The Senior Championship Pro Am Golf Tournament is the brainchild of our very own

Golf Pro Mike Gainsford (photo). Mike first suggested he run the tournament over 9 years ago and it has been run every year since, without exception. Yes, not even the pandemic could stop the event; it is run each February so it was "done and dusted" before March 2020.

This year was the biggest event to-date and Mike said, "I couldn't squeeze another golfer on the course. We were running at capacity." There were 62 pros and 130 amateurs in the tournament with 96 players on the course at any one time.

To make a great Tournament you need a right-hand man and Mike's right hand man is David O'Brien.

To make a great Tournament you also need a major sponsor and the *Hanmer Springs Thermal Pools and Spa* continues to be the major sponsor of the tournament; thank you!

And thank you Mike, for your vision and drive!

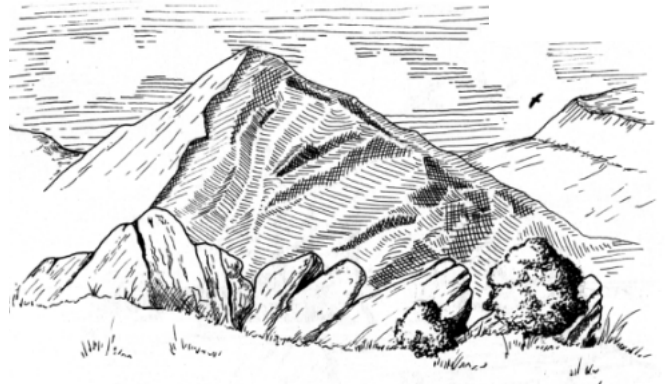

What An Interesting World We Are Living In - by Pita Alexander

The following is an extract of a newsletter written by Pita Alexander titled, "What an Interesting World We Are Living In Presently".

1. What are the seven (so called) G7 countries:
Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, United Kingdom and United States of America.
2. Perhaps 6 of these 7 countries are heading for a debt trap by the end of this decade (31 December 2030). All except perhaps Germany.
3. How do we tend to measure this debt trap issue? When a country's debt becomes significantly greater than its overall gross income or GDP (Gross Domestic Product).
4. Which countries have reached, or are close to reaching this point relative to their debt to GDP ratio? These figures are as at 3 February 2026:

Germany	66%
China	100%
United Kingdom	105%
Canada	114%
France	118%
United States	124%
Italy	138%
Japan	228%

(In general terms, a ratio of above 130% is not considered sustainable long term).

5. How many of the world's countries have made any significant debt repayments over the last 50 years? Almost none. So, debt repayment is a phrase that is referred to often, but in practice simply does not happen very often.
6. To repay debt, a country would need to have a primary surplus, meaning they would bring in more money than they spend in most cases.
 - a. France, the second biggest economy in Europe and the 7th biggest in the world, has not had a primary surplus for 51 years (from 1974 to 2025).
 - b. The UK over the 56 years from 1969 to 2025, had a primary surplus in 7 years and a deficit in the remaining 49 years.
 - c. The USA over the last 50 years has only had a surplus 4 times - the other 46 years have been in deficit.
7. Which countries have had primary surpluses over recent years?
 - a. A few oil countries such as Norway.
 - b. A few very strongly run trading countries such as China.
 - c. A few very strong fiscal adopters such as Singapore and Switzerland.
 - d. Considering there are 195 countries in total, the numbers running primary surpluses is very small, and those surpluses are reasonably irregular.
8. The USA/NZ exchange rate:
 - 1 January 2000 US\$1 = NZ\$1.9160
 - 1 January 2010 US\$1 = NZ\$1.3776
 - 1 January 2015 US\$1 = NZ\$1.2758
 - 1 January 2020 US\$1 = NZ\$1.5200
 - 1 January 2025 US\$1 = NZ\$1.7600
 - 1 January 2026 US\$1 = NZ\$1.6600

Over the 26 years since 2000, the New Zealand dollar has devalued by 13.36% against the United States dollar. At 1 January 2015, the New Zealand dollar was 33.41% lower against the United States dollar.

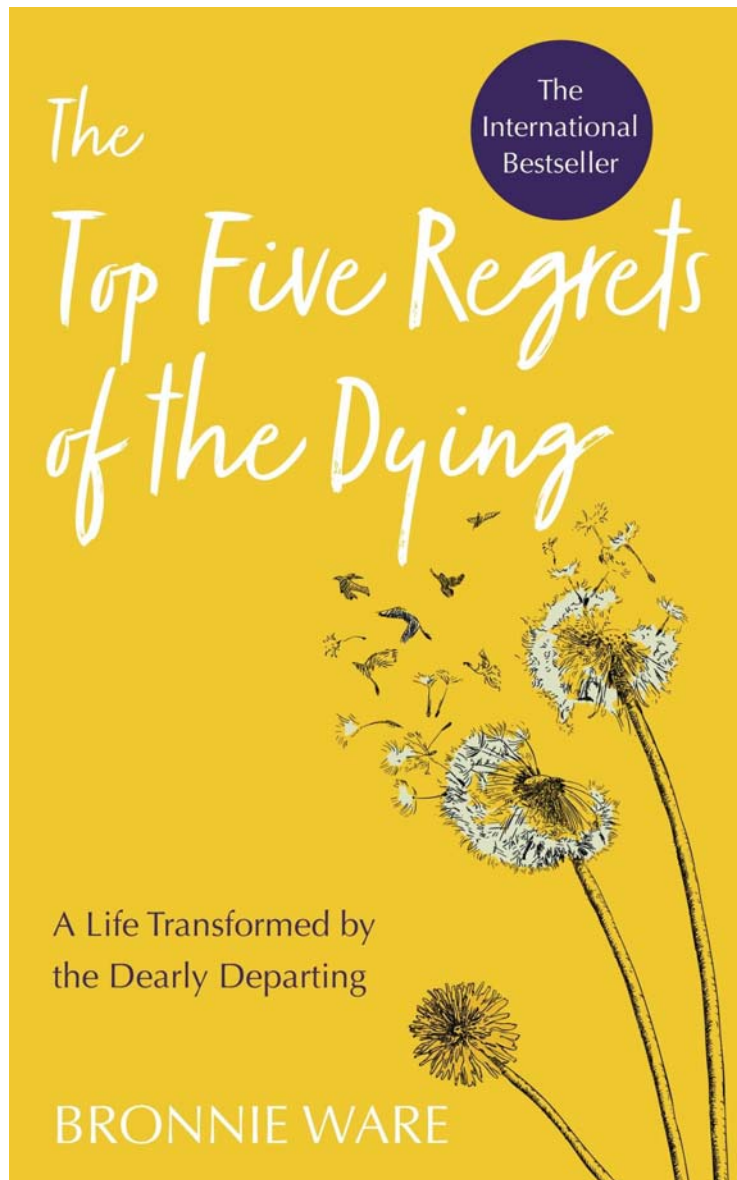

Australian author and songwriter Bronnie Ware spent some eight years looking after the terminally ill; people that were living the last 3-12 weeks of their life.

Below is a short transcript of Bronnie talking about her book.

Are you afraid of reaching your death bed and regretting the choices that you made or didn't make? I'm Bronnie Ware and for several years I sat by the bedsides of dying people. The conversations shared were personal, life changing and enormously insightful. I share those conversations more in detail in my memoir "The Top Five Regrets of the Dying" because those conversations changed my life and they may do for you too. The dying people told me, "I wish I had lived a life true to myself, not the life other people expected of me", "I wish I hadn't worked so hard", "I wish I'd had the courage to express my feelings", "I wish I'd stayed in touch with my friends" and "I wish I'd allowed myself to be happier". What if we could all arrive on our deathbed free of regrets? What if we could lose the harsh judgment that causes regret and turn it into compassion for our humanness instead? What if we could set others free by not judging them and seeing them as doing the best they can as who they are right now, just as we are too? What if we all decided to be happier, to focus on simplicity and connection and things that make our hearts happy, instead of competition and lack and fear and all the things that hold us back from being our truest happiest self? What if we gave ourselves and each other permission to do all that, to have courage, to feel safe in expressing our feelings, to go where our hearts guide us, to learn how to be kind, not just to others, but to ourselves as well? What if we encouraged each other to be courageous and vulnerable? Let us support each other to create regret free lives, let us be courageous together!

Rigatoni with Sausage & Red Wine Ragu.

Easy!



This pasta dish is super simple. Combine all the ragu ingredients in a pot and simmer for an hour – no slicing, dicing or chopping required. Just choose good-quality, Italian-style sausages and trust them to provide all the seasoning you need. All that's left to do is to toss the cooked rigatoni in the sauce; this meal will taste as if you've been working on it all day. Don't we love that!

Ingredients

- 3 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 500g Italian pork sausages removed from their casings
- ¼ tsp chilli flakes
- 500ml chicken stock
- 1 tbsp tomato paste
- 400g tomato passata
- 60ml red wine
- ½ tsp fennel seeds
- salt and black pepper
- 500g dried rigatoni pasta
- grated parmesan cheese, to serve

Method

- **Step 1**
To make the ragu, combine all the ingredients, except the dried pasta, in a medium-sized pot and bring to a simmer over medium to high heat.
- **Step 2**
Place the lid ajar on the pot and lower the heat to medium-low. Simmer gently for 1 hour.
- **Step 3**
Uncover the pot and taste for seasoning; adjust if necessary. Remove from the heat and use a fork or a potato masher to break down the pork sausage. Set aside.
- **Step 4**
Bring a pot of salted water to the boil and cook the pasta, according to the package instructions, until al dente. Drain, reserving about 200ml of the cooking water.
- **Step 5**
Place the sausage ragu back over a medium to high heat and add the drained pasta. Add half the reserved pasta water and stir vigorously. If needed, add a little more water so the sauce coats all the pasta.
- **Step 6**
Divide into bowls and top with the freshly grated parmesan cheese.

Book Review - Cell 22 - From Party Girl to Political Prisoner

Recently, in Hanmer Springs, hosted at the Gateway Tavern, I had the pleasure of attending a talk presented by Australian author Monica Smit.

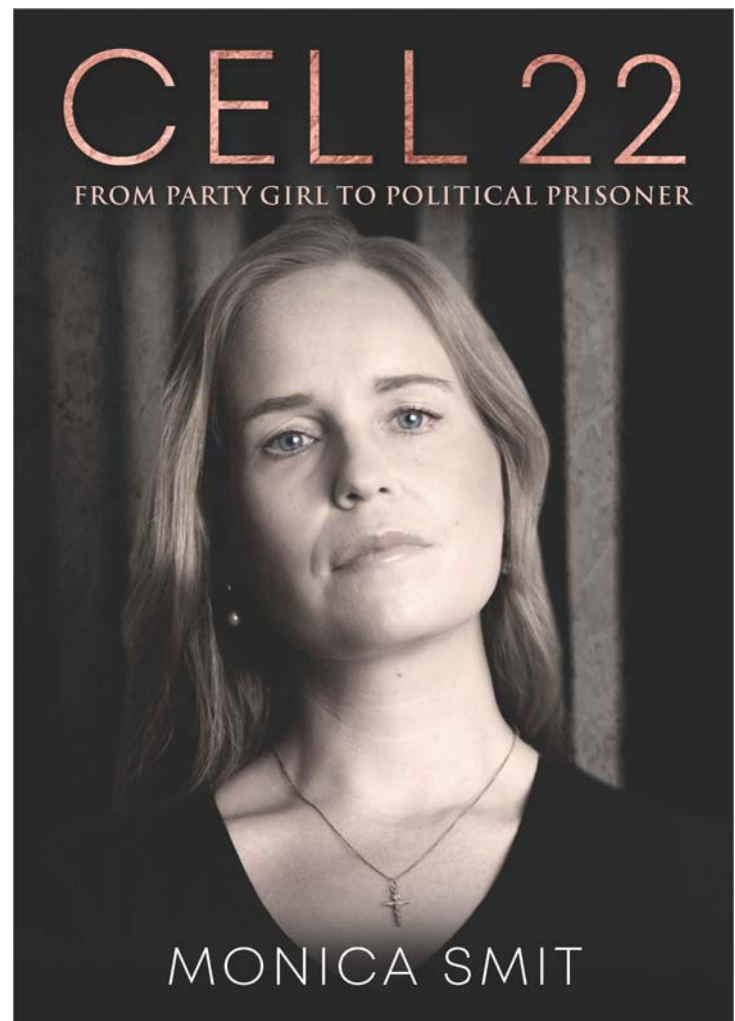
Monica has written a book titled, "Cell 22 - From Party Girl to Political Prisoner". She explained that she had been brought up under the umbrella of the Catholic Church but as a young woman had a very low self esteem and became a self confessed party girl.

She reached low levels of depravity and much of the book is targeted at girls with advice on how to avoid the pitfalls she had fallen into. Monica had talent in sales and marketing and was very successful at making money and maintaining a turbulent lifestyle. Eventually she grew weary of the emptiness it created and was drawn back into the ethics of the church. She looked forward to making changes, meeting someone, settling down and starting a family.

Then, in her early 30s, she was suddenly confronted with the Covid19 lockdown and what she observed became the catalyst for her to found 'Reignite Democracy Australia'. Monica was outspoken in her opposition to the government handling of the pandemic and for her efforts she was arrested on charges of incitement. To silence her she spent 22 days in solitary confinement, courtesy of the Victoria prison service. She was then released and the charges were eventually dropped. During the Police riots she met a fellow protester who became the love of her life. After a year romance he proposed and she accepted. Rooted in her new found faith she insisted he follows the Catholic traditional prenups. He went along with it to appease her but eventually it became such a source of argument Monica broke it off.

After the talk we had a brief chat but she resisted any notion that church dogma had limited her perception of freedom.

Things to Think About in an Election Year

- Some interesting facts you should keep in mind in the run-up to the 2026 General Election; that will be held on Saturday 7 November 2026.
- Our population is currently 5,310,695.
 - 928,000 people receive National Superannuation.
 - 781,000 people receive some other benefit.
 - 1,709,000 is the total of the two groups above.
 - 1,816,000 is the population of the Auckland Region.
- The number of beneficiaries in NZ is almost equal to the population of the Auckland Region. This is a massive burden for our work force.
- Like many countries around the world, New Zealand survives on an ever increasing amount of debt. We live using a "credit card" that is never paid off.
- The cost of servicing our debt is \$24.2 million per day in interest charges, or \$8.862 billion annually.
- Spending an extra \$24 million each day on health, education or housing would be significant.
- \$24 million is equivalent to 30 houses each worth \$800K.
- Yes, we pay \$24 million in interest charges, every day!
- Do politicians distract us from the real issues?
- We are not living within our means.
- We spend more than we earn (than we pay in taxes).
- The only way to live within our means is to cut spending or increase income (pay more taxes).
- We need to learn to tighten our belts.
- If we want better *health care* we need to cut spending in other areas, or pay more taxes.
- If we want better *education* we need to cut spending in other areas, or pay more taxes.
- If we want better *welfare* we need to cut spending in other areas, or pay more taxes.
- We can't have it all.
- At the moment New Zealand, along with many countries around the world, are living on credit. No person can live like this so why have we, as a country, accepted this?

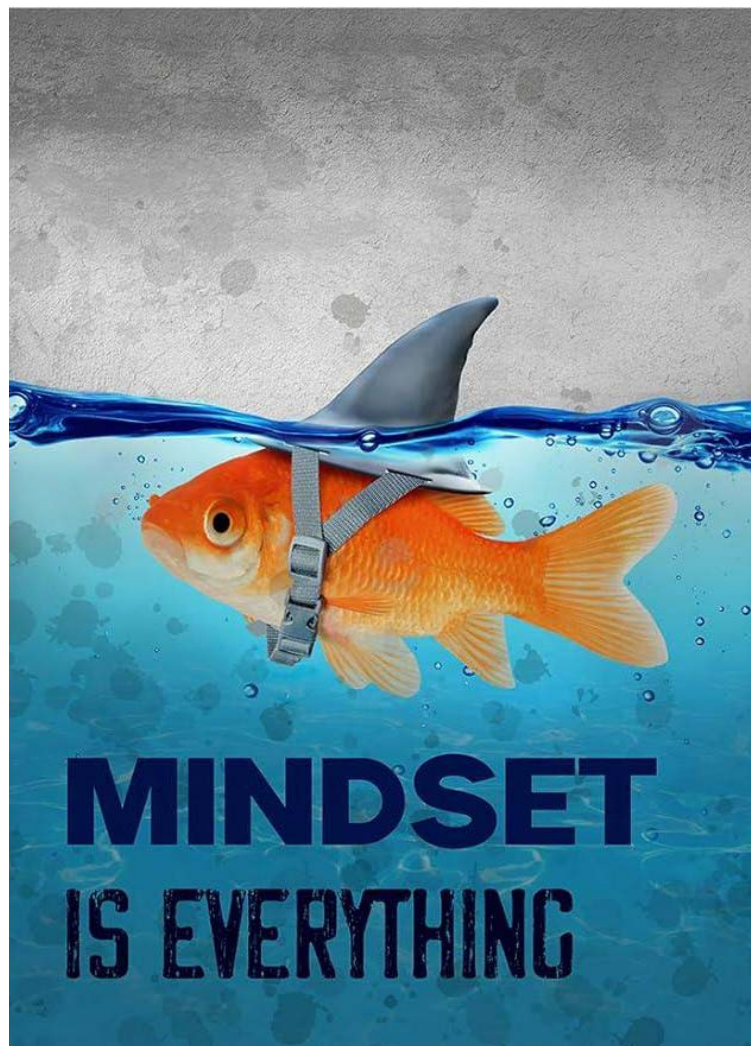

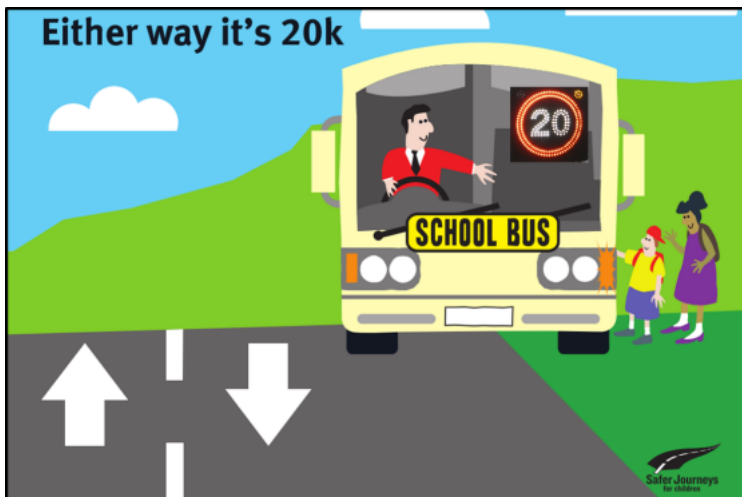
