





Lessons for Life - by Pita Alexander

The following is an extract of a newsletter written by Pita Alexander titled, "Lessons for Life in New Zealand in 2025".

- 1. The present average age for New Zealanders is around 37.7 years. The point being that, on average, most people still have some 60 years in front of them. Still plenty of time to take on a few lessons.
- 2. Listen to Mum and Dad around the kitchen table. Learn from their pain, their mistakes and their experience.
- 3. You will learn a lot more from listening than talking listening is a real skill.

- 11. Make sure your employer is contributing 3% of your gross earnings into the KiwiSaver scheme. Your contribution should be say 6% to start with, but increase this contribution to 10% as soon as you can afford to.
- 12. Make sure your potential life time partner passes the milk shake test. A life time partner who is poor with money means you are likely to have 70 years of financial pain don't go there. Shout that individual a chocolate milkshake and walk away.
- 13. If Mum and Dad are poor with their money management, then that is exactly the reverse of where you must head. Some parents are great with love but poor with money.
- 14. At 20 years of age you must understand the difference between something you actually need, and something you like the look of.
- 15. At 20 years of age you must understand how compound interest works.
- 16. Your integrity is much more important than the clothes you purchase.
- 17. Never lose your sense of humour. Practise it. Work on it.
- 18. If you cannot say something nice about somebody, then say nothing.
- 19. With the internet and cellphones, anything untrue or unfortunate comments can go half way around the world in ten minutes. If you are not sure about something important, then say nothing.

- 20. Find work in your school holidays, university holidays learn the value of money and the value of work early on.



Lepan's Shadow - A Novel by Hanmer Author



Local man, Doug Pearce, wrote much of *Lepan's Shadow* in Hanmer Springs where he has had a bach for over thirty years. Doug turned to writing fiction after forty years of penning academic papers and books on tourism research.

Doug, an emeritus professor of tourism management at Victoria University says, "The biggest difference between writing *Lepan's Shadow* and my earlier books is that I could make the story up. Of course, characters must be believable, settings realistic and the plot credible and coherent, but in fiction you have the freedom to create relationships, to mould events to fit the narrative and change things around if the story heads off in a new direction, as it inevitably does. That was liberating after the rigours of academic research. I learnt to leave chapter endings hanging rather than draw formal conclusions. And in writing the book here in Hanmer Springs it was only natural that local incidents drive the story forward despite much of the action occurring in Chile."

A retired Wellington professor, Cliff West, hauls the body of renowned French anthropologist and activist, Antoine Lepan, from a hot pool in Chile's Atacama Desert.

Years earlier, a young boy suffers a horrific mountain bike accident on a forest trail in Hanmer Springs.

How are these events linked? How do they result in Cliff's obsession with uncovering what led to Lepan's death?

The truth about the Frenchman and his fate gradually unfolds in *Lepan's Shadow*.

This will provide a safe, paved, and well-lit landing zone that can be used in a wider range of conditions, and allow for faster, safer patient transfers, giving people the best chance at survival and recovery.

When every minute counts, safe and fast access to emergency care can make all the difference. Right now, rescue helicopters landing in Hanmer Springs face real challenges: they touch down on the sports reserve, which can be difficult in poor weather or at night, and often require local volunteer firefighters to assist with lighting and safety.

Last Legs

Continued from previous issue ...

The next morning I have the usual Hotel La Torre omelette and toast and *mate de coca* then head to the plaza and the Internet parlour. There is no improvement in my health. The thing that is so hard to live with, is the acutely painful pins and needles and still I have to stop for a rest every few paces on the way up to the plaza. Today is market day so after checking my emails I am going to head to the markets with my camera.

I round the corner into the plaza and walk slap bang into Gabriella, something which took the little wind left in my sails even.

What she is doing here, still short of her next destination in the Salar de Uyuni. We go to the café at the north end of the plaza, sit down and order coffees and she tells me what happened to her.

She came to cross the border into Bolivia and they turned her back because she didn't have the right paperwork for her truck. She just rocked up to the border with the truck and being a female alone she was immediately harassed. Some guy touched her up. (It would need to be a man with a fast side step who fondled this woman without consent.) She inevitably smacked the guy across the face. She was no *gringa facil*.

Next thing she knew, she was locked up. She knew she could handle herself in a fight, but she had to admit to being a little nervous. After about four hours they told her she was being refused entry to Bolivia because her truck's papers were not in order, there was no insurance, and she had to cross back to La Quiaca. She decided to sell the truck in La Quiaca but after stuffing around for a couple of days she still had problems with the paperwork so she drove back to Salta and sold it to the guy she bought it from. He was delighted to buy it back for a third of what she paid. Then she took the bus back to La Quiaca and crossed into Bolivia again through Villazon, but the guy at the border recognized her. It took about four hours before she convinced them her father was an important diplomat as well as being the owner of the Fiat Corporation which was building a factory in Bolivia. They finally stamped her passport for thirty days.

She came straight from Villazon to Tupiza by taxi, still fuming to think someone might have mistaken her for a woman of easy virtue.

She is staying at the Hotel Mitru, which is supposed to be the best hotel in town and the two of us walk back there together.

You've got the *soroche* bad, she says. You're puffing when you walk *downhill*. You wouldn't be much use to me. The best thing to do is agree with her. Sex with Gabriella right now would kill me. Even the wisest of men must sometimes admit that things have gone beyond their control. Reason wins; I must be aging. She tells them to give me a *mate de coca* while I sit in the lobby and wait for her to collect some money for the markets.

Money is not really needed at the markets, there is little to lash out on. The stalls run from the railway station following the dusty pavers along the Avenida Serrano running north from the railway station. The bright colours of cheap synthetic clothes are muted by a thin film of dust. Plastic sails keep the weak winter rays from the stalls of vegetables and fruit, a million mandarins and bananas, a dozen varieties of maize and glasses with bright stripes of coloured jelly topped with sweetened cream to which wasps cling like chopped nut garnish. There are stall after stall of the same traditional Bolivian petticoats. Old ladies, whom I desperately want to photograph, fix me with the eagle eye of suspicion because of the camera. They wear woolen cardies and thick knitted leg warmers and socks stuffed into flimsy alparagatas, bowler hats pushed back on their heads, a group of them sitting and leaning on a handcart, abandoned for the moment between stalls of fleecy jackets and the vendors of chupe.

We head for the juice man and he squeezes and blends a cocktail of citrus fruit and apple and mango which is really tart, just the way I like it. A pint glass full is less than twenty cents. I am only half way through the first suck on the straw and Gabriella spots someone she knows, a hippie looking character who is trying to flog badly made silver jewellery from a blanket spread on the footpath. "Oh look," she says, "There is Potosi Rafa from the Bariloche markets." And she charges off in his direction. They are strange things these human emotions. I would be quite happy for her to run off with anyone and leave me in peace, but I feel that old painful twinge of jealousy as she throws herself into the arms of this handsome young dude. I disappear quietly from sight and quicken pace as much as the soroche will allow. Something says it will be wise, that it might save possible pain and discomfort. I don't mean to make her sound so unwelcome, but feeling as ill as I do is all I can handle at this moment. I can castigate myself for cowardice when I feel better.

I decide that my health is never going to improve and someone tells me about a doctor in La Paz who will give me oxygen and sort me out. In fact I am operating on a second-hand, out-of-date copy of Lonely Planet's Bolivia and although it is a few years behind the times the prices don't seem to have changed much. The previous owner of this travel manual has written the address of one Dr Eduardo in Avenida 16 de Julio with the notation that the good doctor had provided great relief from the *soroche*. This, coupled with my friend Judy's email saying I had to do it, encouraged me to go on instead of heading out of the hills and down to the coast.







