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zucchini and halloumi fritters

Take advantage of plentiful courgettes/zucchinis this year.

INGREDIENTS

450g (about 3) zucchini

100g halloumi, coarsely grated

2 eschalots (French shallots), finely chopped

handful dill fronds, finely chopped, plus extra to serve (or parsley or

coriander)

1/2 tsp dried mint

60g plain flour

1 egg, lightly beaten

extra virgin olive oil, for frying

sea salt and black pepper

lemon wedges, to serve

Garlic voghurt

200g full-fat natural yoghurt

1 small garlic clove, finely grated

1 tbsp extra virgin olive oil

sea salt and black pepper

METHOD

For the garlic yoghurt, combine the ingredients in a bowl and season to taste. Set aside.

Grate the zucchini on the coarse side of a box grater and place in a colander with a good pinch of salt. Toss to coat and allow to sit for 10 minutes. Squeeze the excess liquid from the zucchini and dry it thoroughly on absorbent paper or a clean tea towel. Transfer to a large bowl along with the halloumi, shallots, dill, dried mint, flour and egg. Season with black pepper and a touch of salt and gently mix to combine.

Heat some olive oil in a frying pan over a medium-high heat and place heaped tablespoons of the mixture into the oil. Cook the fritters in batches, so as not to overcrowd the pan, until golden (around 2 minutes). Flip, gently flatten and cook on the other side for another 2 minutes or until golden. Transfer to absorbent paper to drain. Repeat with the remaining mixture, wiping the pan clean and adding more oil as needed. Season with sea salt and serve the fritters hot with the garlic yoghurt, extra dill fronds and lemon wedges. Makes about 18 small fritters

Melon and Ham (but not as you know it)

Turning that summer antipasto into more of a salad situation is a win

Ingredients

200g thinly sliced prosciutto (check gluten-free if required), at room temperature

2 balls mozzarella, at room temperature

1/4 large rockmelon, peeled, seeds removed, evenly sliced

1/4 large honeydew melon, peeled, seeds removed, evenly sliced

fennel fronds (if cooking the porchetta, use the reserved fronds)

seeds from 1 pomegranate

DRESSING

1 garlic clove, crushed

1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil

1 generous tbsp sweet balsamic vincotto (or balsamic glaze)

zest and juice of 1/2 lemon

Method

Step 1

Combine the dressing ingredients in a bowl and set aside.

Step 2

Cut each slice of melon in half and wrap with a slice of prosciutto. Place in a large serving bowl or platter. Add the two balls of burrata and any leftover slices of prosciutto. Scoop the pomegranate arils into any gaps on the plate and scatter with fennel fronds. Season generously with salt and pepper and spoon over the dressing.

Note - the original recipe calls for burrata a fresh Italian cheese but you can use mozzarella as a substitute. To make this dish really sing, make sure the prosciutto and burrata are not fridge-cold. You want that contrast of indulgent cheese and soft ham with the crunch of the melon.

This dish also lends itself to a few freshly cooked and peeled prawns

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


Mr Gillespie asked that the township should continue to be called Hanmer Springs. He said many people had made representations to him asking for a reversion to the old name.

The original subdivision near the springs area was part of a larger block known as the Hanmer Plains Reserve, and in official records was referred to by both names, replied the Minister. The name used on departmental maps for many years had been Hanmer.

The Lands and Survey Department asked for clarification some years ago, and in 1939 the honorary Geographic Board decided on Hanmer, said the Minister. On the reconstitution of the Geographic Board in 1946, the decisions of the honorary board were officially adopted. Several objections were received, but the board decided that Hanmer was the more practical name.

If you want help or advice or want to find out about anything I am happy to try to help. And if you see something positive, or know of an event worth sharing please do not hesitate to contact me.



Polyethylene terephthalate - Fizzy drink bottles and frozen ready meal packages.



HDPE



High-density polyethylene - Milk and washing-up liquid bottles





Polyvinyl chloride - Food trays, cling film, bottles for squash, mineral water and shampoo.



LDPE



Low density polyethylene - Carrier bags and bin liners.





Polypropylene - Margarine tubs, microwaveable meal trays.





Polystyrene - Yoghurt pots, foam meat or fish trays, hamburger boxes and egg cartons, vending cups, plastic cutlery, protective packaging for electronic goods and toys.



Other


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
