i.e. milk bottles (no lids).
- ·Clean plastic bottles and containers number 5 i.e. ice cream containers (no lids).

The following are not accepted for recycling; remember if in doubt, throw it out.

- \cdot Soft plastics and plastic types 3, 4, 6 and 7 including plant pots, strapping, and lids.
- ·Paper with glitter on.
- ·Tetrapaks
- ·Polystyrene including meat trays.
- Food waste and food-stained paper or cardboard.

Glass bottles must not be put in recycling bags but can be recycled via any transfer station.

Transfer Station Opening Hours

All transfer stations are closed on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, and Easter Monday. Amberley Transfer Station will open from 10am to 4pm on Tuesday 11th April.


Mayor Marie Black congratulated the practice saying,





Cheesy White Bean-Tomato Bake

For those of you who love lasagna's edges, where sticky tomato meets crisp cheese, this whole dish is for you — even the middle. Add in whatever you like and serve with oven-warmed bread or garlic bread.

INGREDIENTS

1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil

3 fat garlic cloves, thinly sliced

3 tablespoons tomato paste

2 x 400 gramcans white beans (such as cannellini

½ cup boiling water

Salt and black pepper

11/2 cups mozzarella, coarsely grated

PREPARATION

Step 1

Heat oven to 475 degrees. In a 10-inch ovenproof skillet, heat the olive oil over medium-high. Fry the garlic until it's lightly golden, about 1 minute.

Stir in the tomato paste (be careful of splattering) and fry for 30 seconds, reducing the heat as needed to prevent the garlic from burning.

Step 2

Add the beans, water and generous pinches of salt and pepper and stir to combine. Sprinkle the cheese evenly over the top, then bake until the cheese has melted and browned in spots, 5 to 10 minutes. If the top is not as toasted as you'd like, run the skillet under the broiler for a minute or 2. Serve at once.

Fattoush (Lebanese Tomato and Pita Salad)

INGREDIENTS

For the Salad

1 pita bread

1 large tomato, diced, seeds removed

1/4 red onion, diced

2 bell peppers, one red, one yellow, pith and seeds removed, cut into long strips

1 cucumber, peeled and cut in rounds

5 radishes, sliced

2 whole scallions, chopped

1 head of romaine lettuce, purslane or other wild greens

1/4 cup coarsely chopped fresh mint

1 to 3 teaspoons ground sumac,

1teaspoon dried mint

For the Dressing

2.cloves garlic, peeled and minced 1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil

Juice of 1/2 lemon

4 teaspoons pomegranate syrup

1 teaspoon salt, or to taste

1/4 teaspoon ground pepper, or to taste

PREPARATION

Step 1

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Separate pita into 2 rounds, and bake on cookie sheet for about 5 minutes, or until very crisp but not browned.

Step 2


Put tomato, red onion, peppers, cucumber, radishes and scallions into large salad bowl. Add romaine or purslane and fresh mint, and sprinkle with sumac and dried mint. Toss.

Step 3

Whisk together garlic, olive oil, lemon juice, pomegranate syrup, and salt and pepper in a small bowl. Just before serving, give dressing another quick whisk and then pour it over vegetables and toss.

Step 4

Break pita into 1-inch pieces and toss with salad, just before taking salad to table. Taste, add seasonings if needed, and serve



Origins of the Easter Bunny

Easter has a number of traditions which vary from country to country: the witch's "life or purse" in Sweden, the burning of a Judas Iscariot effigy in Venezuela, and chocolate egg hunts in Western Europe and the United States. The Catholics in the Bermudas launch vibrant kites into the air, symbolising the ascension of Jesus on Good Friday – the eve of Easter.

Easter is one of the most important religious holidays for Christians, who celebrate the resurrection of Jesus after his crucifixion. Recently Easter has become quite commercialised. The Easter Bunny who shows up in the middle of the night is, of course, a must. He leaves baskets full of sweets to delight children who care little for harmful sugar content on Easter morning.

In Germany in the 1700s children would build nests, and leave carrots out for the "Osterhase" or "Oschter Haws" - the Easter bunny (hare). Legend has it that the Easter Bunny lays, decorates and hides eggs for good children, as they are also a symbol of new life.

If you consult the Internet you can find a hundred reasons for the Easter Bunny and the fact he is a hare passing himself off as a rabbit.

The most likely explanation is that Easter in the Northern hemisphere is in spring, a time when mammals of the genus Lepus are reproducing in great numbers, hence the saying, and so these hapless beasts, along with the egg, have become unwitting symbols of fertility.

From the Greek world through the Renaissance, hares often appear as symbols of sexuality in literature and art. For example, the Virgin Mary is often shown with a white hare or rabbit, symbolising that she overcame sexual temptation.

So far, average global temperatures have risen

warming

by 1.1 degrees Celsius—two degrees Fahrenheit—and the budget for 1.5 Celsius is nearly gone. How hot will it get? Will temperatures climb two degrees Celsius? 2.5? Three? A study published a few years ago, by Veerabhadran Ramanathan, a climate scientist at the Scripps Institution, and Yangyang Xu, of Texas A&M, defined a temperature increase of 1.5 degrees as "dangerous," an increase of three degrees as "catastrophic," and an increase of five degrees as "unknown, implying beyond catastrophic." A second study, by a group of American and European researchers, determined that, if we were to burn through all known fossil-fuel reserves, global temperatures could rise by as much as eleven degrees Celsius, or twenty degrees Fahrenheit. (How humanity could keep the oil flowing even as the world drowned and smouldered was a

There are good reasons to opt for optimism. It could be argued that the passage of the Inflation Reduction Act this past summer was possible only because so many people believed in a better future.

question the researchers did not address.)

At the same time, there are good reasons to wonder whether optimism lies at the heart of the problem. For the last thirty years—more if you go back to 1965—we have lived as if someone, or some technology, were going to rescue us from ourselves. We are still living that way now.

"You can't just sit around waiting for hope to come," Greta Thunberg observed in a speech scolding E.U. politicians. "Then you're acting like spoiled, irresponsible children. You don't seem to understand that hope is something you have to earn."



The Art and Soul of Birth Private Collection of Lorna Davies

Hanmer Springs Library Gallery March/April/May 2023

Kia ora koutou

Thank you for your interest in my birth art collection.I am a midwife and an educator and have practised and taught midwifery at both undergraduate and postgraduate level for over thirty years.

I have been collecting artworks and artefacts relating to pregnancy and childbirth for almost three decades now and I have acquired a wonderful and eclectic selection of works which are very dear to me. Many were discovered on overseas trips and visits and bring back memories of those places for me.

I became interested in birth art for several reasons. Firstly, I am married to a man who is passionate about art and his joy in art is infectious.

Secondly, I love my field of practice. I am proud to be a midwife, the oldest healthcare practice by a long shot, where I am privileged to be in attendance at a profound time in the lives of women and their families.

Secondly, I was increasingly mystified by the invisibility of depictions of birth in the world of art. I questioned why one of the most important and sacred of acts was being largely ignored, and could only conclude that it was because it represented the lives of women. I began to collect items related to the childbirth continuum, but they were few and far between. I started to research the area and discovered some interesting facts. There are indeed images of childbirth that date back to prehistoric times and can be found as cave paintings. There are also birthing scenes throughout the Middle Ages and medieval times in Europe. In tribal societies, birth was treated with much greater reverence and images can be found celebrating the marvel of childbirth.

However, in Europe, for several centuries the taboo of childbirth, which was viewed as unclean, ensured that it remained hidden from anywhere but the birthing room, and so there is a dearth of images. The medicalisation of childbirth further alienated birth from the world of art with the exceptions of early anatomical drawings.

In 1931 Jacob Einstein unveiled his wonderful sculpture "Genesis'. The work was modelled on traditional African tribal art and was designed by Epstein to challenge the values and beliefs of those in the inter-war period. His proud and strong image of pregnancy was treated by many in the art world and others as an affront to civilisation. When the photo of a naked and pregnant Demi Moore appeared on the front of Vanity Fair in 1991, a similar public outrage was charged.

If pregnancy was able to provoke these kinds of reactions, then what about the physical act of giving birth?

Jonathan Waller a UK artist who painted the image "With Woman" in the exhibition, was driven to painting birth scenes following a long and difficult birthing experience of his wife. The ordeal left him feeling exposed and raw but also in awe of women undergoing this process of bringing another human into the world. A series of his images were set up for exhibiting in his regular London gallery, but the night before the show opened, the gallery owners decided to withdraw the exhibition. This was in the 1990's but have we moved on?

I like to think that the birth works can be used to promote the importance of normal physiological birth in society. In a world where birth has become synonymous with fear and is increasingly technological, images such as the ones in this exhibition can be used to convey the beauty and strength of birthing women and the miracle of childbirth. Art therapists inform us that art can have profound effects on our physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual well-being. I therefore hope that this small offering of art and sculpture that represents the most significant of life events, will serve to educate and inform and perhaps to even heal in some cases.


