

Our Water

Hurunui District Council is consulting with its communities over the best way to deliver and manage water services under new central government regulations.

Local Water Done Well is the government's new policy for Three Waters reform. It allows councils to choose the best option for how they deliver drinking water, wastewater and stormwater for their communities.

Hurunui District Mayor Marie Black said the three North Canterbury councils of Hurunui, Kaikoura and Waimakariri had worked closely together to look at the best possible options for their communities.

"It was important to ensure water charges would be affordable and that each council had enough financial headroom for further investment over the next decade or so," Mayor Black said.

On 25 February 2025, Hurunui Council resolved to go to its communities with two options:

- establish a joint Water Services Council Controlled Organisation (WSCCO) which would be 100% owned by the Hurunui District Council and the Kaikōura District Council; or
- 2. to provide services through an in-house business unit.

Consultation on the proposed models was approved by Council this week, with consultation opening on 20 March and closing on 21 April.

"We've taken a long-term view in coming to this proposal, having considered the most sustainable model for Hurunui for the future," Mayor Black said. "This looks at water charges over the long term, as well as potential borrowing that could be accessed in the future, to ensure that our infrastructure continues to be robust, fit for purpose and sustainable. The proposed model also offers more scope to work together with other councils in the future, with cost efficiencies and other benefits for our communities."


Mayor Black said Hurunui Council welcomes opportunities to work more closely with its neighbours with examples of current shared services with Waimakariri District Council including the provision of water to households on the Ashley water scheme and the contracting of water services modelling.

"We are encouraging residents to have their say on this important issue. There will be public meetings held across our district and multiple ways to submit," Mayor Black said.

Council will hear submissions on 29 April, with 30 April being held as a reserve day. Council will make a decision at a meeting on 13 May 2025.

Last Legs

Continued from previous issue ...

I am also reading up on Bolivia. The border crossing from Argentina to Bolivia is only 411 kilometres north of Salta via La Quiaca and Villazon. Here in Salta the altitude is about 1800 metres but after a seven hour bus ride to La Quiaca you are on the Andean Plateau or the *altiplano* at 3700 metres. This is about the same level as Lhasa in Tibet where I once spent several weeks with no ill effects. That's the level where lack of oxygen can become a problem and although I have chosen to ignore my doctor's advice, I still remember it. Salta looks like a place to hang out for a couple of weeks or so, it's about the same height as Darjeeling, a place I regularly visited when I lived in Calcutta.

I have such an excellent and cheap room and a need to gently accustom myself to altitude and there are some places to visit in the province. It is a city of almost half a million people but it doesn't have the atmosphere of a place that big. I think I might stay awhile.

There are the markets and long pedestrian shopping malls lively with people and a share of fast-food hustlers, barkers and spruikers. Things are cheap if you have dollars and I find a big alpaca wool scarf that doesn't have llamas on it (which isn't that easy), and for twenty bucks. I buy a genuine red and black Gaucho poncho despite the fact I know I will carry it around South America and when I get it home I will never wear it –unless I go to a fancy dress - but who doesn't do that.

The first day there I lunch in a traditional local restaurant; just as well I like steak. I order the steak special and I wonder why the waiter asks me how I like my potatoes, but I see when the plate arrives, it has half and half, fries and mash, a huge rib eye steak and a mountain of fried onions. I'm on holiday, I tell myself, so I order a litre of beer.

The meal reminds me of the sort you could buy in New Zealand forty years ago, in places with names like the Civic Café or Nick's. The price is also about the same as forty years ago at three bucks, but the whole time I am in Salta I am never able to find this place again.

The second day I am there I decide to take the *teleferico* (gondola) to the top of Cerro de San Bernado from where you get a great view of the whole city of Salta and the rest of the valley. I should know better than to catch a *teleferico* because if there is one thing that doesn't mix with this little black duck, it is heights. A fall off a cliff in a past life must be the cause of an unreasonable fear of anything precipitous. Or waking as I plummet south.

In Da lat, in Vietnam I rode on a gondola and sat there in white-knuckled terror. I paid a \$10 (very expensive) cab fare to get home, twelve miles the long way around, rather than use the return half of my ticket. That one went down before it went up and the most frightening thing was the very tenuous grip the cabin in front appeared to have on the cable when it came to the stanchions that held it aloft. I was sure I was about to tumble to a cabbagey death, mortemus brassicata imbedded in the vegetable patch below and then the car jerked sharply upward leaving the stomach far behind, body tensed against the little bench, feet thrust in the floor, trying not to look out the window, telling myself to calm down, all in the slow motion that comes with the end of life. I promised myself that if I survived I would never again ride in one of these things.

The *teleferico* leaves from one of the city parks and I decide to at least inspect the cars. The cabins look much sturdier than the Vietnamese ones, so I take a deep breath and I pay my money and step aboard. There must be something slightly (and masochistically) schizophrenic when an idiot climbs into a flimsy box in order to be suspended over a void, thus activating his greatest personal fears and phobias, while all the while he is telling himself, absolutely, you must not do this. It is cruelty run amok and there is no escape route. My car comes around and I step in and the attendant slams the door shut and almost instantly I get jerked into the air, a hundred feet up and rising.

Talk to myself; now, sit back, relax the muscles, calm the mind, don't look down, take deep breaths. But I have to look down because we seem to be an awful long way from the ground. I pull my head back and do an involuntary large intake of breath, my legs brace savagely against the opposite seat and knuckles are tight white, gripping the safety rail. I am so tense it hurts all over. I try closing my eyes but only last a few seconds before I have to check how far away the ground is now, then go through turning rigid with fear again and this is the routine I repeat all the way up.... it probably only takes five minutes to get to the top but it feels like a half hour by the time it docks and stops for me to get out. I am completely exhausted and bathed in a cold sweat. I reel away from the car and find a park bench and a place that serves beer and I have to settle down for at least ten minutes to get my breath and my equilibrium back again before I can contemplate the view. A couple of quarts of Salta's finest ale does little to calm the pounding heart. It would have been brandy, but they don't have any.





Another Two for Dobbie



Hurunui District Council has extended CEO Hamish Dobbie's contract for two years.

Hurunui Mayor Marie Black said the extension was the maximum period allowed under the Local Government Act.

Dobbie has already led the council as CEO for over 11 years, after taking up his position in 2013.

Councillors were "unanimous" in supporting the decision, Black said.

"The Local Government sector is facing several significant challenges, including changes in policy direction around the management of water services, along with financial sustainability, climate adaptation and environmental management. Hurunui, like other councils, is responding to these, as well as to the evolving needs of our communities.

"Hamish's extensive experience, and sound and strategic leadership over the past 11 years will be invaluable in guiding the district through this critical period of change," Black said.

Black referenced Dobbie's leadership in supporting Hurunui's coastal communities to respond to changing hazard risks. Hurunui's community engagement model earned peer recognition, with the Amberley Beach Coastal Adaptation Plan (CAP) winning the NZPI Best Practice Award for Climate Change in 2024.

Dobbie was appointed in 2013 for the maximum term under the Act of five years. His contract was then extended for two years. As per requirements under the Act, Council advertised the position on the open market, with Dobbie being reappointed in 2020 for five years.

"The continuity of experience and accrued knowledge Hamish brings delivers a positive forecast for our district as a whole," Black said.

Prior to starting at Hurunui Council, Dobbie was Chief Executive at Lakes Environmental LTD for six years. He has also worked extensively in executive leadership roles, providing strategic leadership, and improving operational efficiency and regulatory competency.

- Make your way to the the paddock south of Amuri Helicopters at 561 Hanmer Springs Road, SH7A.

- Tune into Compass FM on 104.7FM.
- Check the Hanmer Springs Community page on Facebook.
- Speak to a volunteer.
- Inquires on the day to Council at the numbers below.

It is not a real event. Participation is voluntary.

Volunteers will be patrolling to assist people to evacuate and ensure properties are safe during the exercise.



Voluntary Evacuation Exercise

Residents of Hanmer Springs township are preparing for voluntary evacuation on Sunday 6 April 2025 as part of a multi-agency wildfire evacuation exercise.

Hurunui Council's Emergency Management officer Allan Grigg says the evacuation is voluntary and is aimed at residents and visitors who are within the town boundary during the time of the exercise.

"Evacuation will be voluntary to help residents and visitors become familiar with the Hanmer Springs wildfire preparedness plan. The field exercise will only be aimed at those who are within the town boundary during the exercise and who want to participate," Grigg says. "Those people outside the Hanmer Springs township are welcome to participate in the exercise if they wish – this is a great opportunity to practice your household emergency plan and gain an understanding of how such an evacuation would look and feel."

The exercise brings together emergency services, the Hanmer Springs Community Emergency Response Team, Waka Kotahi NZTA, Hurunui District Council, residents, local businesses, schools, accommodation providers, and tourists to test Hanmer Springs's wildfire preparedness plan.

Hurunui Civil Defence Emergency Management will be the lead agency for the exercise on Sunday 6 April, which will run throughout the day, with the public phase of the exercise taking place between 2pm and 5pm.

Residents and visitors who would like to participate in the voluntary evacuation and who require assistance on the day are urged to get in touch with the Council.

Residents will hear the instruction to evacuate via public address systems and the town siren. The evacuation point is the paddock south of Amuri Helicopters at 561 Hanmer Springs Road, SH7A.

"We will have volunteers patrolling to ensure properties are safe during the exercise and to be available to help people evacuate," Grigg savs.

The field exercise will utilise platforms used in real events, such as North Canterbury radio station Compass FM, emergency services vehicle sirens, public address systems, evacuation teams who will be door knocking, and the Hanmer Springs community Facebook page. All messaging will start and end with the words 'Civil Defence Exercise'.


