## Christmas trifle

You can still make a spectacular trifle using store-bought custard and cake. But please, please don't use artificially flavoured jelly. Making your own is easy, and it is what will make your trifle the best on the block. Make the trifle the day before or even two days before. The only thing to do on the day is to whip the cream and pile on the berries.

#### Ingredients

1 x 450g store-bought Madeira cake or pound cake, cut into 2.5cm cubes 1/3 cup orange liqueur (such as Cointreau) or orange juice (see note) 7 tsp gelatin powder

1.5 litres (6 cups) cranberry juice, room temperature

3 punnets strawberries (about 750g), halved lengthways

1 punnet blueberries

1 punnet raspberries (see note)

icing sugar to finish

THICK CUSTARD (MAKES 750ML) 700ml (2 3/4 cups) full-fat milk

100g (1/2 cup) caster sugar, divided

1 tsp vanilla bean paste (or extract)

4 egg yolks

½ cup cornflour

**CREAM LAYER** 

625ml (2S cups) thickened cream

3 tbsp caster sugar

1 ½ tsp vanilla extract

#### Method

Cover the bottom of a 3.5-litre trifle dish with the cake pieces then drizzle over the orange liqueur (or juice).

#### TO MAKE THE CRANBERRY JELLY

Put half the cranberry juice (3 cups) into a saucepan over medium heat. Bring to a simmer, then turn off the stove. Pour the remaining room-temperature juice into a very large bowl. Sprinkle gelatin all over the surface (don't dump it all in one place or you'll get lumps) and whisk until it is mostly dissolved. Add the hot cranberry juice and continue whisking until the gelatin is fully dissolved.

#### TO MAKE THE FIRST JELLY LAYER

Pour half the warm jelly liquid carefully down the side of the trifle dish so the cake pieces remain submerged. Pour the remaining warm jelly into a bowl and leave it on the bench. DO NOT refrigerate. Refrigerate the trifle dish, uncovered, for 1.5 hours until it is partly set. (It needs to be firm enough so you can gently place a strawberry on top and it will stay on the surface).

#### TO MAKE THE CUSTARD

While the jelly is cooling, make the custard. Heat the milk, j cup sugar and vanilla to a simmer in a large saucepan over medium heat. Do not boil. In a large bowl, whisk together the remaining j cup sugar and the yolks, then whisk in the cornflour until smooth. While whisking, carefully pour in about S cup of the milk mixture. Once mixed in, slowly pour in the remaining milk while whisking continuously. Once incorporated, pour it back into the saucepan and return to the stove over low heat. Whisk constantly until it becomes thick - this will happen quickly (about 45 seconds). Once it is thick enough to thickly coat the back of a spoon, immediately remove it from the stove, pour it into a

bowl, cover with a sheet of cling film and press onto the surface. Leave on the bench to cool to room temperature until the trifle is ready to layer with custard.

#### TO ADD THE CUSTARD LAYER

Remove the trifle dish from the fridge. Whisk the room-temperature custard to loosen, then spoon onto the jelly. Smooth the custard surface and press against the sides of the dish to seal (this stops the next layer of jelly bleeding into the custard, so you get neat layers). Refrigerate, uncovered, for 1 hour until the surface firms up a bit. Give the remaining jelly a whisk then put it in the fridge at the same time to thicken a bit without fully setting. Refrigerate for 1 hour, but check at 30 minutes to ensure it isn't setting too fast. If it fully sets, you'll end up with a "broken glass" effect rather than a clear layer.

#### TO ADD THE SECOND JELLY LAYER

Remove both the trifle dish and the jelly from the fridge. The jelly should be sloppy but still spoonable. Carefully spoon the jelly over the custard and smooth the surface. Scatter over 1 punnet of halved strawberries (or half each raspberries and strawberries), pressing some in as needed to suspend throughout the jelly. Refrigerate for at least 3 hours (you can leave it in the fridge for up to 48 hours, until ready to assemble).

#### TO ASSEMBLE THE TRIFLE

Beat the cream, sugar and vanilla together until softly whipped. Just before serving, top the trifle with cream, then pile on the remaining berries and dust with a little icing

#### **TO SERVE**

To serve, dig ALL the way down when scooping. It is imperative that every serving includes a bit of every layer.



#### Hanmer Springs Christmas and New Year Refuse and Recycling Arrangements

Refuse and recycling collections in Hanmer Springs over Christmas and New Year have changed.

Monday 25 December and Monday 1 January	No Collections - Public Holiday
Tuesday 26 December and Tuesday 2 January	No Collections - Public Holiday
Wednesday 27 December and 3 January	Hanmer Springs collections

- Only Hurunui Council bags will be collected, these are available for purchase at Hanmer Springs Library (closed 25 Dec to 3 Jan), Hanmer Springs Service Station, Super Liquor, The Log Cabin and Hanmer Springs Transfer Station.
- Bags must be securely tied and at the kerbside or council collection point by 8am. Collection times
  may vary from normal, and the crew will not return to collect bags placed out late.
- Refuse bags must not exceed 15kg in weight. Bags split prior to the crew's arrival and non-official bags will not be collected.
- Bundles of cardboard will not be collected but can be recycled via any transfer station.

#### What is accepted via the recycling collections if it is clean and loose in a Council recycling bag?

- Newspapers, magazines, office paper and telephone directories.
- Cardboard, greetings cards, junk mail, envelopes, and egg boxes
- Food, drink, and pet food cans.
- Rigid plastic bottles and small containers, types 1, 2 and 5 with lids removed.

#### **Household Glass Bottle Recycling**

- Household glass bottles will be collected in Hanmer Springs providing they are in a Council issued recycling box, with all lids removed and no other recycling or contaminants in the box.
- Glass bottles left out for collection in non-HDC boxes will be stickered and left.

#### What cannot be recycled?

Wrapping paper, soft plastics, plastics 3, 4, 6 and 7, tetrapaks, polystyrene (including meat trays), plant pots, plastic strapping, clothing, food-stained paper or card, coffee cups, plastic lids, foil trays and food waste are not recyclable - if in doubt throw it out.

Do not put glass bottles in recycling bags, these can be recycled via any transfer station.

#### **Transfer Station Arrangements**

Hanmer Springs Transfer Station over Christmas and New Year will be closed on Public Holidays. Normal opening hours apply at all other times.


#### School Prizegiving.



Apprehension filled Greg Dellow's mind as he walked into Hanmer Springs library to set up an account. Shortly afterwards though, he walked out the door feeling over the moon.Legally blind, Dellow has no vision in his right eye, and five percent in his left eye.

He's no stranger to audio books, via Audible subscriptions which he said are expensive because he reads a lot. Having heard that his local library has great resources like the app BorrowBox where he could have access to a massive range of literature, for free, he was keen to know more.

Dellow expected a difficult process to get his library card, a simple process for people with good vision but a potential nightmare for people who are vision impaired.

Contrary to his expectations, he received a library card there and then, and was emailed and text messaged the links to the apps that same day.

"It was a perfectly lovely and pleasant experience."

He 'moves around a bit' with genres, and when he finds a good narrator he follows them too. Dellow has called North Canterbury's alpine town home for 25 years, he started as a lifeguard at Hanmer Springs Thermal Pools & Spa and moved into the technology side of the business over the years as his vision deteriorated. He is now Technology Manager.

"I work on everything computer related, and generally give everything a go."

On a screen he sees black background and white writing, has a screen reader, and AI technology is a big part of his daily life.

His guide dog Benson is always by his side. Looking forward to his summer holiday, Dellow is very happy to have a few good reads lined up.

District Librarian Mark O'Connell said his team works hard to assist everyone who walks through the library doors, helping them to enjoy all the services offered.




