Wasp Control

Its that time of year as the weather warms that wasps become a problem for us again. The Councils Maintenance Team have been hanging Bell traps with bait early in the season to try to catch the Queen wasps as they come out of hibernation.

There was a swell in numbers a few weeks ago but the numbers have tailed off again. However as the days become consistently warmer we will again be plagued.

Later on in February/March as the wasps build nests and start to swarm, the team will poison the wasp nests with Verspex as they find them. They hunt for nests around the village and on the main walking tracks.

Vespex is a costly but effective synthetic protein laced with the poison

"Unfortunately we just cant kill them all, but the aim is to prevent people getting stung" says Graeme Shaw who is in charge of the program.

If you have a nest near you, report it using the 'Snap send Solve' App on your phone or report it on the HDC 0800 number. Short of pulling your house apart to get at a nest, the Team will do their best to destroy the nest for you .



Glazing The Christmas Ham

Cut a line through the skin all around the shank end. Insert a sharp knife between the rind and fat and run it along to detach the rind layer. Using your fingers, gently separate the rind from the fat. You can insert your hand deeper.

When you buy your ham, you'll notice right underneath the rind there is a layer of fat. DON'T trim this away. This fat turns into a beautiful crispy and sticky coating for your glaze and is DIVINE. Discard the rind. Run knife cutting into the fat layer about 1/4-inch deep to lightly score diamond pattern all over the surface. Don't cut right through the fat layer

Once your ham is in the oven, get started on your glaze For the best ham glaze my biggest piece of advice is not to simmer the glaze for too long, as you will end up with a hard caramel once it begins to cool, and it's extremely difficult to slather onto the outside of the ham when glazing. You want to bring it to a gentle simmer and take it off the heat quickly.

INGREDIENTS

- 8-10 pound (4-5 kg) bone-in fully cooked ham
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter,
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup honey
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 4 cloves garlic, smashed

Preheat the oven to 300°F | 150°C and arrange a rack in the lower third. Remove any plastic packaging or netting from the ham. Trim away the rind and discard. Set the ham aside to rest at room temperature for 1-2 hours.

Line a baking tray or dish with several sheets of aluminium foil or parchment paper if you prefer (it will make cleanup a lot easier).

- Remove the rind or skin of the ham (see above), ensuring you leave the fat on. Place the ham in the baking tray; pour 1/3 cup of water into the base of the pan and cover the ham with two pieces of foil or parchment paper and bake for 30 minutes.
- Meanwhile, heat the butter in a small pot or saucepan over medium heat until golden browned. Add in the brown sugar, honey, mustard, cinnamon and cloves, stirring to mix together well until the brown sugar has completely dissolved, (about 2 minutes).

Reduce heat to low and add in the garlic. Allow it to become fragrant, cooking for a further minute or two until the glaze just begins to simmer, then set it aside and let cool to lukewarm (the glaze should be the consistency of room-temperature honey).

- After 30 minutes baking time, carefully remove the ham from the oven and increase the oven temperature to 425°F | 220°C. Discard the foil or parchment paper and pour 1/3 of the glaze all over the ham, brushing in between the cuts to evenly cover. Return to the oven and bake uncovered for 15 minutes.
- Remove from the oven, brush with another third of the glaze and some of the pan juices, and repeat again after 15 minutes more minutes of baking until a dark golden-brown crust has formed, (about 30 minutes total). For added depth of flavour, mix some of the ham pan juices together with the glaze in the pot which will help keep it runny enough for brushing. If your crust is still pink after there suggested baking time, turn on your broiler (or oven grill), and allow it to broil for 2-5 minutes, while keeping an eye on it so it doesn't burn from the sugar.
- Let the ham rest 10-20 minutes before slicing.

The El Niño summer



It's official, NIWA has announced we are in for an El Niño summer.


New Zealand will tend to experience strong, more frequent westerly winds. An El Niño summer also means above-average temperatures which increases the chance of drier-than-normal conditions and windy weather. This can impact the amount of water available, for uses other than essential drinking, cooking, cleaning and stock water.

Drier-than-normal conditions can cause the ground to move, which some of the older pipes don't like and can tend to break. If this happens, it will disrupt the water supply as sources will have to be switched off while the broken pipe is found and repaired.

Cast your mind back to October when windy weather disrupted the water network right across the district due to power outages. Only Council's major pump stations have back up-power, and while we have a few portable generators, we rely on Council reservoirs to keep water flowing. In many places this is enough only water for a few hours, should power be lost.

Some of these disruptions can mean it takes a day or two to get the water flowing. In the height of summer when demand is at its greatest, do you have enough water storage to keep your operation running for three days?

- "What you are talking about? I don't have a talent!" I exclaim.



Persevering terns and the arrival of chicks

We are officially halfway through the black-fronted tern season! These dedicated parents have gone through all kinds of setbacks this season, however many have overcome challenges, and we are now seeing small to large chicks on most colonies.

Currently, 256 nests have been found along the Clarence and Acheron rivers. Of these nests 39% have managed to survive!

The largest cause of nest failure this season is due to predation with 92 nests already being munched down as a tasty snack for various predators lurking along the rivers. The biggest baddy of them all this season has been the Southern black-backed gull which has been seen cruising up and down the river in search for more nests. With the river levels so low, ferrets and feral cats have also been an issue for nests and small chicks.

However, these resilient birds have found other, more secure islands on which to re-nest and lay a second set of eggs , so let's hope they are more successful this time.

So far, 23% of nests have hatched and the parents are kept busy bringing back a constant food supply for these hungry mouths. As summer returns, we have placed out wooden chick shelters on some colonies to prevent chicks being exposed to heat exhaustion. Chicks have loved using these during periods of extreme temperatures along these rivers.

It is now more important than ever to give these colonies space. Chicks will run into the water as an attempt to escape danger and will be whisked away down the rapids as a result.

Give them space to keep them safe.




