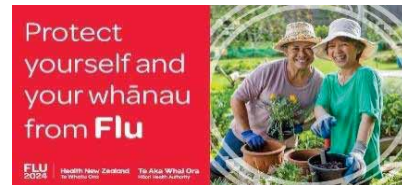

COPING WITH FLU AT HOME

Treating the symptoms:

To reduce fever and relieve aches and pains, take
over the counter medication such as paracetamol.
ALWAYS follow dosage advice on the packaging.

A cool (not cold) wet facecloth to the forehead will
also lower body temperature.

Drink plenty of fluids:

People need up to 2 litres (8 cups) of fluid a day.
Ensure the sick person keeps taking fluids, sipping
small amounts at a time. Water is fine but when you
are sick, cold drinks containing a little sugar and
electrolytes such as "sports" drinks or fruit juice,
diluted with plenty of water, are better. Avoid drinks
that contain alcohol and caffeine.

Watch for danger signs:

Note the sick person's temperature, fluid intake and
symptoms. This will help when asking for advice.
Seek advice if symptoms include:

- Shortness of breath
- Chest pain
- Confusion or disorientation
- Coughing up blood
- Vomiting that does not ease
- Dehydration that doesn't improve through
drinking
- Temperature above 38 degrees Celsius
which doesn't settle with paracetamol

For specific advice on looking after yourself or caring
for a sick person call your GP, or if afterhours, a
nurse will answer your call.

If you call our clinic phone out of hours, your call is always answered
by a registered nurse who will assess your needs, offer advice or, if
required, pass the call to our on-call clinician. It can take several
minutes to answer the phone so please be patient and hold, and
follow the voice prompts carefully. If you are seen by the on-call
clinician there is a \$25 after-hours call out fee on top of the
consultation fee.

The dustings of snow we've had are laying the foundation for those bigger snow falls; they cool the ground!

We have two local ski fields within a stones throw of Hanmer Springs!

The **Hanmer Springs Ski Area** offers club field skiing at its best. The ski area is located just "over the back" of Hanmer Springs, on the northern flank of Mount Saint Patrick (1413m). The ski area has a vertical range of 310 metres and provides 52 hectares of inbound terrain. The Amuri Ski Club, founded in 1957, runs Hanmer Springs Ski Area. Anyone can ski or board at Hanmer Springs Ski Area, however, there are many benefits for being a member of the Amuri Ski Club, including discounted lift passes and discounted on-mountain accommodation.

The **Mount Lyford Ski Area** is a picturesque 1-hour drive from Hanmer Springs. The Ski Area is 8km from the Mount Lyford Lodge which is situated on the corner of the Inland Road and Mt Lyford Forest Drive, about 26km north of Waiau township. The access road passes through native Beach Forest and into the alpine environment where you will find the Mount Terako Basin, and the Ski Area.

Mt Lyford is a dog friendly ski area. If you'd like to take your dog you will need a Dog pass which can be purchased from the ticket office.

Sriracha, Butter and Roasted Tomato Noodles v.2



Take your pasta to “flavour town” with this bold combination of sriracha hot sauce, ginger and cherry tomatoes. Oh yes!

Ingredients

- 500g cherry tomatoes, halved
- 4 eschalots (French shallots), thinly sliced
- 1 tbsp finely grated ginger
- 1 tbsp paprika
- 2 tbsp brown sugar
- 2 tbsp sesame oil
- 400g dry spaghetti
- 1/4 cup sriracha
- 50g unsalted butter, chopped
- baby lemon balm or mint leaves, to serve

Optional Ingredients

- 30g anchovies, drained
- 1/2 cup pitted kalamata olives

Method

• Step 1

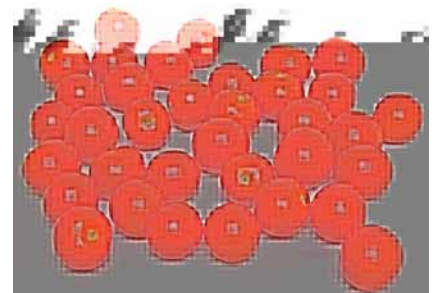
Preheat oven to 200C fan-forced (220C conventional). Combine tomato, eschalot, ginger, paprika, sugar, and oil in a large baking tray. Season with salt and pepper. Cover with foil and roast for 10 minutes. Uncover and roast for a further 10-15 minutes, or until blistered and tender.

• Step 2

Meanwhile, cook the spaghetti in salted boiling water for 6-8 minutes, or according to packet directions. Drain, reserving 1/2 cup of the pasta water.

• Step 3

Add the pasta, pasta water, sriracha and butter to the tray and toss to coat. Optionally, also turn in the thinly sliced anchovies, and the kalamata olives, halved. Serve topped with baby lemon balm or mint leaves.

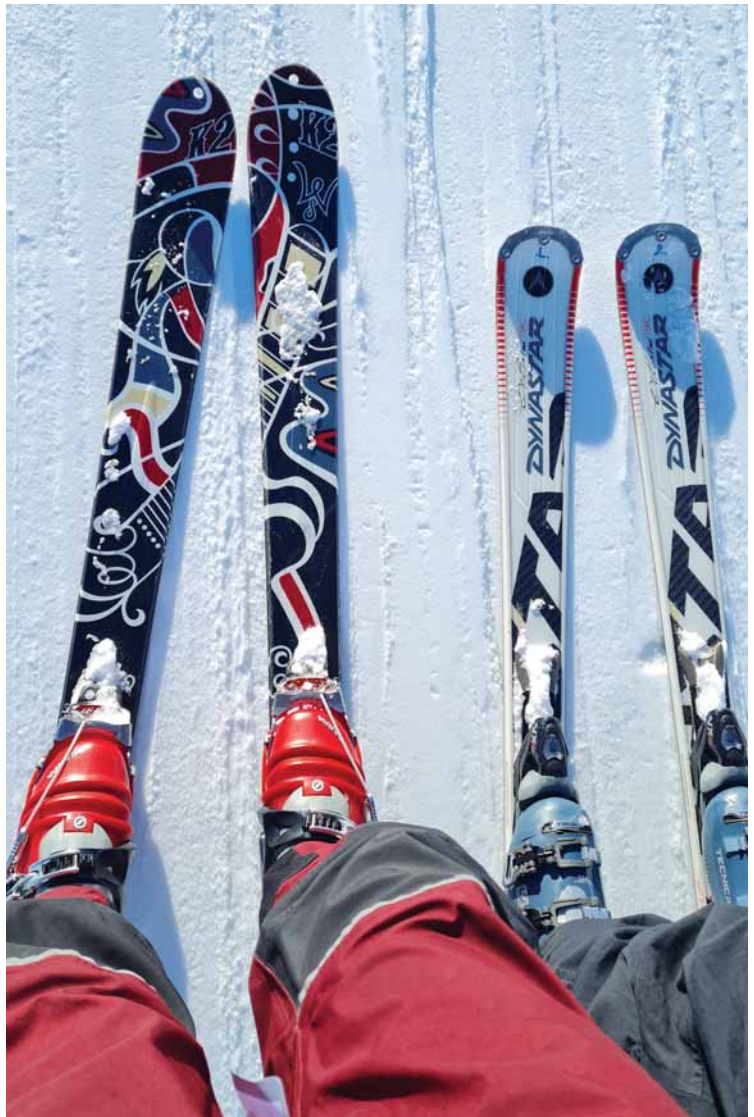

Hanmer A v Glenmark A

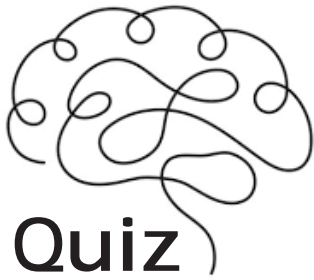
Results: 21-38 win to Glenmark

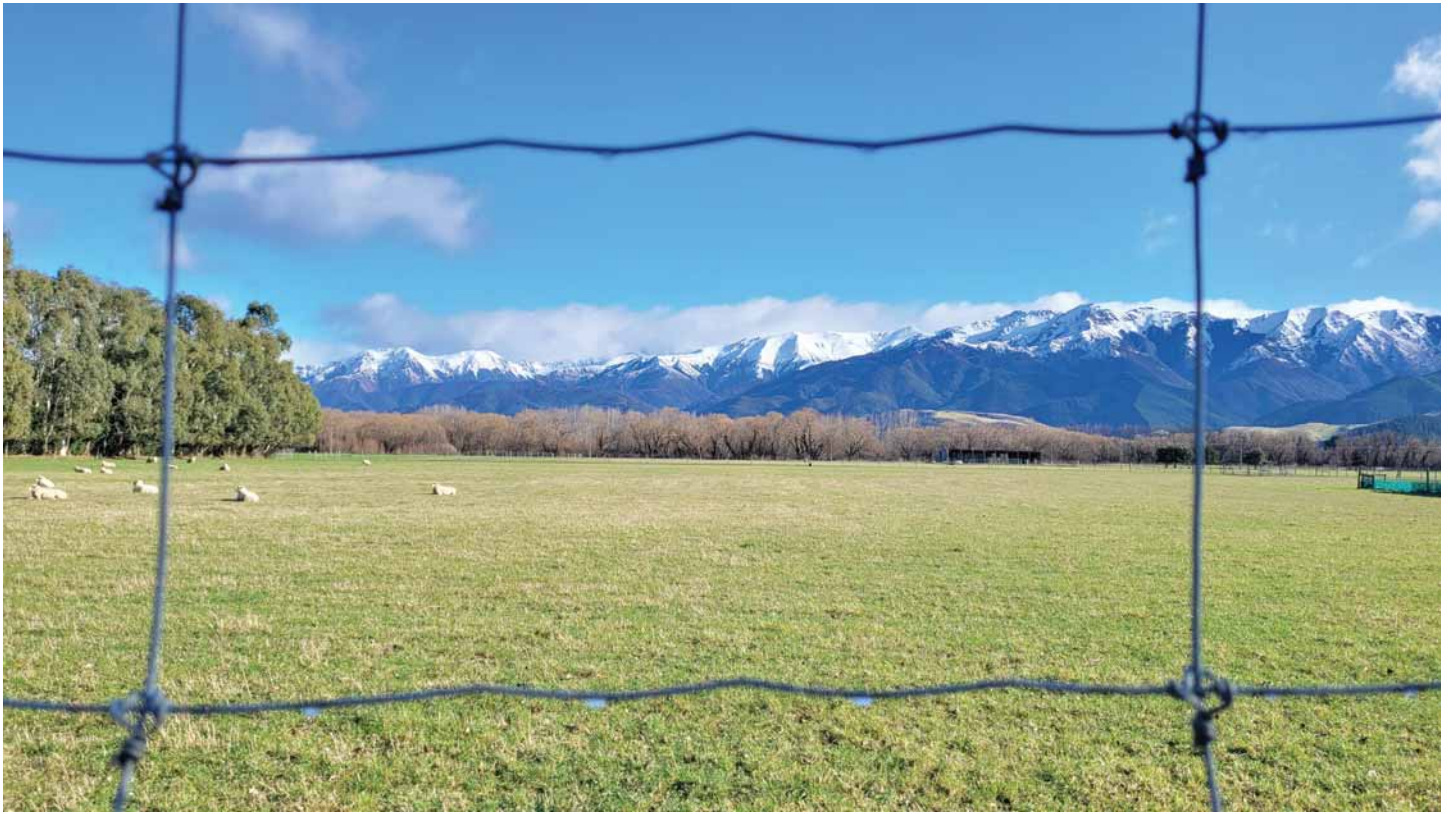
