COPING WITH FLU AT HOME

Treating the symptoms:

To reduce fever and relieve aches and pains, take over the counter medication such as paracetamol. ALWAYS follow dosage advice on the packaging.

A cool (not cold) wet facecloth to the forehead will also lower body temperature.

Drink plenty of fluids:

People need up to 2 litres (8 cups) of fluid a day. Ensure the sick person keeps taking fluids, sipping small amounts at a time. Water is fine but when you are sick, cold drinks containing a little sugar and electrolytes such as "sports" drinks or fruit juice, diluted with plenty of water, are better. Avoid drinks that contain alcohol and caffeine.

Watch for danger signs:

Note the sick person's temperature, fluid intake and symptoms. This will help when asking for advice. Seek advice if symptoms include:


- Shortness of breath
- Chest pain
- Confusion or disorientation
- Coughing up blood
- Vomiting that does not ease
- Dehydration that doesn't improve through drinking
- Temperature above 38 degrees Celsius which doesn't settle with paracetamol

For specific advice on looking after yourself or caring for a sick person call your GP, or if afterhours, a nurse will answer your call.

If you call our clinic phone out of hours, your call is always answered by a registered nurse who will assess your needs, offer advice or, if required, pass the call to our on-call clinician. It can take several minutes to answer the phone so please be patient and hold, and follow the voice prompts carefully. If you are seen by the on-call clinician there is a \$25 after-hours call out fee on top of the consultation fee.



Spicy Tuna Poke Bowl: a midweek dinner favourite



Who has time to make sushi rolls on a week nights?

A spicy tuna poke bowl, with a generous squirt of sriracha, keeps things interesting, layering in a zing of spice and a garlicky, vinegary flavour.

If you can't handle the heat – or want a kidfriendly version – switch it for tomato sauce.

Ingredients

SUSHI RICE

- 2 cups sushi rice, uncooked
- 3 cups tap water, cold
- 1/4 cup rice vinegar
- 2 tsp white sugar
- 1/4 tsp cooking salt

CREAMY SPICY TUNA TOPPING

- 425g canned tuna in oil, drained (see note)
- 3 tbsp sriracha (see note)
- 4 tbsp kewpie mayonnaise, or whole-egg mayonnaise
- 1 tsp sesame oil
- 1/2 tsp cooking salt
- 1/4 cup finely chopped spring onion, plus extra for garnish
- 2 tsp white sesame seeds

TOPPINGS

- 1 large avocado, halved, seed removed, peeled then finely sliced
- 6 baby cucumbers or 1 large cucumber, cut into thin rounds
- pinch of white and black sesame seeds
- pickled ginger, optional
- 2 tbsp nori, cut into long thin strips from 1 nori sheet, optional

Method

• Step 1

To make the sushi rice, place the rice and water in a medium saucepan over high heat (see note). Once the entire surface of the water is rippling, put the lid on and turn the heat down to low. Cook for 14 minutes or until the water is absorbed – no peeking, no stirring! Remove the saucepan from the heat and set aside for 10 minutes with the lid on. Mix the rice vinegar, sugar and salt in a small bowl until the sugar dissolves. Pour over the rice then fluff the rice with a rice paddle or rubber spatula.

Step 2

To make the spicy tuna topping, place the ingredients in a bowl and mix to your desired texture. Some people like to mash the tuna until it's spreadable, almost like pate. Others like to keep it a little chunkier.

Step 3

To assemble, divide the rice between four bowls. Top with tuna, sliced avocado and cucumber and pickled ginger, if using. Sprinkle with sesame seeds and nori. Dig in.

Notes

- If you buy your rice in sealed bags from a grocery store, there is no need to rinse the rice before cooking. If it's from an open-air market or scoop bin, however, it's best to wash it. You will need to reduce the water by 1/4 of a cup. Otherwise, the rice will be waterlogged rather than fluffy.
- Canned tuna in oil has a richer flavour and better texture than canned tuna in spring water. If using tuna in spring water, you might need an extra squirt of mayonnaise.
- For a non-spicy version, swap the sriracha for 2 tablespoons of tomato sauce (ketchup). This makes the sauce pink and adds extra flavour to the topping without making it spicy.

Hurunui! We love you! You and Me!

We love Hanmer Springs. It's so unique. It is surrounded by the natural beauty of mountains; the Hanmer Range, the Amuri Range and the Organ Range. The flanks of these mountain ranges, that face our village (our home), form a natural amphitheatre that protects our forest heritage, creating a basin; a place of warmth in summer, cool mountain air in winter and a year-round place of refreshment and healing.

The Hurunui is home to just 13,450 people, and just over 8% (1140) of these lovely souls live in Hanmer Springs. Yes, we're lovely souls.

Are you getting a feeling of how small our district is?

The Hurunui has 7,098 households, so we have a tiny ratepayer base, that fund a large district. Look at the table below. See how we differ from our neighbours. We're six times (6X) larger than Christchurch, but only have 3.4% of their population.

Unlike our neighbours, our swimming pools are not subsidised by our fellow rate payers. We simply have too many kilometres of roads to look after. So we reply on our visitors to help pay the cost of running our pools.

So when visitors make grumbling sounds about the entry fee what they fail to realise is they're actually "loving on us"! Aren't they beautiful people? They're helping us, and our district. Our visitors forget that the swimming pools in their own town (or city) are subsidised by their non-swimming neighbours.

So thank you for visiting. We rely on you coming. You lovely souls!





Entries close at 5pm Monday 13 May.



Alternative date will be May 21st.







I think ANZAC is about the people that died in the war and didn't come back. I feel sad that people died and didn't live until they were old.






