#### <u>Free Meningococcal B catch up period</u> <u>ends 28 February 2024</u>



 Meningococcal B (MenB) and Meningococcal ACWY vaccines are free for 13 to 25 year olds who are in their

first year of living in boarding school hostels, tertiary education halls of residence, military barracks, youth justice facilities or prisons or moving into a close living facility in the next three months.

• Until 28 February 2024, there is also a free catch-up period for MenB vaccines, for those aged 13 to 25 years in any year of a close living facility.

#### MMR vaccines encouraged for travellers

 Last week, Te Whatu Ora advised Kiwis travelling overseas to make sure they are fully immunised against measles, as cases continue to occur around the world, including in Australia, the United Kingdom, across the Middle East and Asia, and parts of the United States.
 The MMR vaccine is free for everyone aged 18 and under, and for those over the age of 18 who are eligible for free New Zealand healthcare.



RATs will continue to be available to the health and disability care sector and public for free until 30 June 2024.

enable access to antiviral medications to people at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 and to help reduce the impact of the virus on hospital admission rates.



## Place Names and Pronunciations

Having been born and bred in Hanmer Springs I sometimes feel as though I am waging a one man campaign to honour the correct pronunciation and spelling of some of the street names in Hanmer. What I am talking about is those that are named after the pioneers of our district whose dedicated input gave us much of what we have and enjoy today. Not bothering to pronounce their names properly is dishonouring the efforts they put in to the building of the district

The main mispronunciation we hear is that of Argelins' Road. It is a hard 'G' as in gate and there is no 'J' sound in the name at all. It is Arg -elin, not Ar -jelin as we so often hear, even from members of the Council, Community Board and people who should know better.

This week we had an email from Denise Chapman who is a descendant of the Argelins and a recent visitor to Hanmer. She was appalled to hear everyone mispronouncing the name and what about naming streets after so many families who were instrumental in building the town, she asked, like the Lunns and the Atkinsons who have been here since the beginning. And of course there is that favourite old chestnut — why oh why was Dog Creek renamed to Dog Stream. We already addressed a complaint about that to the Council and learned that it was nothing to do with either the Amuri County Council or the Hurunui District Council. It was the work of some Pommy bureaucrat in a Wellington back office.

Generally speaking, the big ones are called rivers and the little ones are called creeks with streams coming somewhere in between. However, we were told (and you can't always believe everything you are told) that in the realm of England, creeks are always tidal, thus all non-tidal creeks in New Zealand got renamed 'streams' at great expense in road signage. Countess Creek, Stinking Creek, Dog Creek and all creeks up the Lewis Pass road became streams. In fact in an act of stupidly extreme political correctness Stinking Creek became Smothering Stream, but we were eventually allowed the stink back, in honour of all those slaughtered animals that created the odoriferous handle in the first place.

And while we are on the subject, who decided to rename Lahmert's Hill as Pumpkin Hill. The Lahmert family were a big part of the early years in Hanmer Springs. Mr Lahmert was very much involved in tree planting in Hanmer and was involved in the formation of the Domain. Mrs Lahmert was the proprietor of a hotel/guest house where the AA Camping ground was and the story goes that when the Governor General came to stay he went on a horse ride over Jacks Pass to the Clarence Valley. Because the Governor General was staying there Mrs Lahmert insisted that all must dress for dinner. The G-G was late arriving back and then he needed to bathe and don the right bib and tucker for dinner. Meanwhile everyone was forced to wait for his presence and dinner was not served until after 11 pm. Mrs Lahmert's Guest House was later relocated to the site where Monteiths is today.

Surely, the Lahmert name is more worthy of the honour than an amorphous bloody pumpkin.

# Supporting Ovarian Cancer


The Pinkie talked with Wendy Gerritsen as she passed through Hanmer last week. Wendy was diagnosed with high grade serous ovarian cancer Stage IIIC in March 2021. In February 2024, which is ovarian cancer awareness month, Wendy will be riding through as many South Island towns as she can to raise people's awareness of ovarian cancer. Each year approximately 370 women in New Zealand die from ovarian cancer, the 5 year survival rate is 36%. There is no effective screening test, and the symptoms are non-specific. Cervical smears do not detect ovarian cancer.

Wendy wants to make as many people aware of Ovarian cancer as she can, so that they can catch ovarian cancer in the early stages, which gives a better chance of survivability.

She has given several talks to groups in her local area, however she wants to spread the awareness wider. She will be riding her horse, Anmoch, through towns around the South Island and will try to organise talks in towns where she can.

Wendy has been passionate about horses all her life. She got Anmoch as a young horse just before she was diagnosed with cancer. Anmoch has given Wendy something to take her mind off cancer and given her goals to look forward to.

# Island Hills Station Walking Track

Thankfully the rain is drumming on my roof, and I am grateful the area is considerably damper. Even better the forest has recently been opened and Hanmer is returning to normal. Slightly quieter weekend on the visitor front too, but that takes pressure off the cafes bars and shops a little who deserve a rest.

This Christmas, Lorna and I decided we had enough "stuff" and would focus on presents that were experiences or adventures. We booked ourselves into The Island Hills Station Walk.

What a beautiful delight. Just an hour from Hanmer tucked well behind Culverden nestles a beautiful local gem. It is an adventure to get there, narrow roads above steep gorges and flimsy suspension bridges are just a start. This tramp is truly beautiful, Shaun and Haley your hosts are delightful. The tramp gives you experiences of Manuka and Kanuka forests absolutely buzzing continuously with bees making beautiful local honey, beech forests, Regenerating natural forests and bush in the QEII National Trust land and open pasture.

The tracks are narrow, often old pack tracks, sometimes riverbeds and often single tracks hand cut. Steep and windy, Great Walk wide paths this is not. Steep and technical at times but always a delight around the corner. This is a working station, so cattle, pasture, bees and sheep are an integral part of the walk, but this is seamlessly meshed with conservation, natural trees and wildlife and an abundance of wildlife. Beautiful birdsong as a backdrop, so much nicer than ear buds. Steep slopes, gentle slopes, slippery slopes this track had it all. And at the end of each day not only were there beautiful small swimming holes in the rivers but hot showers too.

The trip is complimented with conservation, history, humour, and personal touches. The kitchens are well equipped, the huts are steeped in history and visitors add a humorous touch of poems, drawings, and poignant memories. Sir Charles Upham, NZs most decorated combatant, is omnipresent on the tracks, many of which were used by him to walk stock over to the Lewis Pass and beyond.


The final and best touch of this wonderful tramp was the total absence of cell phone coverage and internet. Three perfect days of solitude and rest, well away from it all were fantastic.

# Indian Motor Cycle Rally coming to Hanmer Springs

One hundred plus Indian Riders are coming to Hanmer on 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> March for their annual Rally. The Indian motor cycle was the first American produced motor bike with the company having been formed in 1901, although they had been building bicycles from 1897. The earliest Indians pre-dated Harley Davidsons by a couple of years.

This group tell us they are riding the modern Indians. "Some of us ride larger bikes that can very comfortably cruise for days and days, with features like, heated seats, heated handle grips, GPS guidance, 6 speaker stereos, ABS, traction control and even electronic suspension.

"Some people customise their bikes with all sorts of special paint schemes, leather tassels (an old to Traditional American Indian clothing), special lighting, back rests, taller handlebars and all sorts of crazy extras."

Between 1962 and 1967, Burt Munro\* from New Zealand used a modified 1920s Indian Scout to set a number of land speed records, as dramatised in the 2005 film *The World's Fastest Indian*.

In 2014 Indian had a similar custom streamliner built, the *Spirit of Munro*, to promote their new 111 cubic-inch engine and challenge speed records.



They will be having a free Show'n'shine display on the Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> March from 9am – 11am at the Hanmer Springs Hotel.

They will then be riding down the main street and out to Mt Lyford for lunch, returning later in the day. All are welcome to come see the motorcycles on display.

# Sticky Korean chicken wings with kimchi-pickled cucumbers

Pureed kiwifruit contains a natural enzyme that helps to tenderise the chicken wings, while also giving them a sweet, sticky glaze. Ingredients

- 1 kiwifruit, peeled
- i cup sov sauce
- 2kg chicken wings, trimmed
- 2 tbsp gochujang
- 1 tbsp honey
- 1 tbsp sesame oil
- 4 tbsp rice wine vinegar
- 200g kimchi
- 250g baby cucumbers, quartered
- 1 butter lettuce, leaves separated, to serve
- steamed rice, to serve
- black sesame seeds, to serve

#### Method

#### Step 1

Place the kiwifruit and soy sauce in a small food processor and process until smooth. Place in a large non-reactive bowl, add the chicken wings and toss to coat. Set aside at room temperature for 15 minutes to marinate.

#### Step 2

Combine the gochujang, honey, sesame oil and 2 tablespoons of the vinegar together in a small bowl. Set aside.

#### Step 3

Roughly chop the kimchi, transfer it to a medium bowl, add the cucumber and remaining vinegar and toss to coat.

#### Step 4

Preheat a chargrill to high heat. Add the chicken wings and cook, turning regularly, for 10-12 minutes, or until charred and cooked through. Serve the wings with kimchi cucumbers, lettuce, rice and sesame seeds. To eat: spoon the rice into the lettuce leaves and top with pickled vegetables. Eat alongside the wings.

## **Chocolate Mousse**

The mousse, a simple classic, goes really well with raspberries and/or strawberries.

#### **Ingredients**

- 125g dark chocolate (gluten-free if required) 50g unsalted butter
  - 150ml cream
  - 2 egg yolks
  - 3 egg whites
  - 45g castor sugar

#### Method

- 1. Chop the chocolate into pieces and melt over a bain-marie. Add the butter, stir until smooth. Set aside to cool.
  - 2. Whip the cream to stiff peaks. Beat the egg yolks and blend into the cream. Whisk the egg whites until frothy, then, while still whisking, add a third of the sugar a little at a time until the egg whites are smooth and shiny. Gradually add the remaining sugar, whisking until stiff peaks form.
  - **3.** Carefully fold the egg whites into the cream mixture, one third at a time. Fold in the melted chocolate mixture, making sure it is thoroughly incorporated. Spoon the mix into 4 cups or glasses and refrigerate for at least 3 hours.
  - **4.** Whip some additional cream and place a dollop on top of the mousse. You can also grate chocolate over the cream, a classic way to finish a classic dessert.






