Zucchini and corn fritters with salsa

INGREDIENTS

- 2 zucchini (350g), trimmed
- sea salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 90g plain flour
- 125g can corn kernels, drained, or 75g fresh corn kernels
- 3 spring onions, white and light green parts sliced
- 1 tbsp chopped flat-leaf parsley
- 1 tbsp finely chopped dill
- 80g feta, crumbled
- 1 egg
- 1 tsp chilli flakes (optional)
- 175ml extra-virgin olive oil, for frying
- lemon wedges, to serve

Salsa

- 1 avocado, diced
- 1 large ripe tomato, deseeded and diced
- 2 spring onions, sliced
- 1 tablespoon chopped flat-leaf parsley
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- juice of ½ lemon
- sea salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

METHOD

1. Grate the zucchini into a bowl. Add a good pinch of salt and toss it through, then set aside for 20 minutes to draw out the liquid.
2. Spread the zucchini in the middle of a clean tea towel, roll it up and, over the kitchen sink, twist to squeeze out as much liquid as possible. Return the zucchini to the bowl and add the flour, corn, spring onion, herbs, feta, egg and chilli flakes (if using), season with salt and pepper and mix well. Shape the mixture into eight patties – lightly oiling your hands makes this easier.
3. Combine all the salsa ingredients in a bowl and mix well.
4. Taste for seasoning and adjust as needed. Set aside to allow the flavours to develop.
5. Heat the olive oil in a large frying pan over medium-low heat, add three or four fritters and fry for 2-3 minutes on each side until golden brown. Remove with a slotted spoon and drain on paper towel.
6. Serve the fritters topped with salsa and lemon wedges.

Xinjiang Cumin Lamb

Everybody has started to discover the awesomeness of Xinjiang food, which melds classic Middle Eastern and Chinese flavours. Here's a quick one for you to try tonight.

Ingredients

- 1 tbsp vegetable oil
- 1 tbsp ginger, finely grated
- 3 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- ¾ cup whole dried Chinese chillies (about 18g)
- 1 brown onion, diced
- 500g lamb mince
- 1 tbsp light soy sauce
- 1 tbsp Shaoxing wine
- 3 tbsp water
- ⅓ cup chopped coriander
- 1-2 tsp toasted sesame seeds to garnish
- steamed rice and cucumber batons to serve

SPICE MIX

- 2 tbsp ground cumin
- 1 tsp sugar
- ½ tsp ground Sichuan pepper
- ¼ tsp cooking salt

Method

- **Step 1**

To make the spice mix, mix the ingredients together in a small bowl and set aside.

- **Step 2**

Heat oil in a large (30cm) non-stick frying pan over medium-high heat until hot. Add the ginger, garlic and chillies and cook for 1 minute to release the flavours. Add the onion. Saute for 1 to 2 minutes, until the onion just starts to soften.

- **Step 3**

Add the lamb and cook until no longer pink. Add the soy sauce and Shaoxing wine. Cook for 30 seconds. Add the spice mix and water, toss together, stirring to coat the lamb.

- **Step 4**

Serve over steamed rice with a scattering of coriander leaves, a sprinkling of sesame seeds and cucumber batons.

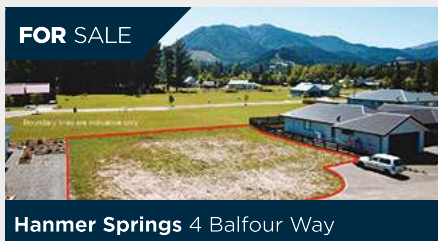



Year 5&6 Camp.

The Year 5/6s went to camp at Living Springs on Banks Peninsula. We had three fun-filled days. We were lucky to have really fun parent support. Thanks to Dave Wilson, Andrew Palmer and Becky Long. Gymnastics.

	HDPE 	High-density polyethylene - Milk and washing-up liquid bottles
	PVC 	Polyvinyl chloride - Food trays, cling film, bottles for squash, mineral water and shampoo.
	LDPE 	Low density polyethylene - Carrier bags and bin liners.
	PP 	Polypropylene - Margarine tubs, microwaveable meal trays.
	PS 	Polystyrene - Yoghurt pots, foam meat or fish trays, hamburger boxes and egg cartons, vending cups, plastic cutlery, protective packaging for electronic goods and toys.
