

The result is a perfectly cooked duck with pink, juicy meat and burnished, crunchy skin. Serve the bird as is, or with some kind of sauce — either sweet or pungent — such as cranberry sauce, salsa verde or a spicy soy dipping sauce. And save the duck fat at the bottom of the pan. It will keep for at least three months in the refrigerator and is excellent on roasted vegetables, especially potatoes.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (2.5 to 3 kg) whole duck
- 1 tablespoon plus 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 2 teaspoons freshly ground black pepper
- 2 large garlic cloves, finely grated, or finely minced
- 1 tablespoon chopped thyme or rosemary leaves, or a combination, plus more sprigs for the cavity
- 1 tablespoon finely grated lemon or orange zest, or a combo
- 1½ teaspoons ground coriander or a spice mix like garam masala
- PREPARATION
 - Step 1

Bring a full kettle or medium pot of water to a boil (at least 2 quarts).Step 2

Meanwhile, remove giblets and neck from the duck cavity and reserve for another use. Trim any excess fat from around the duck cavity and the neck. Place duck, breast side up, on a rack in the sink. Pour half of the boiling water all over the top of the duck to tighten the skin. Flip the bird and pour remaining boiling water over the back.

• Step 3

Once the duck is cool enough to handle, using the tip of a very sharp paring knife, prick duck skin all over to help release the fat, especially where the skin is thickest, and be careful not to pierce the meat. It can be helpful to hold the knife nearly parallel to the bird. After piercing the skin, use the knife blade to score the duck breast in a crosshatch pattern (making deep cuts into the skin only, and not into the breast meat). Flip the bird and score the back as well (you don't need to prick the back). You may need to sharpen your knife along the way, as it's much easier to make clean cuts into the skin with a sharp knife. Using a clean kitchen towel or paper towels, thoroughly pat duck dry, including inside the cavity.

• Step 4

Season the duck all over, including cavity, with salt and pepper. In a small bowl, combine garlic, chopped herbs, citrus zest and coriander, if using, and make a paste. Rub garlic paste all over duck, inside and out. Place duck, breast side up, on rack in a roasting pan, stuff cavity with herb sprigs, and refrigerate, uncovered, for at least 4 hours and up to 24 hours. Step 5

When it's time to cook the bird, heat the oven to 450 degrees. Roast for 30 minutes. Remove the pan from the oven and carefully prick duck skin all over the top of the bird using a sharp paring knife. (You don't need to prick the back of the duck.) Reduce the oven temperature to 350 degrees and continue roasting until skin is golden brown and crispy, and the internal temperature at thickest part of the thigh reads 165 degrees on an instant-read thermometer, about 1 hour to 1 hour 45 minutes longer. Using tongs, gently tip duck to drain any liquid from the cavity. Transfer bird to cutting board to rest for at least 10 minutes. Carve and serve.

Baked Salmon Fillet with Maple

Salmon baked at a low temperature until medium-rare delivers a silky texture that tastes special enough to make it a festive centrepiece. This easy dish works any night of the week, since it comes together in less than half an hour. Maple syrup sweetens the glaze, which gets a savoury pop from whole mustard seeds in Dijon. Even though salmon is naturally fatty, a dollop of mayonnaise adds extra richness while thickening the glaze to help it seal onto the fish. The herbaceous aroma of cilantro stems baked into the sauce brightens the dish, as do tender leaves scattered on top. Fill out your feast with any combination of steamed rice, roasted potatoes, green beans or salad.

INGREDIENTS

Yield:

4 servings

- 1 (750 gram) skin-on or skinless salmon fillet
- 12 fresh coriander sprigs
- 2 tablespoons pure maple syrup
- 2 tablespoons whole-grain Dijon mustard
- 1 tablespoon mayonnaise
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- Lemon wedges, for serving

PREPARATION

Step 1

Remove salmon from the refrigerator. Heat oven to 325 degrees.

Step 2

Bundle the coriander sprigs by their stems and hold them tightly, then slice the stems crosswise until you get to the leaves. Reserve leaves for garnish. Transfer sliced stems to a small bowl and stir in the maple syrup, mustard and mayonnaise until well mixed. **Step 3**

Season the salmon all over with salt and pepper and place in a baking dish, skin-side down if there is skin. Slather the maple sauce all over the top.

Step 4

Bake until a paring knife slides into the centre with only a little resistance, 15 to 20 minutes. When you remove the knife and touch the blade to your upper lip, it should feel very warm but not hot. The salmon will continue to heat through out of the oven while in the baking dish. Top with the reserved coriander leaves, and squeeze lemon wedges all over just before serving

TIP

For 8 servings, buy a whole side of salmon, which usually weighs 1 1/4 to 1 3/4 kgs, and double the glaze ingredients. Bake on a parchment-lined sheet pan until medium-rare, 18 to 22 minutes.







Hurunui communities feed back their plan for their reserves

Hurunui District Council's Corporate Planner Maria Edgar is encouraged at the ideas put forward by Hurunui's communities, who have been shaping their future plan for their reserves.

Residents have fed back their suggestions to update the General Policies in the Reserves Management Plan to dictate how the reserves are utilised and managed within the district.

"Thank you to everyone who provided us with feedback – we have received some great suggestions. Now that we have received your feedback, an updated draft Reserves Management Plan will be prepared," Edgar said.

Suggested updates to the General Polices include providing for planting with natives for carbon credits; utilsing species resilient to climate change; providing for information boards on reserves about the characteristics and history of the reserves; utilising native flora to mitigate erosion; improving accessibility of reserves, walkways and playgrounds for people with diverse needs; and broadening the scope of the policies to allow for unique attractions on reserves, such as a water garden and dog parks.

Council's Chief Strategy and Community Officer Judith Batchelor said that an updated Reserves Management Plan will return to the community for formal submissions on the content of the draft plan. This will be publicly notified in 2024.

"We last reviewed our Reserves Management Plan over 12 years ago, so this feedback is very valuable to us. We are fortunate to have such wonderful reserves and green spaces in Hurunui, and we want to ensure the community's voice is forefront in how we utilise these spaces and protect their future use," said Batchelor.

Feedback on the General Polices closed on Thursday November 16 2023.


















West Ward Councillors Update:

Thank you very much to this publication for including this update in your newsletter.

The Local Electoral Act requires all local authorities to review their representation arrangements at least once every six years. This process is called a Representation Review; I am 1 of 4 Councillors on the Review Committee that will make recommendations to our Council in February and your views will then be sought in March as part of a formal consultation process. The representation arrangements decided on during this process will be used for the 2025 local government elections.

Although there was a Census carried out this year, data will not be available in time for us to use this, so Statistics NZ have required us to use the 2018 data which is disappointing, as we believe there has been significant population growth in some areas of the District.

We are required to carefully consider effective representation of communities of interest and ensure fair representation e.g. if Wards are used again, we have to apply the +/- 10% rule to ensure equality per elected member. Community Boards also have to be considered, along with Maori wards and whether to support first past the post or single transferable vote.

Information will be provided nearer the time about what is being proposed and I invite you to look out for that and provide feedback, as it is important to us that you feel you are fairly represented.

On behalf of all West Ward Councillors, I wish you all a very happy Christmas and all the best for 2024. Cheers Karen.


