Summer Hours at the Pools

On Monday 13 November, the Pools will be moving to their summer hours of 10am to 9pm. Recruitment of staff for summer has been better this year than last year, so they are able to move to summer hours earlier than expected.

They say they are not sure how long they will be able to operate summer hours. The intention is to keep summer hours until Easter weekend but that will depend entirely on staffing levels.

Price Increase

Also on 13 November, we will be making a small increase to our pools entry prices, and our spa treatments. Single adult entry will increase from \$38 to \$40, and children from \$22 to \$23. Other prices like mini group passes, return passes and two-day entry will rise in line with these increases.

We do still have our PoolsPlus Programme (20% discount on entry), Resident/Ratepayer Card (50% discount), and Annual Swim Pass options.

COVID-19 booster doses can continue to be administered to those who are eligible and wish to have one, regardless of how many doses they have had previously. Eligibility criteria has NOT changed - COVID-19 boosters continue to be available for:

- people aged 16-29 who are at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 or are pregnant
- An additional booster dose is given at least 6 months after previous dose and recommended 6 months after COVID-19 illness or infection.

Highest priority groups who are most likely to benefit from a further booster include

- People aged 30 to 75 with complex health needs (e.g. residential care, multiple medical conditions
- People aged 75 years or older, especially those in residential care or with significant frailty
- Māori and Pasifika aged 65 years or older, especially those with multiple comorbidities
- People aged 16 years or older with severe immunocompromise (i.e. those who were eligible for a third primary dose)

Thai noodles with egg ribbons

This Thai noodle stir-fry is the answer to the perpetual question – *what's for dinner tonight?* I know you have eggs in the fridge. I know you have a packet of dried noodles somewhere in the dark depths of your pantry. Use whatever (cook-able) vegetables you can find. And I think there's a strong chance you have everything you need for the sauce. (If not, get them once and make this

forever!) Ingredients

- 160g dried bean vermicelli noodles, soaked in boiling water for 5 minutes then drained (or noodles of your choice)
- 6 eggs
- j tsp salt
- 2 tbsp peanut oil (or other neutral oil)
- 1 onion, finely sliced
- 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 1 red capsicum, cut into 7mm strips
- 1 bunch Chinese broccoli (gai laan; about 6 stems), cut into 10cm lengths, stems separated from leaves
- SAUCE
- 2 tbsp oyster sauce
- 2 tbsp fish sauce
- 2 tsp dark soy sauce
- 1 tbsp white sugar
- 1 tbsp peanut oil

Method

Step 1

Whisk together eggs and salt. Heat S tablespoon of the oil in a 30cm nonstick frying pan over high heat. Pour in half the egg, swirl to spread, cook until surface is set, slide out onto cutting board. Repeat with another S tablespoon of oil and remaining egg. When cool enough to handle, roll up and slice into 1cm-wide strips – egg ribbons!

Step 2

Heat the last 1 tablespoon of oil. Cook onion, garlic, capsicum and gai laan stems for 1 minute. Add gai laan leaves and toss for 1 minute. Add noodles then pour the sauce over. Toss for a good 2 minutes to allow the sauce to soak into the noodles and get a bit of caramelisation on them.

Step 3

Finally, gently toss through the egg ribbons. Some will break – that's OK! Serve immediately.

Mexican Fish Stew

Everybody knows fish is good for you and we need to eat more of it. Here's an easy way to cook fish that's quick and cosy: in a chunky Mexican-inspired broth. The thing with fish stew is that it *has* to be quick to make – otherwise, you'll overcook the fish.

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 1 onion, finely diced
- 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 2 tsp dried oregano
 - 100g can of chipotles in adobo sauce
 - 400g can crushed tomato
 - 1 litre salt-reduced vegetable stock
 - 1 tsp cooking salt
 - 2 potatoes (300g each), peeled and cut into 1.2cm cubes
 - 6 corn cobbettes (thaw if frozen)
 - 400g can black beans, drained
 - 2 x 300g snapper, barramundi or basa fillets,
- cut into 5cm pieces
- ½ cup roughly chopped coriander leaves,
 1 tbsp lime juice (plus extra wedges to serve)

Method

Step 1

Heat the olive oil in a large pot over medium-high heat. Add the onion, garlic, oregano and chipotles in adobo (chillies and sauce) and cook for 2 minutes while stirring.

Step 2

Add tomato, stock and salt and bring to a simmer. Cook for 3 minutes, then blitz until smooth using a stick blender.

Step 3

Add potato and corn to the sauce and simmer for 10 minutes.

Step 4

Stir in the black beans.

Step 5

Place the fish pieces on top of the sauce. Don't stir them in. Return the sauce to a simmer, cover with a lid and cook for 5 minutes.

Step 6

Once the fish is cooked (check to see that it flakes), add the coriander and lime juice.

Step 7

Gently push the fish under the sauce, then ladle into bowls, garnished with extra coriander leaves. Serve extra lime wedges alongside.



Challenging start for the black-fronted terns

The black-fronted tern season has slowly but surely started to kick off over the last couple of weeks.

As birds colonise, build their nests and start to lay eggs, they have had to persevere through rain, increasing river flow, sleet, snow, and extreme winds that have blown trees over colonies! These birds are dedicated parents, that's for sure!

During a helicopter survey on the Clarence and Acheron rivers, a total of 19 colonies were found with an estimated tern count of 370 individuals on the Clarence and 82 on the Acheron River.

Each week more nests with eggs are found at each colony site and currently range from 1 - 29 active nests per colony. Our current nest count is at 112 nests with plenty more to find.

We have spotted our first banded dotterel chick for the season along with many South Island pied oystercatcher nests.

Luckily no major predation events have occurred, and most colonies have been able to withstand moderate flood events this Spring.

Part of our monitoring includes identifying banded birds and reading the two-digit code on the yellow flag band. Recently, JX was spotted at a colony. This bird was banded as a chick on the Clarence River in 2016 making this bird 7 years old.

If any keen photographers manage to capture a band reading on one of these birds, please share this epic find with me via email.
