ABC Chicken Soup

In Malaysia and Singapore, the name of this soup refers both to the simplicity of preparation and the vitamins found in its ingredients.

Ingredients

- 4 chicken drumsticks
- 2 medium potatoes, peeled and cut into chunks
- 4 carrots, peeled and cut into 5cm lengths
- 2 ears of corn, cut into 5cm lengths
- 1 brown onion, cut into wedges
- 1 tbsp fish sauce (optional)
- salt and white pepper, to season
- 2 tomatoes, cut into wedges

Method

Step 1

Place the chicken drumsticks in a large pot and cover with cold water. Bring to a boil, then strain. Remove the drumsticks and rinse them in cold water before returning to the pot.

Step 2

Add the potatoes, carrots, corn and onion and cover with 3 litres of water. Add the fish sauce (if using) and season well with salt.

Step 3

Bring to a simmer and cook at a very low heat for 1 hour. Add the tomatoes and simmer for a further 20 minutes. Taste and add more salt, if necessary, plus white pepper to serve.





Spiced carrot and lentil soup

This is why soup exists. It is soul-restoring, simple, uses cupboard staples, is cheap and healthy. Winning on all fronts.

Ingredients

- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 2 brown onions, diced
- 6 cups peeled and roughly chopped carrot (about 750g)
- 3 tbsp roughly chopped ginger
- 1 tbsp garam masala (depending on the strength of your spice mix, you may like to add more)
- 1 tbsp cumin seeds, freshly ground
- ½ tbsp turmeric
- 250g split red lentils
- 1.5 litres vegetable stock
- sea salt flakes, to season
- 1 ½ cups Greek-style yoghurt coriander leaves, to serve

Method

Step 1

Add the olive oil, brown onion and chopped carrots to a large pot. Cook, stirring regularly, for 5 minutes or until the onion has completely softened and become fragrant.

Step 2

Add the ginger and spices and cook until fragrant. Add the lentils and vegetable stock and simmer for 20–25 minutes or until the lentils are soft and the carrot has cooked through.

Step 3

Give everything a whiz in the pot using a stick blender, then stir through the yoghurt. If you feel the soup is too thick, you can stir through a little more stock, just give the soup some time to warm through if you are adding extra liquid.

Projections of greenhouse gas emissions as published on 15 December 2022

New Zealand has several greenhouse gas emissions reduction targets. They include both domestic and international targets up to the year 2050. Projections help us understand how we are tracking towards our emission reduction targets.

This page provides projections using the 100-year time horizon global warming potentials for the non-carbon dioxide gases based on the values provided in the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change's Fourth Assessment Report (AR4) and Fifth Assessment Report (AR5). AR5 values are provided in square brackets after the AR4 value.

Based on New Zealand's existing policies and measures:

- New Zealand's gross emissions are projected to steadily decrease from 78.8 [81.8] million tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent (Mt CO₂-e) in 2020 to 56.4 [59.2] Mt CO₂-e in 2050. This is 13.5 [13.5] per cent below New Zealand's emissions in 1990 and 28.4 [27.6] per cent below emissions in 2020.
- New Zealand's net emissions, which includes gross emissions and emissions and removals


from the land-use, land-use change and forestry (LULUCF) sector, are projected to decrease from 55.5 [47.2] Mt CO_2 -e in 2020 to 16.9 [19.7] Mt CO_2 -e in 2050, a 69.5 [66.3] per cent reduction on 2020 levels by 2050.

New Zealand's target accounting emissions, which includes gross emissions and a subset of emissions and removals from the LULUCF sector, are projected to decrease from 70.3 [69.2] Mt CO₂-e in 2020 to 29.1 [31.8] Mt CO₂-e in 2050, a 58.7 [56.6] per cent reduction on 2020 levels by 2050.

Emissions reductions across all sectors are driving the decrease in gross emissions. Key reasons for this decline include:

- · Retirement of coal and gas-fired power plants
- Land-use change from agriculture to forestry, changes in farm management, and improvements in agricultural efficiency
- Increasing energy efficiency and electrification in transport
- Ongoing impacts of policies to reduce emissions across all sectors

Under target accounting forestry is projected to account for over half of the decrease in net emissions to 2050, in addition to the decreases in emissions across all other gross emissions sectors.
