

Bali's Babi Guling

Ingredients

1.5kg piece of pork belly, skin scored

1 tbsp vegetable oil1 tsp turmeric powderj tsp black pepper

1 tbsp table saltsteamed rice, to serve

FRESH SAMBAL

 2 kaffir lime leaves, central vein removed and finely shredded

 1 stalk lemongrass, tender central white part only, finely sliced

2 large red chillies, deseeded and finely chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced 1 small red onion, minced

juice of 2 limes
2 tsp white vinegar
1 tsp sugar
2 tsp fish sauce

Method

Boil a kettle of water. Place the pork on a rack in the sink and pour boiling water over the skin. Pat dry with paper towels.

Combine the vegetable oil with the turmeric, black pepper and a teaspoon of salt and rub the mixture all over the meat side of the pork belly. Place on a rack in a roasting tray and rub the remaining salt over the skin of the pork. Rest in the fridge overnight, uncovered, to dry the skin.

For the fresh sambal, combine ingredients in a non-reactive bowl and stir to dissolve the sugar. Adjust the seasoning with a little more sugar, lime juice or fish sauce as necessary.

Heat your oven to 220C (200C fan-forced) and roast the pork for 1 hour. Reduce the heat to 180C (160C fan-forced) and cook for a further 30 minutes. Rest for 10 minutes, then slice and serve with cooked rice and green beans in coconut cream.

Richard's tip: Getting good crackling on pork is both a science and an art. Pay attention to it as it cooks because the skin will often buckle unevenly. Mask areas with foil if they look like burning, and consider using a hot grill at the end to crisp any areas that haven't crackled.





Crispy pork belly with coriander, peanut and red onion salad

Ingredients

- 1kg pork belly
- sea salt
- white rice, to serve

SALAD

- S small red onion chopped
- 1 large handful of coriander leaves and stems, roughly chopped
- 1 handful of unsalted peanuts, roasted and crushed
- 1 tbsp sesame seeds, roasted
- S spring onion, finely sliced
- 1S tbsp Chinkiang black vinegar
- 2 tsp peanut oil

Method

- 1. Place the pork belly on a wire rack set over a plate (to catch any drips) and refrigerate, uncovered, for 24 hours to dry the skin out and make it more crispy. If you have time, then 2 days is even better.
 - 2. Preheat the oven to 190C (170C fan-forced). Transfer the pork belly to a roasting tin, then, using a sharp knife, score the skin deeply in a diamond pattern and rub generously with sea salt. Roast the pork for 20 minutes, then reduce the temperature to 170C (150C fan-forced) and roast for a further 20 minutes or until the meat is cooked through and the skin is blistered and crisp.
 - 3. Remove the pork from the oven, cover with foil and set aside in a warm place to rest for 20 minutes. Cut the pork belly into 2cm cubes.
 - 4. To make the salad, place all the ingredients in a bowl and toss together, then add the pork and mix through. Season with sea salt, divide onto 4 plates and serve with a little white rice.

April the first, 2024, is the date the baton officially changes hands.





Community Car

The Hanmer Springs Community Car was established in March 2023.

The idea was conceived by the current Practice Manager Mr Paul Walmsley.

Since its introduction into the local community a year ago the vehicle has provided a source of transport for more than 200 residents seeking transfer to their medical appointments at the Health Centre, or to specialist consultations in Christchurch & other parts of Canterbury.

Paul Walmsley says an application for a financial grant to establish the service was approved by the Christchurch based Manchester Unity Trust. As a result, a small hybrid vehicle was purchased.

"Further grants from the NZ Lotteries Commission, Environment Canterbury [ECan], plus generous donations from the Hanmer Springs Community has allowed the Health Centre to offer this essential service free of any charge for the past year," he said.

"We now aim to continue & maintain this service as a free offer to our patients & elderly residents over the next twelve months. Further donations will help us achieve this goal."

"The Hanmer Springs Health Centre has recently announced that Environment Canterbury [ECan] has for the second time approved another grant to enable the community vehicle transport service to continue. This is great news," he said.

"A further funding initiative is planned in May 2024 whereby proceeds from a gala charity performance of Vivaldi's Four Seasons Concerto in Hanmer on Mother's Day will go to purchase Mobility Wheelchairs for the Health Centre, and to contingency expenses related to the Community Car's operation," Paul Walmsley said.

Hurunui District Council Notices

Easter Refuse and Recycling Hanmer Springs

On week commencing April 1, rubbish, and recycling in Hanmer Springs will be collected one day later than normal on Tuesday April 2.

Please remember:

- Only Hurunui District Council bags will be collected; these are sold via the transfer station, library, Hanmer Springs Garage, Super Liquor, and the Log Cabin.
- Bags must be securely tied and at the kerbside by 8am as collection times may vary to normal.
- Bags must not exceed 15kg.
- Bags split prior to the crew's arrival and non-Council bags will not be collected. Bundles of cardboard will not be collected but can be recycled via the transfer station.

The following are accepted via Council's recycling bags, provided they are free from food waste and loose.

- Newspapers, magazines, catalogues, leaflets, and telephone directories
- · Clean cardboard, including greetings cards and egg boxes.
- Clean food and drink cans.
- Rigid plastic bottles and small containers, types 1, 2 and 5 with lids removed.

Household glass bottles will be collected, provided they are in a Council recycling box with all lids removed.

All transfer stations are closed on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, and Easter Monday.

Rainbow Possum Control Notice





2024 RAINBOW AERIAL POSSUM CONTROL OPERATION

Vector Free Marlborough (VFM) wishes to advise the public of its intention to aerially apply the toxin Sodium fluoroacetate (1080) to the Rainbow area for the purpose of controlling possums. The Rainbow operation is being carried out on behalf of OSPRI as part of its TBfree New Zealand programme, which aims to eradicate bovine tuberculosis from wildlife vectors that pose a risk to farmed cattle and deer.

Description of Area

The permission area for the 2024 Rainbow possum control operation takes in land in the upper Wairau catchment, from the vicinity of Lake Sedgemere downstream to Bull Paddock Flat approximately 5km east of St Arnaud Village. The eastern boundary mostly follows the St Arnaud Range and the edge of Nelson Lakes National Park. In the west the boundary mostly follows the Raglan Range and abuts Molesworth Station

Public Access & Recreational Facilities

Rainbow road, Wairau – Hanmer Springs Hydro road, Rainbow ski field road, Bull Paddock creek track, Ronan's stream track, Hamilton river route, Lee's creek track and hut, Connor's creek route and hut, Paske route and hut, Begley route and hut, Dip Flat RNZAF training camp, and Coldwater camping ground are all within the treatment area. Public access to these facilities will be restricted while the aerial application of toxic bait takes place and afterwards until they have been inspected and cleared of most toxic baits. Toxin warning signs will be in place at all track entrances immediately prior to the application of toxic bait. Advisory signage will also be installed at key sites prior to non-toxic prefeed application.

Commencement Date

Subject to favourable weather, control is planned to commence from mid-April 2024, with the aerial application of non-toxic, cereal pre-feed pellets. This will be followed approximately 7-10 days later by the aerial application of bait containing biodegradable sodium fluoroacetate (1080).

All work is weather dependent, and commencement may be later than indicated. In the event of an extended delay, further notices will be placed to advise the public.

Bait Description

Aerial control using 1080:

- Pre-feed Non-toxic cereal-based pellet, approximately 16 mm long, cinnamon-lured, and non-dyed (sandy coloured).
- Toxic bait Cereal-based pellet, approximately 16 mm long, cinnamon-lured, and dyed green with a toxic loading of 0.15% Sodium fluoroacetate (1080).

The aerial operation will use helicopters equipped with Global Positioning System (GPS) hardware and calibrated buckets to ensure accurate placement.

Precautions

The pesticide is poisonous to humans and domestic animals. The public are reminded of the danger that toxic baits and possum carcasses pose, particularly to children and dogs.

- DO NOT TOUCH OR EAT BAITS
- Children must be kept under strict supervision in the control area
- Dogs must be kept under strict control at all times and not have access to, or be taken into,

the control area, as they are particularly susceptible to harm from contact with toxic baits and poisoned carcasses. The risk that poisoned carcasses pose to dogs may extend downstream of the control area.

- Toxin warning signs will be installed at main public entry points and the public are reminded that it is an offence to remove this warning signage. Please follow the instructions on the signs.
- Game animals should not be sold or taken for eating from within or adjacent to this area until it is declared clear of pesticides.






