HEARING FOR FLY-WIRE DELAYED

The hearing into the appeal over granting permission for the fly-wire was scheduled for November 6th but it has been postponed by the court. The appeal, by a group calling themselves Friends of Conical Hill, has now been set down for a date to be announced in February. Postponement was due to a bereavement in the family of the Commissioner who has to hear the appeal. The Pinkie will keep you posted.

Pavilion Upgrade

Work is under way in urgent repairs for the Sports Pavilion in the Domain. In a recent study of the building, safety experts deemed it essential to strengthen the balcony. It was advised that until work was completed on the balcony, the number of people using it at one time should be limited to no more than five people. It was decided this had to be done on an urgent basis as the balcony is not only an official exit from the building's top floor. But is also a very popular viewpoint for netball and tennis matches. The Pinkie will keep you up to date with the progress.

POWER OUTAGES

At last Monday's Community Board meeting the board met with a delegation from Mainpower. Transpower, who manage the national grid need to do some major repair work, namely relocating a tower in the Champagne Flat region. To reduce the amount of outage time Mainpower advised that they will be putting in a temporary solution to put a section of the main line so that Transpower can complete the work. The exact dates have yet to be settled but it appears that the first outage will be either Tuesday 2nd or Wednesday 3rd April with a second outage a fortnight later. They will be half day outages. Again, we will keep you informed.

Motorfest

This annual event, which is to be held February 24th, has again applied for permission to use the Domain for the event. Members of the rugby club, Hurunui Tourism, the Community Board and Motorfest met last year and discussed a new set of rules regarding the Domain's use and it was proposed that no changes be made to the agreement, although some new direction will be augmented with regard to parking regulations

COVID-19 booster doses can continue to be administered to those who are eligible and wish to have one, regardless of how many doses they have had previously.

Eligibility criteria has NOT changed - COVID-19 boosters continue to be available for:

- people aged 30 and over
- people aged 16-29 who are at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 or are pregnant.

An additional booster dose is given at least 6 months after previous dose and recommended 6 months after COVID-19 illness or infection.

If you call our clinic phone out of hours, your call is always answered by a registered nurse who will assess your needs, offer advice or, if required, pass the call to our oncall clinician. INGREDIENTS

FOR THE FILLING

- ¹/₂cup unsalted butter (1 stick), at room
- temperature, plus more for greasing the pan
- 6 large kumaras (about 2 kg), scrubbed
- 2 large eggs, at room temperature
- 1x 450ml can sweetened condensed milk
- ¹/₄ cup granulated sugar
- 1teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1teaspoon kosher salt
 - FOR THE TOPPING
- 1cup finely chopped pecans
- 1cup lightly crushed cornflakes (optional)
- ½ packed cup light or dark brown sugar
- ¹⁄₂ cup all-purpose flour
- ¹/₄cup unsalted butter (¹/₂ stick), melted
- 2cups mini marshmallows,

PREPARATION

Step 1

Prepare the filling: Heat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9-by-13inch baking dish with butter and line a baking sheet with aluminium foil.

Step 2

Poke the kumaras all over with a fork and place on the baking sheet. Bake until soft, about 1 hour; let cool.

Step 3

When sweet potatoes are cool enough to handle, peel them using a knife, then add the flesh to a large bowl (or the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment) and mash with a potato masher or fork. (The kumara can be covered and refrigerated for up to 3 days at this point.)

Step 4

Add the 1/2 cup butter, eggs, condensed milk, granulated sugar, vanilla and salt to the bowl. Combine well with a hand mixer or a stand mixer on medium speed. Add the mixture to the prepared baking dish and, using a spatula, smooth out the top.

• Step 5

Prepare the topping: In a medium bowl, stir together the pecans, cornflakes (if using), brown sugar, flour and butter until thoroughly combined. Spoon the topping evenly over the sweet potatoes. Step 6

Bake the casserole until slightly browned, about 35 minutes. Remove the casserole from the oven and add the marshmallows in an even layer. Return to the oven and bake until marshmallows are toasty and melted, about 5 minutes. Let sit for 5 minutes before serving.

Lemon Squares

The buttery shortbread mellows a lemon topping, as does the dusting of confectioners' sugar. Make it to cap off a weeknight dinner, or for a weekend afternoon snack, paired with a cup of tea. INGREDIENTS

- 2cups/256 grams flour, plus ¼ cup/32 grams
- ½cup confectioners' sugar/61 grams, plus 2 teaspoons
- 1teaspoon kosher salt
- 1cup/227 grams (2 sticks) unsalted butter, melted
- 4eggs
- 2cups/400 grams granulated sugar
- ½cup/80 milliliters lemon juice (from about 1 to 2 lemons)
- 1/2teaspoon baking powder

PREPARATION

• Step 1

Heat oven to 350 degrees. In a medium bowl, whisk together two cups flour, ½ cup confectioners' sugar and salt. Add melted butter and stir to thoroughly combine. Spread with clean hands in an even layer into a 9-by-13-inch pan and bake for 25 minutes.

Step 2

Meanwhile, in a medium bowl, whisk together eggs, granulated sugar, lemon juice, baking powder and remaining flour. Pour onto the hot baked shell and bake for an additional 20 to 25 minutes, or until just set. Using a small, fine meshed sieve, sift remaining confectioners' sugar on top when cool. Cut into equal bars.



Christmas Lunch for Seniors

A lot of people have phoned the Pinkie to find out if the Lions Club are doing their usual Christmas dinner this year. The answer is they have deliberately chosen not to share details through the Pinkie this year and all but one of our emails trying to find out, have gone unanswered. One member of the Lions Club committee has told us they are operating through Facebook this year - not a very good method of reaching the oldies. There have been two surveys done on Facebook use in Hanmer with both coming up with almost identical answers in that about 16% of Hanmer people are on Facebook. NZ First and Mr Jones' Regional Development Fund is back under a new name with a budget of \$1.2 billion. We did manage to get a bite out of that last time round with funding for the Fly-ride, which although approved is still being held up by a protracted appeal from the Fochers*.

Shaping local alcohol laws

Serve limits for alcohol at special-licensed events in the Hurunui District will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

This is part of Hurunui District Council's Local Alcohol Policy (LAP) which was adopted last Tuesday afternoon. The LAP outlines how alcohol is bought, sold and where it can be consumed within our district.

Throughout September a public consultation process invited members of the community to-submit their thoughts on the Draft LAP. This opportunity was undertaken by the general public, the local wine industry, and health organisations.

The hearing enabled Councillors to receive both oral and written submissions prior to deliberating and adopting the final LAP.

Mayor Marie Black chaired the hearing and said it was encouraging to hear from the community on this topic. "It's a far-reaching one that has an impact on individuals, communities and businesses," she said.

Many of the Policy's draft proposals were adopted as discretionary, giving the District Licensing Committee (DLC) the ability to review applications on a case-by-case basis, and introduce conditions where deemed appropriate.

Mayor Black said this was a very positive outcome, reflecting the genuine and honest nature of the formal consultation process of the Draft LAP.

"We wanted to hear from our community, listened to what they had to say, and adopted a Policy to best fit the needs of everyone in Hurunui."





Local Businesses More Confident

North Canterbury businesses are feeling significantly more positive about the future than they were six months ago. That's the finding from the latest North Canterbury Business Opinion Survey released by Enterprise North Canterbury (ENC) last week.

The survey, which involved 58 business owners from the Waimakariri and Hurunui districts and was conducted prior to the 2023 General Election shows that business confidence is sitting at net +6%; a marked increase from the net -52% reported in April last year.

Report Maps Road for North Canterbury Industry's Transition to Renewable Energy

The North Canterbury Regional Energy Transition Accelerator (RETA) report, published earlier this month by the Energy Efficiency Conservation Authority (EECA), outlines recommendations to help North Canterbury's manufacturing sector use less energy and move off fossil fuels, future proofing the region and setting up industry for a low-carbon economy.

The focus of the North Canterbury report - the culmination of phase one of the RETA programme, is the fuel switching decision and the key role demand reduction plays in enabling fuel switching. Both biomass and electricity are considered as potential fuel sources. RETA also recognises the importance of efficient demand reduction and thermal efficiency measures for reducing energy consumption and right sizing the boiler investment, which in turn affects decision-making around fuel switching. The report illustrates a range of decarbonisation pathways, all of which demonstrate how the combined decisions of a range of process heat users may lead to common infrastructure challenges and opportunities from a supply perspective. Across the 80 sites, there are 164 individual projects across demand reduction, heat pumps and fuel switching. The 'MAC Optimal' pathway sees fuel decisions that result in 62% of the energy needs supplied by electricity and 38% supplied by biomass in 2036.

Food forest

On Thursday 23rd November the Year 7/8 class went down to help Grum sort out the food forest. We planted some vegetables like lettuce and spinach. We also ended up cutting comfrey plants and scattering the branches around the food forest. Some of us weeded out the unwanted plants and put them under a carpet mat. Thanks to Grum and Miss Holland for organising this.



William Pike Challenge Mountain Biking.

On Wednesday the Year 7/8 class went for a bike ride as part of the William Pike Challenge Outdoor activities. We went in two groups, intermediate and the less experienced mountain bikers. The Intermediate group went to Swoop and Swamp, while the other group went to Easy Rider, basecamp, and Snakes and Ladders. The easy group started at Easy Rider moving down the track to Snakes and Ladders. Once out of Snakes and Ladders, we crossed the road to the Basecamp track, where we went down a steep hill that turned to a corner and up to another smaller hill. St John's First Aid.

On Friday morning a First Responder trainer, Nikki, came in to teach us about First Aid. She taught us about CPR, how to use a Defibrillator, and how to put someone in the recovery position. For our CPR training we had to use a dummy and the DRS ABCD tactic. The DRS ABCD tactics are to check for Danger, check for a Response, Send for help, open their Airway, check their Breathing, and check their Circulation. Nikki taught us how to give CPR, then sent us to go try it for ourselves on a dummy. We each went into groups of three and did thirty chest compressions each. Once we all had done thirty we got into a circle and those

who wanted to did a challenge. The challenge was to see who could do chest compressions effectively for two minutes. We were taught how to put people in the recovery position, how to use an epi-pen, an inhaler, and how to bandage someone's wound. She also showed us how to use a defibrillator. For the younger students, she taught them how to put people in the recovery position, how to bandage wounds, and how to call 111.

School for Young Writers.

Last term Amelia S, Amelia N, Rosie and Waitapu went to a Masterclass in Christchurch run by the School for Young Writers. They had a great day developing their writing skills and they started writing a story up to 400 words in which a character has a super sense to enter into a competition. Once Claire thought about it for a while she got up and went for a walk through the forest till she got to a wide space occupied by a river flowing gently. She sat near the river and as a silent wind picked up, she smelt something like nothing she'd ever experienced in her life, she smelt the essence of a man and the slight aroma of metal coming from the eastern side of the park.

She hired a bike once she found the courage to follow the scene. She took it and rode quickly through the people and cars. As she got closer the smell got stronger. When she got there she found a boy around 14 trying to get away from a man chasing him with a knife. After a few seconds, before she realised what she was doing, she biked as fast as she could and crashed into the man. With anger on his face he brought the knife up to attack, and as it came down she looked around and caught eyes with the boy frozen with terror and shock. Seconds later Claire swiped a quick punch to his face, knocking him out, only receiving a small cut to her face. As blood trickled down her cheek she stood up and walked over to the boy helping him up, "thanks" the boy said, "no problem" Claire answered. After the attacker was taken to the police station, Claire left to go to her house and explained to her parents what happened while wondering how she smelt the danger 20 miles from where she sat at the park. Once she finished her parents told her to open the pendant. Inside she froze to see the incident and the same figure from before.

(f) Do not forget the reference to Lifetime Tax includes a lot more than Income Tax as we think of it - refer to point (7). (g) Another interesting thing that comes out is just how much tax is being paid over and above Income Tax, this shows up in point 8.




