

The Great Kiwi 500 Fly In



On Saturday and Sunday 15/16 February 2025, seventy (70) MD helicopters from all over New Zealand converged on Hanmer Springs.

Local pilot, Bill Hales, of Alpine Springs Helicopters, organised the event along with the help of a number of friends and colleagues.

The event was the second "Fly In" Bill has organised. The first was in February 2023 and at that event Ryan Weeks, from MD Helicopters in the USA, said he had never seen so many helicopters in one place let alone helicopters of the same brand.

At the 2023 event sixty-three (63) MD helicopters visited. More were expected, however, a number of helicopters didn't make it as they were helping with the Cyclone Gabrielle recovery.

On Saturday morning, at about 10:30am, New Zealand's only Black Hawk helicopter (a Sikorsky EH-60A, ZK-HKU) completed a couple of overhead circuits of the Hanmer Springs "Fly In" landing area. The Black Hawk, based in Whakatane, was on its way home from Wanaka where it was being used to assemble the new high-speed 6-seater chair lift that will serve Soho Basin at the Cardrona Ski Area. The Black Hawk is owned by Kahu New Zealand, a company that specialises in heavy lifting. The helicopter can lift 3.6 tons of cargo.

MD Helicopters were previously Hughes helicopters, then McDonnell Douglas helicopters before becoming MD Helicopters.



MD500 Helicopters

The MD Helicopters MD500 series is an American family of light utility civilian and military helicopters. The Series includes the MD500C, MD500D, MD500E, MD 520N and the MD 530F.

A quick search of the NZ Aircraft register suggests that there are 103 x MD500 helicopters registered.

> 14 x MD500C 36 x MD500D 27 x MD500E 21 x MD 520N 5 x MD 530F









There are other variants too; the Hughes 300 (35 registered) and the MD600N (5 registered).

Some of these helicopters also attended the Fly In.



PLANNED POWER OUTAGE IN HANNER SPRINGS

MainPower will be completing scheduled electrical maintenance and upgrades to improve reliability and reduce future outages.

All connections in Hanmer Springs will be affected.

WHEN:

Tuesday 4th & Wednesday 5th March 2025 7:00am – 6:00pm on both days

- Generators will power some of the town, including most of the central business hub.
- Electricity connection will be restored to all connections overnight.

WHAT TO EXPECT:

During the outage you may see our team completing pole replacements, line upgrades, underground cabling and tree maintenance. There will be traffic management in place to support our work.

Your electricity retailer will send you a notification detailing how this planned outage will affect your connection/s.

Please note:

If a generator fails, there is no alternative generation available. Always be prepared for planned or unplanned outages.

Medically dependent customers should activate their 'no power plan'.

HANNER SPRINGS PLANNED POWER OUTAGE


Tuesday 4th March – Wednesday 5th March 2025.

Please note:

- This map shows the approximate location of electricity generation.

 To find out if a specific location will be affected, please refer your outage notification sent via your electricity retailer. Or call us on 0800 30 90 80.
- If a generator fails, there is no alternative generation available.
 All Hanmer Springs connections are advised to be prepared for planned or unplanned outages at any time.
- Connections that will receive generation will still experience short power outages as we connect and disconnect generators safely. Please read your outage notifications carefully and plan accordingly.
 - Some generators will be connected / disconnected on 3rd and 7th March. Impacted connections will receive a power outage notification of this from your electricity retailer.
- The location of generation assets has been planned to align with our network configurations and maintain supply to community services.
 - Homes and businesses can organise their own generation privately through local service providers.





Last Legs

Nightfall overtakes the city of San Miguel de Tucuman as we arrive. Outside the bus station the scene is lively and a circus big top overflows its clowns out in the street. There are trainers with mangy animals that strain against their chains, all trying to work the crowd and unabashedly herd them toward the next performance. Streets are so busy and noisy and choked with exhaust fumes that I am taken back to India. Dust plays in the headlights and there are the smells of street food and rancid cooking oil. This is a dirty city and surely saw better days, like a pair of scuffed shoes or last week's flowers, but I can't assume expert witness to the place, not having moved more than fifty yards from the bus station.

Although there is a two hour wait for the bus to Salta, I have to unload all my bags off the first bus which is looping south to Cordoba. This means I cannot go anywhere. The lockers are not big enough and the luggage check is closed. A young English couple off the same bus are also going to Salta and volunteer to look after my bags while they dine at a platform café, so I walk up the street, drawn toward where the circus tent is pitched.

I consider delaying my trip to Salta to stay in Tucuman for a couple of days. Firstly, I love seedy places, remember I lived in Calcutta and loved it. But most tempting was the idea of an incomparable experience; being part of the crowd at a circus here in the desperate wilds of the Andean foothills appeals to me. It offers the old exhilaration of being far removed from the comfort zone, the promise of something unlikely to be forgotten, like stepping through the scene and becoming a protagonist in the movie.

But it will seriously complicate life and despite the rushing about, I am inherently lazy and it means I will have to buy a new ticket and move my baggage and find a cab and a hotel. An opportunity gives way to feeling travel weary and the imminence of the destination. In the inevitable hindsight of the future I will castigate myself for failing in dedication to curiosity. Any seasoned traveller pays obeisance to spontaneity.

I feel uneasy that I have left all my worldly possessions, including my camera gear in the care of a couple I have known no more than three minutes. My sense of unease grows when two dwarves with bizarre face paint, dressed in torn and shabby clowns' clothes grab a hold of my arms and try to propel me toward the circus. After a long bus ride across the country, dwelling in the depths of

my already-bizarre imagination, I am a little spaced out; so this event is nothing less than disturbingly surreal, trapped in a Borges illusion, painted by Dali. I feel an urgent need to escape them. I forcibly detach myself from their tight grip, which is not easy, their words are tough and their hands rough and bony as though they have led a hardworking life. I get a sad sense of their exploitation but no time for sympathy. One of their fingernails cuts into my arm and makes it bleed.

Now, I wish I could paint so I could reproduce that scene.

I am in the school of fantastic realism, I am among the pages of the South American genre. The event lasts less than a minute but it unnerves me.

So pleased to see the English couple, wordless bovines munching on bread rolls, looking exhausted and thoroughly bored with each other, but utterly dependable, sitting placidly with my baggage piled next to theirs, his trusty foot implacably planted through the strap of my camera bag.

The trip to Salta is a few hours, spent in an identical leather armchair, passing meaningless lights, but all the time with the sensation of travelling uphill. I am afraid I am missing things unseen in the night, part of a whole life desperately afraid of missing something.

I heard about a hostel in Salta by recommendation and finally tracked it down on the Internet. It is not listed in the major travel guides and when the bus arrives in the small hours of the morning I get stranded because nobody has heard of 'Las Rejas'. Another passenger writes down the name of the place and disappears to make a telephone call. He will not be popular phoning people at two thirty in the morning but he comes back with the address which he gives to the only cab left and I get delivered about two blocks past the central plaza and into the care of Senor Ignacio and family. They give me a double room with en suite at the price of a single one and this for \$12 a night, with breakfast for another buck. When I tell them I am taking photos and doing some newspaper stories they give me a desk and chair and a table lamp. The house is an old one and some of its wooden walls are beautifully crafted in colonial style.

Diversity

For example, workshops, rehearsals, performances, festivals or exhibitions in Māori or Pasifika heritage or contemporary artforms or by local migrant communities; arts projects that bring together groups from a range of different communities; workshops, rehearsals, performances, festivals or exhibitions by groups with experience of disability or mental illness.

Young people:

For example, young people to engage with and actively participate in working with an artist to create a mural or street art; creating a film about an issue that's important to them; publication of a collection of writings by young people; music workshops for young people; an exhibition of visual art by young people.


