Letter from China; A few snippets.

Greetings from a warm and sunny Hangzhou. It was sad to miss the opening of the new slides at The Hot Pools and Spa this week, that is a treat I will just have to wait for. But they do look fast and exciting.

In a city of 10 million it is amazing to not see or hear English spoken and it was a great pleasure this week to catch up with Tamara Yuille-Proctor who is working as a teacher in China. Lovely to hear a kiwi accent and enjoy some good Kiwi humour.

Retail has changed immeasurably here. The face of retail is now online shopping and next day delivery for virtually everything nonfood. With very fast returns if the item doesn't suit. Food can be delivered almost instantly any time of day and night. Run out of bread and milk? 20 minutes to your apartment block, left in a safe place in a society where trust is high and crime very low.

We visited an old part of Hangzhou the other day alongside the Hangzhou Beijing Canal. The canal was built 2,500 years ago and is approx. 1,800km long. A huge achievement built in about 6 years, dug out by hand. The old town alongside it is quintessential China. Narrow streets, hustle and bustle, red lanterns and beautiful shuttered windows and individual boutiques.

Stone arch bridges beautifully lit at night make it very picturesque and photo opportunities abound. The retail of the past has been replaced with coffee shops, tea house and boutiques and crafts. All very different, no national or international names, just small-scale producers.

There is a huge number of cats here and a large number of day stay catteries. These are high profile establishments with play spaces for cats on the street front. They have every toy imaginable and in glass cages these cats sleep and play while their owners are working, and they provide humour and entertainment for passersby.

Along from the old town is an amazing park. Think of the oil and gas depot at Naval Point Lyttelton. This has a similar area her but has been converted into an art and park area. The oil storage containers are now coffee shops (inc Starbucks) and art shops and entertainment venues. What an amazing place connected with walkways and modernistic canopies and open-air theatres, they have converted a derelict site into a most fantastic park. One not to be missed and to be revisited.

We are into our last week here and then we will be moving on to attend our nieces wedding in Liverpool UK.

Woke up to the news to find The All Blacks have succeeded where few expected and have beaten Ireland in the world cup. Great news, I will catch up with the replay soon.

It is Sunday morning here and I am off to a 3-hour lecture soon. Work here is incessant. Lecturers often work 7 days a week, often until very late at night. It is a country that never sleeps.

I will leave you on a note of food. The food is fantastic and unbelievably varied. A highlight is prawns braised in local tea. Pork and meat are in virtually everything. The Chinese do have a sweet tooth and one delight we have found is kumara chips with plum powder on top. No salt or chicken seasoning, sweet plum powder. Absolutely delicious.

Hope you are all safe and well and surviving the winds and power outages. Thinking of you all. Take care stay safe and warm.





Refuse and Recycling Hanmer Springs

Due to Labour Day, for one week only, refuse and recycling in Hanmer Springs will be collected one day later than normal on Tuesday 24th October.

Please remember the following:

- Only Hurunui Council bags will be collected. In Hanmer Springs these can be purchased from the library, Super Liquor, Log Cabin, and the Service Station.
- Bags must be securely tied and at the kerbside by 8am as collection times may vary to normal; the crew will not return to collect bags that are placed out late.
- Refuse bags must not exceed 15kg.
- Bags split prior to the crew's arrival and non-official bags will not be collected.
- Bundles of cardboard will not be collected but can be recycled via the transfer station.

What is accepted via the recycling collections?

The following are accepted, providing they are clean, free from food waste and loose (papers should not be tied in bundles) in a Council recycling bag.

- Newspapers, magazines, office paper and telephone directories.
- Cardboard, greeting cards, junk mail, envelopes, and egg boxes.
- Food, drink, and pet food cans.
- Rigid plastic bottles and small containers, types 1, 2 and 5 only with lids removed.

All Hurunui Council transfer stations are closed on Monday 23rd October.

Piwakawaka class learning about Moa.

This term the NE/Y1 students are learning about extinct birds and creatures from Aotearoa. They have been learning about the moa. They have learnt some interesting facts about moa which they wanted to share. They have drawn some pictures of moa as well.

A moa was a flightless bird that used to live in Aotearoa. They are extinct as they are no longer living. The giant moa was taller than a human.

The Haast eagle was a predator of the moa. Their huge claws grabbed onto the moa and killed them. People also hunted moa for food. Hunters would hide in the bushes and jump out and kill the moa with spears. People also burned land so that they could farm crops, this burning killed some moa as well.

Moa had long necks and brown shaggy feathers. They had three toes and a claw at the back of their foot. The moa laid giant eggs which were about the size of a rugby ball.

Moa skeletons have been discovered in Pyramid Valley near Waikari. They have found some moa bones which have damage on them like Hasst eagle claw marks. More than 180 have been found there.



Cerebral Palsy Mufti Day.

On Friday the 13th our school had a mufti day with a gold coin donation to support Kiwis living with cerebral palsy. It was great to see everybody dressed in green to support the cause. We raised \$178.60. People with cerebral palsy have differing symptoms, some people can't walk, some find talking difficult. You are born with the condition. Cerebral means having to do with the brain and palsy means weakness or problems with using the muscles. Premature babies are more susceptible to having cerebral palsy. We raised the money as one of our students, Pippa-Renee, has cerebral palsy. She gave the following speech in our assembly:

Hi, my name is Pippa-Renee. I've had cerebral palsy for my whole life. It has affected me in my left arm and left leg. I can't do monkey bars as well as other people because of the cerebral palsy in my left arm. When I was little I couldn't run in a straight line because of my left leg. Other people have different kinds of cerebral palsy such as not being able to walk, not being able to talk as well as others or struggling to walk up stairs.

We need to donate money to the cerebral palsy society because they need the money to help the people who have it have a better life. Thank you.

Return of the black-fronted tern

It's that time of the year where you may notice a unique bird returning to the Hurunui district's braided rivers to breed throughout the summer. This is the Nationally Endangered tarapirohe/ black-fronted tern.

Black-fronted terns are a small grey bird with an orange beak and legs, and distinctive black cap and forked tail. They can often be seen or heard soaring above Hanmer Springs during sunsets catching insects, along with flitting up and down the Clarence River in search for food. They are known to dive-bomb intruders too close to their nests.

They are particularly important to the Hurunui District as it's one of the few places in New Zealand where they breed.

Over the last ten years, Wildlife Management International Limited (WMIL), in partnership with Environment Canterbury (ECan) and the Department of Conservation (DOC), have been monitoring and protecting black-fronted terns along the Clarence, Acheron, Waiau and Hurunui rivers.

Unfortunately, black-fronted terns are estimated to decline by 50% over the next three decades.

Introduced predators are one of the greatest threats these birds face. Each year, predation by feral cats, ferrets, stoats, hedgehogs, harriers, and Southern black-backed gulls cause around 30% of nests to fail. To mitigate these impacts, WMIL has set up a trap line along 23km of the Clarence River which is serviced fortnightly by J & S Mears Contracting. These traps ensure that predator numbers are reduced, decreasing the risk of predation.

Flooding of nests, and heat exhaustion of hatched chicks can also cause a large percentage of nests to fail. Island enhancements are carried out to help elevate the level of some islands as well as enhance channels surrounding the islands. This creates safer nesting habitat for black-fronted terns.

Small, wooden chick shelters are also placed on some colonies to provide chicks with shade from extreme heat.

When you're visiting the Clarence River during summer, it's always important to be wary of nesting birds and give them space. But if you get too close to a tern nest, they'll be sure to let you know.

Baylee will be en situ monitoring the birds for the fifth season in a row and has promised the Pinkie monthly updates from the Clarence on how the nesting of these endangered birds is progressing.
